Man gunned down outside Broadway Ave. gas station

Elante Johnson, 21, of Cleveland, was fatally shot in the 6200 block of Broadway Avenue in Cleveland last Sunday, April 9th, and police are seeking the public's help in apprehending those responsible.

The following is according to Public Information Officer Jennifer Ciaccia with the Cleveland Police Department and the Cleveland Division of Police Field Report.

On April 9th, around 3 p.m., officers on basic patrol were flagged down by a citizen who reported shots were fired at Speedy's gas station, 6207 Broadway Ave. When police arrived, Johnson was found lying on the ground on Morton Avenue with multiple gunshot wounds to the chest, abdomen and righ forearm, hand and knee area. He was still conscious and breathing as officers administered first aid. EMS arrived and took him to MetroHealth Medical Center where he died.

The preliminary investigation reveals that Johnson was leaving the gas station after making a purchase when he was approached by an unknown male in the parking lot. The suspect brandished a gun and fired multiple shots at Johnson who ran away with the suspect chasing after him. When Johnson fell to the ground on Morton, the suspect shot him again multiple times. Police said Johnson dropped his own gun while fleeing from the suspect.
