Tony Zajac to retire April 1st

After nearly 30 years in public service as executive assistant in Cleveland City Council's Ward 12, Tony Zajac will formally retire on April 1, 2017.

Zajac came to City Hall in 1990 as executive assistant to former Councilman Edward Rybka and continued as the ward's executive assistant under current Councilman Anthony Brancatelli.

He graduated from John Adams High School in 1961 and shortly after began a career in banking at the former Cleveland Trust bank (Ameritrust/Key Bank), where he worked for 30 years. He earned a degree from the American Institute of Banking and became the manager of the Broadway and Harvard branch before retiring.

A lifelong Clevelander, Zajac is an avid gardener with his home garden often on display during the neighborhood Garden Walk. He also is a Cleveland history buff with a focus on industrial and historical buildings. One of his greatest hobbies is collecting postcards and memorabilia of Cleveland.

He has more than 1800 engraved postcards, many of which are over 100 years old.

Zajac's work and dedication to his city will be recognized during the 20th annual Neighborhood Summit at Bohemian National Hall this Saturday at 11 a.m. The Summit is organized by Broadway/Slavic Village community leaders and sponsored by Slavic Village Development. The event is free and open to the public.

M.H. Council passes legislation to create a quarterly newsletter

In the interest of publicizing information for the benefit of the city's residents, Maple Heights Council, at its March 1st meeting last week, passed a resolution to create "Maple Heights Headlines," a newsletter that will be published by The Neighborhood News on a quarterly basis.

At a cost of \$1000 per quarter, 7000 copies of the four-page newsletter will be published, according to the contract approved at the meeting. Citizens will be informed on city activities, administrative news, business development projects, senior news, safety news from police and fire, and council news, the resolution stated. The city will sell advertising to help defray costs.

Council also passed legislation authorizing the Cuyahoga County Board of Health to submit an application for the Safe Routes To School Travel Program, on behalf of the city, which is also working in conjunction with the Maple Heights City School District.

The federal government has set aside funding, which the city can apply for, through the Ohio Department of Transportation, to improve the safety of students traveling to and from school through construction projects. The city is applying for funds not to exceed \$400,000, to help pay the construction costs.

Council passed legislation to pay a \$40,000 annual retainer appointing the Consolo Law Firm Ltd., and law firm employees John Thomas and Christine Londrico, to both serve as assistant law directors and assistant prosecutors for the city. Also the city will pay a \$125 hourly rate for attorney representation in jury trials, according to the resolution.

Another resolution passed at last week's meeting hired Robert Ulee as a part time maintenance man for the city, at the rate of \$15 an hour, working no more than 28 hours a week.

Council approved legislation for the city to contract with inSITE Advisory Group, LLC, to provide economic development services for Maple Heights, at an hourly rate of \$175, not to exceed \$17,500.

At the recommendation of Mayor Annette Blackwell, inSITE "will perform economic development services, including business representation and tax incentive negotiations, identifying and securing grants, tax credits and other incentives," and other services.

Marbury & Associates LLC will provide an employee assistance program to city employees, according to a resolution passed by council at last week's meeting.

Ja'Nitta Marbury, Ph.D., PCC-S, owner of Marbury & Associates, an Ohio supervising licensed professional clinical counselor, will provide counseling as part of the employee assistance program, which will offer diagnosis and testing of mental and emotional disorders, conflict resolution, anger management, and other counseling services.

Full time city employees will receive EAP sessions through health insurances, and will not charge the employee for the \$10 co-pay until after the 12th session, according to the legislation. Also, Marbury "will provide part time employees with six EAP sessions at a cost to the city of \$55 per session," and after the sixth session, could continue to receive services at \$55 per session out of their own pocket.

After taking it out of committee from last year, council passed an ordinance to enact a new chapter, "Nuisance Abatement," regarding "properties that require ongoing attention from building and fire inspectors, police officers or other governmental agencies for complaints," including criminal activity, disrepair, harm to quality of life, and draining of city resources.

Another piece of legislation regarding passage of the city's 2017 budget, which is in the area of \$19 million, was placed on second reading for further discussion and passage at a future meeting.

Cleveland homicide victim identified

Cleveland police were called to a home in the 3400 block of East 51st St. in the North Broadway neighborhood on March 3rd, around 7:40 p.m., and found Jermaine Wagner, 42, inside the house with multiple gunshot wounds. He was taken to MetroHealth Medical Center where he was pronounced dead, according to the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner.

Police said a preliminary investigation indicates Wagner and his wife were involved in a verbal argument and she left the home. Some time later a small gray vehicle pulled up to the house and three males got out and went into the home. Neighbors heard gunfire and the males then left the scene.

No arrests have been made. The Homicide Unit will continue to investigate.

Woman injured during Garfield carjacking

A 41-year-old Maple Heights woman was injured after she was thrown from the hood of her car during a carjacking in Garfield Heights. The following information was taken from a Garfield Heights police report.

On March 3rd, around 8:45 p.m., police were dispatched to the area near Marymount Hospital after a woman called and said her cousin's car had been stolen and her cousin had

jumped on the hood of the car as it was being driven away.

The caller told dispatch she was chasing after the suspect on E. 131st St. and Saybrook Ave. and said her cousin had been thrown off the vehicle near Marymount. The caller followed the suspect and saw the driver pull into a driveway in the 13800 block of Willard Avenue, and as she attempted to turn around, the suspect backed out of the driveway and fled the area. She attempted to follow him but lost sight of the vehicle.

An officer arrived at Marymount and found the victim lying in the road in the McCracken and Henry intersection, with several people trying to help her. Police said she looked severely injured. She was taken to Marymount for treatment and later transferred to MetroHealth Medical Center.

The victim said had been visiting her mother at her apartment on E. 126th Street and as she was preparing to leave, she left her car running and stood outside on the passenger side

talking to her cousin. As they were engaged in conversation, a man jumped into her car and began backing up. She said she jumped on the hood, but the man continued driving, and as he made a sharp turn on to Henry Street, she was thrown from the hood and hit her head on the pavement.

A short time later, dispatch was contacted by CMHA Police and Cleveland police who informed them they had located the woman's vehicle disabled and abandoned in the 2500 block of E. 109th Street. CMHA officers said they were called to the scene for a shots fired report, and when they arrived they saw a man speeding away in the vehicle with heavy front end damage. He then parked the car and fled on foot, and officers were unable to catch him.

While still at the scene, a woman said she was involved in a hit-skip with the same vehicle at E. 116th and Kinsman Avenue. She said she followed the driver to E. 109th Street and watched him flee the area. Officers continue to investigate.

Missing Garfield Hts. teen



Davyun Diggs, a 15-year-old girl from Garfield Heights, was reported missing by her family on February 22nd, and hadn't been home for about a week at the time of the report, said Garfield Heights Detective Ted Grendzynski. Her family told police they had been keeping in touch with her on social media until about Friday, March 3, when contact stopped.

Grendzynski said Davyun is a habitual runaway. He said a younger sibling saw her leaving through the basement window of the family's Thraves Avenue home last month.

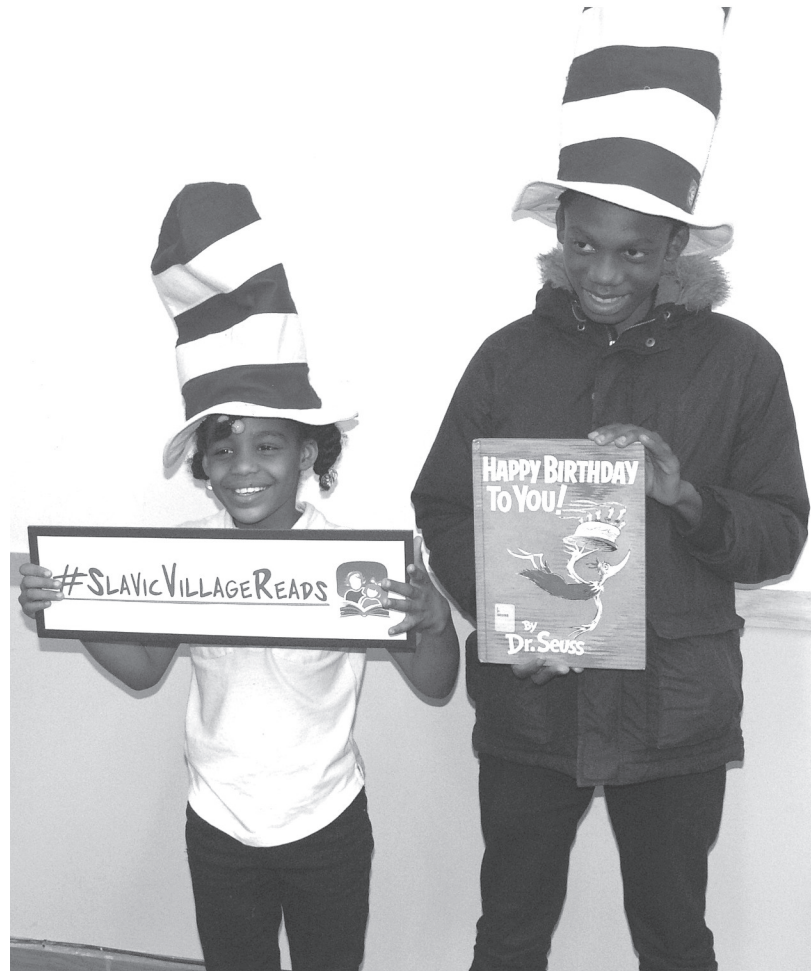
Transportation Blvd. to get upgrade

The city of Garfield Heights and the Ohio Department of Transportation will be widening Transportation Boulevard to improve traffic flow in the area. Construction should begin in late 2017 and be completed by the fall of 2018.

Transportation Boulevard improvements include widening the pavement along Transportation Boulevard from Granger Road to the I-480 bridge, widening the Transportation Boulevard bridge over I-480, minor modification of the I-480 westbound ramp at the intersection, and improving Transportation Boulevard's traffic signal coordination from Granger Road to the I-480 interchange.

Garfield Hts. police news

Breaking and Entering

On February 28th, a resident of the 4900 block of E. 108th St. told police he discovered someone had broken into his garage. He said nothing appeared to be missing, but the garage door lock had been pried open. He told police he plans on replacing the lock and installing motion sensor lights at the back of the property.

OVI

Police were dispatched to the E. 134th St. and Bangor Ave. area around 2:15 a.m. on March 6th for a report of a vehicle that struck a garage and was in someone's front yard. A witness told dispatch the driver and two passengers walked away from the scene. As police arrived, the witness gave a description of the male and two female suspects and their direction of travel.

Officers located three people matching the description on Willard Ave. Two of the suspects followed police orders and were immediately detained, while the third suspect, the woman suspected to be the driver, was hiding behind a parked van. After several verbal commands to show herself, she eventually surrendered and was detained.

Police spoke to the driver, 25, of Bedford, who was highly intoxicated and smelled of alcohol. Police said she had visible injuries from the accident and she was taken to Marymount Hospital. The male passenger, 22, of Maple Heights, was also highly intoxicated, as well as the female passenger, 25, of Maple Heights. Police said she was highly uncooperative and repeatedly used profanity towards officers. The pair were arrested and charged with intoxication.

The 25-year-old driver refused to speak to officers at Marymount and refused any alcohol testing. She was issued two citations for OVI and failure to control.

Pedestrian Struck

On February 28th, around 2:55 p.m., a 57-year-old Garfield Heights resident was driving eastbound on McCracken Rd. and was making a left turn onto Turney Rd. on a green light. As a 14-year-old boy was crossing the street in the crosswalk, the driver struck the boy. He was taken to Marymount Hospital for possible injuries. The driver was cited for failure to yield to a pedestrian.

Shoplifting

Police were called to the CVS store on the corner of Turney and Granger rds. on March 2nd, around 5 p.m., for a shoplifter still inside the store. The manager said he recognized the woman as a previous shoplifter at the store. He saw the woman concealing items inside a bag, then hiding the bag behind dog beds. She exited the store without the bag and officers spoke to her.

The woman, 44, of Sagamore Hills, told police she is always accused of shoplifting, but that she only hides the items so she can come back later with a coupon to buy them. The manager of CVS said someone else comes into the store, gets the bag and leaves without paying while the woman distracts a cashier. He said he has video footage of the woman previously shoplifting in that manner. Total amount of merchandise concealed, nearly \$260. Police found the woman to have several outstanding warrants and she was arrested and issued a summons for theft.

Theft

Police were called to the Salvation Army store in Turneytown Shopping Center on February 27th, around 5:55 p.m., and spoke to the manager who said a woman concealed items and left the store without paying. \$150. The woman, 35, of Cleveland, was arrested, charged with theft and held on a \$3500 bond.

She said she received email confirmation her packages had been delivered around 5:30 p.m., but when she returned home around 9:55 p.m., the packages weren't there. When she watched her security camera footage, she saw the packages get delivered and concealed between her main door and screen door and at the same time, she saw a possible juvenile male in the area. Around 6:50 p.m., a male, who appeared to be the same one she saw earlier, goes to her home and carefully removes one of the packages. A car then drives by, which she thinks scared the male, but he carefully takes the rest of the packages and flees the scene. Police were given a copy of the footage and continue to investigate.

60 confirmed fatal overdoses for February in Cuyahoga County

Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner Dr. Thomas Gilson recently announced Cuyahoga County experienced at least 60 confirmed fatal overdoses in February due to heroin, fentanyl or a combination of the two.

This marks the single highest monthly fatality rate in Cuyahoga County's history, previously experienced in September 2016 (57 fatalities). Seven February cases are still pending further toxicology testing, which may cause the monthly total to increase.

At least 109 victims have died in the first two months of 2017 from heroin, fentanyl or a combination of the two. In 2016, 57 victims died from heroin, fentanyl or a combination of the two in the first two months.
