

Remains of WWII vet identified as Albert Schlegel of Garfield Hts.

The remains of Captain Albert L. Schlegel, a World War II veteran from Garfield Heights known as the "Ace of Cleveland," were recently found and identified, and his family will honor him ance with the West Creek Preswith a memorial service in South Carolina.

On his final mission in August 1944, Schlegel and his airplane disappeared after he reported being hit by flak. His fate was unknown until 2016 when his remains were found in an American/French graveyard.

His nephew said, "Given his wartime record, his disappearance and the time and effort involved, this is closure for us, but it also provides insight into the effort that the U.S. government goes to to bring home to their families those lost in past conflicts.'






