## Fifth Third Bank in G.H. robbed

The Fifth Third Bank at 9301 Vista Way in Garfield Heights was robbed on May 3rd, around 4:05 p.m., according to Special Agent Vicki Anderson with the Cleveland Division of the FBI.

Anderson said a lone black male went into the bank and handed a teller a threatening demand note indicating a bank robbery.

According to a Garfield Heights police report, the note also said the man would shoot the teller, but Anderson said no weapon was seen.

The teller handed him the cash and the suspect then fled on foot towards Steak-N-Shake restaurant. No physical injuries were reported. Police were unable to locate the suspect.

He is described as having a dark complexion, about 6'1", slim build, early 20s, who spoke with an "African" or "island" accent. He was wearing a black

baseball cap and black wind-breaker jacket.

## Maple Heights Council takes step toward placing tax levy renewals on November ballot

Maple Heights Council voted on two resolutions "declaring it necessary" to renew two existing tax levies for the city's police and fire departments on the November 6th ballot at its meeting last week.

The levies, both currently in the amount of 2.0 mills each, have been in existence since 1998, and have been renewed before, the last time in November, 2012 for five years.

The revenue currently generated by the levies (the exact amount was not available as of press time) helps to fund salaries of police officers and firefighters and provides funds for maintenance and operation of vehicles, buildings and equipment in both departments.

If council approves placing the renewal levies on the ballot at a future meeting, and also if voters pass them in November, collection of the revenue for tax year 2018 would begin in 2019, according to the legislation.

Legislation for a financial recovery plan to help Maple Heights get out of a state of financial emergency declared by State Auditor Dave Yost two years ago was placed on second reading at last week's council meeting.

Currently Maple Heights has a fund deficit in the area of \$1.7 million, significantly lower than the \$2.5 million deficit it was in two years ago. However, to get out of fiscal emergency, the city has to get itself completely out of debt and balance its budget.

Mayor Annette Blackwell, other city officials and city council have been working diligently on the financial recovery plan, which details all the revenues and expenditures of the city, and also announces actions the city has taken and will continue to take to raise funds and reduce expenses.

Unofficial results from the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections show the Bedford vote as 1463 for the tax hike and 339 against.

Maple Heights voters approved the school levy renewal by a vote of 812 to 332.

## Bedford okays joining Chagrin Valley Dispatch

After city officials announced several months ago that Bedford would be leaving the Southeast Emergency Communications Center to join another regional dispatch, council approved a resolution at its meeting last week allowing Bedford to join the Chagrin Valley Dispatch Council.

The cost to participate in the CVDC, based in the University Hospitals facility in Bedford, is \$259,254.21, to be paid in three installments as a Capital Charge Share, and \$36,616.25 per month Operating Cost Share.

The dispatch center serves several Northeast Ohio communities including Bentleyville, Chagrin Falls, Chagrin Falls Township, Hunting Valley, Moreland Hills, Orange, South Russell, Woodmere, Solon and Euclid.

"Ultimately the decision was made to leave the SECC and move to Chagrin Valley, which is located here in Bedford," City Manager Mike Mallis said. "I think it's going to be a huge improvement for us, especially for both our safety forces as well as the residents, and hopefully we can say we delivered on what we originally said we would in 2012."

## Lighting legislation

Three pieces of legislation dealing with lighting on city streets were placed on second reading at last week's meeting by council.

The resolution "declares the necessity" to improve streets throughout the city by lighting

them, while one of the ordinances determines to proceed with the improvements for next year.

The other ordinance levies a special assessment to pay for the lighting on properties owned throughout the city. The rate will be 1.60 mills per each dollar of tax value per year, or 16 cents per each \$100 of tax value per year for the tax year 2017, to be collected in 2018, according to the legislation.

"This is our annual street lighting vote to keep our street lights on," Mayor Stan Koci commented.

All three pieces will be discussed by Mallis, Koci, other city administration and council members in the coming weeks, with a final vote expected at a future meeting.

## Council meeting time may change

Placed on first reading was an ordinance to change the starting time of regular council meetings from 8 p.m. to 7 p.m. on the first and third Mondays of the month.

"If we do this, it won't start until September of this year, but we have plenty of time to discuss it," Mayor Koci said.

Council passed an ordinance to buy 3700 tons of road salt through the Ohio Department of Transportation for the 2017-18 winter season, as part of a consortium with other communities.

A resolution approving and accepting the proposed 2017 tax budget for the year from January 1, 2018 to December

31, 2018 was placed on first reading, with a public hearing scheduled for Monday, May 15.

## Train crashes into empty car as driver goes around 'Road Closed' sign on McCracken

A train travelling on the tracks on McCracken Road in Garfield Heights struck an unoccupied vehicle that had gotten stuck on May 4, around 9:10 p.m. No one was injured.

When officers arrived at the scene, the train was stopped and the people who had been inside of the car before running from the area were at a gas station at McCracken and Broadway Ave. The driver said he drove past the "Road Closed" sign and onto the tracks which were under repair, then got stuck there, according to the traffic crash report filed with Garfield Heights police. He and his passenger then fled from the vehicle and called police, then heard the train coming.

The vehicle was located about 150 feet from the point of impact and came to rest on the west side of the train from the east set of rails. The driver, from Maple Heights, was cited for driving on a closed roadway and failure to obey traffic control devices.

## Another incident

A few hours later, around 2:15 a.m., another driver from Garfield Heights attempted to go around the train tracks and construction barricades and the "Road Closed" signs, heading northbound, according to a report. As the driver attempted to cross over the second set of train tracks, his vehicle got stuck, so he got out of the car. He then saw another vehicle coming from the south and contacted police. The driver of the other vehicle, from Pennsylvania, tried applying the brakes but was unable to stop in time and scraped the back corner of the other vehicle's bumper and slid to a stop.

The driver from Garfield Heights claimed he did not see what the report said were "clearly marked signs" stating the road was closed or the barricades placed in front of the railroad crossing, according to the report. He was cited for failure to obey traffic control devices and for driving on a closed roadway.

## Huntington Bank in M.H. robbed

The Huntington Bank at 6134 Dunham Rd. in Maple Heights was robbed at about 2:30 p.m. on Monday, May 8, according to Special Agent Vicki Anderson with the Cleveland Division of the FBI.

The suspects are described as both being black males, approximately 5'10", wearing dark clothes, dark jeans and red face masks. Both suspects were armed with semi-automatic handguns, Anderson said. A round was fired from one of the suspects' guns which appeared to be an accidental discharge, according to Anderson. No physical injuries were reported.

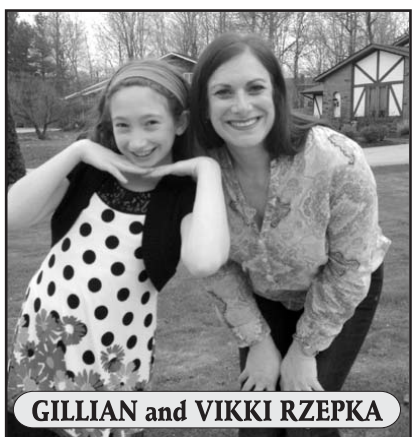

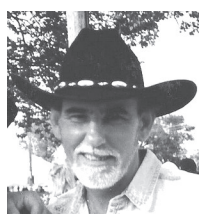

## Two arrested in G.H. burglary

### Delayed Homicide
