## Resolution to join Chagrin Valley dispatch on first reading of Bedford Council

At last week's Bedford Council meeting, council placed a resolution on first reading for a participation agreement with the Chagrin Valley Dispatch Council. This follows an announcement in January that the city of Bedford would discontinue its participation in the Southeast Emergency Communications Center, which also includes the cities of Bedford Heights, Maple Heights and

Garfield Heights.

The Chagrin Valley Dispatch Council, based in the University Hospitals facility in Bedford, currently serves several Northeast Ohio communities, including Bentleyville, Chagrin Falls, Chagrin Falls Township, Hunting Valley, Moreland Hills, Orange, South Russell, Woodmere, Solon and Euclid, City Manager Mike Mallis stated, adding, "It is a very, very well run operation that actually has been acknowledged nationwide."

If the agreement is approved at a future meeting, according to the legislation, the city will pay \$259,254.21 to participate, to be paid in three installments on Aug. 1, 2017, Feb. 1, 2018, and Feb. 1, 2019 "as a Capital Charge Share, and \$36,616.25 per month Operating Cost Share... to the Chagrin Valley Dispatch Council."

Mallis said, "I think the change is going to be a plus for not only our safety forces and those on the street, and working with this dispatch, I think there is going to be a noticeable improvement for our residents as well."

"As I've said," Mallis continued, "sometimes partnerships work, sometimes they don't. I want to thank council for hearing some of the concerns that were brought forward... We'll always look at our programs and things we do from an operational and financial standpoint, and for those two reasons, I believe, more so from an operational standpoint, this is going to be a good move for the city."

## Man gunned down outside Broadway Ave. gas station

Elante Johnson, 21, of Cleveland, was fatally shot in the 6200 block of Broadway Avenue in Cleveland last Sunday, April 9th, and police are seeking the public's help in apprehending those responsible.

The following is according to Public Information Officer Jennifer Ciaccia with the Cleveland Police Department and the Cleveland Division of Police Field Report.

On April 9th, around 3 p.m., officers on basic patrol were flagged down by a citizen who reported shots were fired at Speedy's gas station, 6207 Broadway Ave. When police arrived, Johnson was found lying on the ground on Morton Avenue with multiple gunshot wounds to the chest, abdomen and right forearm, hand and knee area. He was still conscious and breathing as officers administered first aid. EMS arrived and took him to MetroHealth Medical Center where he died.

The preliminary investigation reveals that Johnson was leaving the gas station after making a purchase when he was approached by an unknown male in the parking lot. The suspect brandished a gun and fired multiple shots at Johnson who ran away with the suspect chasing after him. When Johnson fell to the ground on Morton, the suspect shot him again multiple times. Police said Johnson dropped his own gun while fleeing from the suspect.

At its regular meeting Monday night, Garfield Heights Council passed a resolution honoring and congratulating the 2017 Garfield Heights High School varsity boys basketball team for an outstanding season and reaching the OHSAA Division I state regional championship play.

Although the Bulldogs fell to St. Edward in the regional semifinals, Mayor Vic Collova addressed Head Coach Sonny Johnson at Monday's meeting saying, "We can't thank you enough for all you've done. We are so proud of your teams and all your kids."

Collova also thanked Jeff Snodgrass of Sterling Professional Group for the \$1000 donation to the city's Meals on Wheels program and reminded residents about the Garfield Heights Historical Society's Black Walnut Festival coming up in October, which will feature a black walnut baking contest.

Tubbs as a member of the city's Zoning Board of Appeals and an emergency resolution ratifying the appointment of Dan Baillie as a member of the Neighborhood Advisory Committee Land Reutilization Program (land bank) for Garfield Heights.

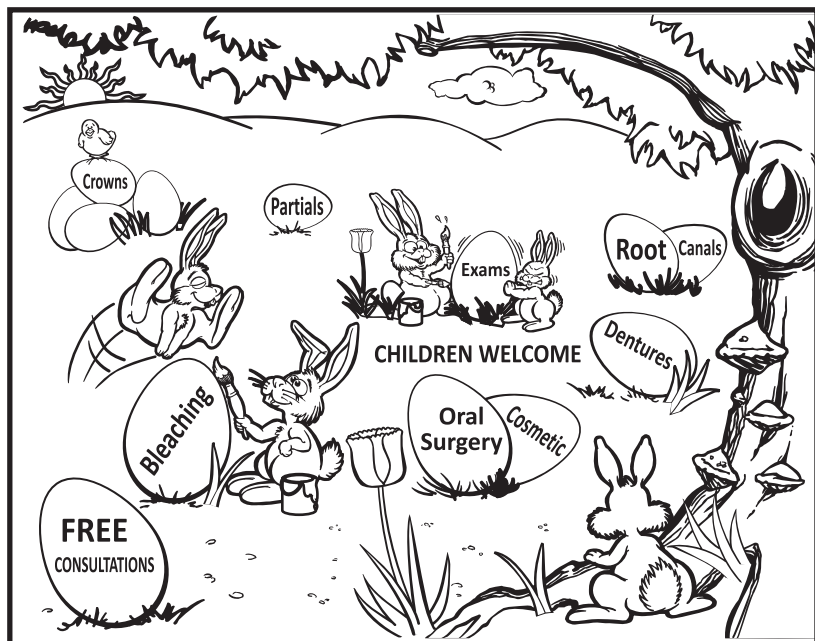

water meter contract with United Systems, for additional work in the amount of \$50,000 "as well as additional quantities" to complete the Residential Water Meter Project, in an amount not to exceed \$815,215.

The installation of the water meters is still in progress and is intended to streamline the meter reading process, Mallis stated. Only 15 percent of the meters have been installed, and the change order is intended to cover additional meters, he stated. Mayor Stan Koci urged residents who hadn't had their new meters installed to schedule their appointments.

Also passed was an ordinance to amend legislation to make additional appropriations for current expenditures in the city.

## Meals on Wheels rolling on

In response to comments made at a previous council meeting about the Meals on Wheels program for seniors, disabled and other individuals in the city of Bedford, Dinah Mouat, manager and treasurer for the Southeast Clergy Meals on Wheels, spoke at last week's council meeting to expand on the sources of funding and labor for the program, and to reiterate previous reassurances from city officials that the program will continue, regardless of any proposals to make cuts or changes to the federal budget.

Koci made a presentation at the meeting, to announce Free Permit Month for the month of June for Bedford residents to work on exterior projects. Resi-

dents still have to apply for and obtain the permits to do the work, but they will be issued free of charge.
