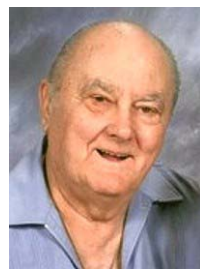

Garfield Heights woman found dead in her home; death called 'suspicious'

Lavora (Allen) Woodley, 38, of Garfield Heights, was found dead in her home on Orme Road on Monday, May 1st, and it is being investigated as a suspicious death, according to Garfield Heights police.

Woodley's daughter told police her mother dropped her off at Garfield Heights High School Monday morning at 8 a.m. and was supposed to pick her up at the end of the school day but never arrived, which was uncharacteristic of her mother, according to the police report. The teen began calling her mother's cell phone which went straight to voice mail, so she began walking home.

The teen arrived home around 3:15 p.m. and noticed the garage door was open and her mother's car was missing. She went inside the home and felt it was cold, then noticed the back patio door was wide open. She then called her brother after learning her mother never picked up her grandchildren either, then began calling family members who said they also hadn't heard from Woodley. She called police to report a missing person around 10:30 p.m., according to the report.

Woodley's son, who was at the scene when police arrived, said the last time he spoke to his mother was around 12:15 p.m. that day about going to the grocery store later that evening.

As police were conducting further interviews outside the home, family still inside began screaming. Officers went back inside and found Woodley lying face down at the bottom of the basement stairs, unresponsive, and when EMS arrived they confirmed she was deceased. The report indicated her brassiere had been torn off and her pants had been pulled down. More police were immediately called to the scene for further investigation.

Information about Woodley's car was broadcast to other agencies, and around 9:15 a.m. on May 2nd, her car was found on East 140th Street in Cleveland, according to police. It was towed to GHPD for processing.

The Garfield Heights Police Department, Bureau of Criminal Investigation and Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner will continue to investigate this death, according to Garfield Heights Police Chief Robert Byrne.

Ohioans newly eligible for Medicare are invited to attend free "Welcome to Medicare" events sponsored by the Ohio Department of Insurance. The statewide events are intended to help more than 100,000 soon-to-be Medicare recipients understand their health insurance coverage options.

A Medicare program will be held at the Independence Civic Center, located at 6363 Selig Dr., on Thursday, May 18th, from 2 p.m. and 6 p.m.

"We want those new to Medicare and those nearing eligibility to have confidence that they are selecting plans that best suit their budget and health care needs," said Taylor, also director of the Ohio Department of Insurance.

Department Medicare experts will cover topics such as Medicare Part A and B benefits, Part D prescription drug coverage, Medicare Supplement plans, Medicare Advantage plans, financial assistance and key deadlines.

Red Cross blood donation sites

During Trauma Awareness Month in May, the American Red Cross urges eligible donors to help ensure lifesaving blood is available for patients with traumatic injuries and other serious medical needs by donating blood or platelets.

Blood and platelet donors of all types are currently needed. Those who come out to donate blood or platelets by May 14th will have a chance to win one of three \$1,000 gift card shopping sprees from GiftCertificates.com. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental consent where allowed by state law), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood.

According to the National Trauma Institute, trauma accounts for approximately 41 million emergency department visits and 2.3 million hospital admissions in the U.S. annually.

"A single car accident victim can need as many as 100 units of blood," said Christy Peters, external communications manager, Northern Ohio Red Cross Blood Services. "In trauma situ-

ations, when there's no time to check a patient's blood type, emergency personnel reach for type O negative red blood cells and type AB plasma."

O negative red blood cells and AB plasma can be transfused into any patient, regardless of blood type, making donors with these universal blood types an important part of the Red Cross trauma team. Less than 7% of the population has type O negative blood, and only about 4% of the population has type AB blood.

Platelets may also be needed to help with clotting in cases of massive bleeding. Because platelets must be transfused within five days of donation, there is a constant - often critical - need to keep up with hospital demand.
