Dedication of redone Mill Creek Falls playground honors Ron Boehnlein, Warner-Turney group

Mill Creek Falls Playground, formerly known as the Tot Lot at the corner of Tioga Avenue and Warner Road in the Mill Creek Community, has gotten a makeover with new playground equipment and sidewalks within the park.

The Warner Turney Neighborhood Organization (WTNO), along with members of the Connecticut Block Club, has been working to improve and enhance that playground for years.

The original improvements to the park began with ReImagine Cleveland funds in 2010. Over the next three to four years, \$15,000 was raised by the residents for ground leveling, clean-up efforts, a fence and some programming dollars.

In 2014, Warner-Turney residents, with the help of Slavic Village Development, applied for and received a \$25,000 grant from the Hershey Foundation of Ohio to completely redo this playground.

This money led to another \$125,000 investment from Ward 2 Councilman Zack Reed and the city of Cleveland Capital Improvements Funds.

Last Saturday morning the brand new Mill Creek Falls Playground was dedicated to the Mill Creek Falls community.

In addition to the ribboncutting and the official opening of the beautiful new playground, Tioga has a new honorary name of Warner Turney Neighborhood Organization Way and the park will be renamed Ronald Boehnlein Family Park.

Investigators seek tips, offer \$5000 reward for info on Garfield Hts. arson

The State Fire Marshal's Fire & Explosion Investigation Bureau is asking for tips from the public regarding an intentionally set fire to a detached garage at 10606 Edgemark Dr. in Garfield Heights.

The fire occurred around 3:30 a.m. on Friday, June 23. The fire caused extensive damage to the garage, including damage to one car and two motorcycles inside, according to Garfield Heights Fire Department Lt. David McKee. There was also heavy damage to the home next door on E. 106th St.

Lt. McKee said someone driving in the area noticed the fire and notified the residents who then called the fire department. Firefighters responded and quickly extinguished the flames. Lt. McKee said the fire is considered suspicious and it is suspected an accelerant was used, however, the investigation is ongoing. It is being conducted jointly by the fire department, Garfield Heights Police Department and the Marshal's office.

A reward of up to \$5,000 is being offered by the Blue Ribbon Arson Committee for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the fire.

GHPD helps recover several stolen vehicles

Garfield Heights police helped recover several stolen vehicles last week throughout Garfield Heights and Cleveland. The following information was taken from GHPD police reports and dispatch logs.

On June 20th, around 1:40 a.m., an officer on patrol checked a registration of a vehicle being driven by an 18-year-old Cleveland resident. Police learned the vehicle was stolen from Cleveland.

The 18-year-old led police on a high speed chase and was apprehended in Cleveland after a pursuit. While inspecting the stolen vehicle, police found a gun which was collected as evidence.

The 18-year-old was held at GHPD jail for receiving stolen property and fleeing and eluding, and issued citations for reckless operation, speeding and railroad violation. The passengers of the vehicle were not located.

Also on June 20th, around 8:40 a.m., a 24-year-old Maple Heights resident caused a motor vehicle accident at Granger Rd. and E. 134th St. The vehicle he was driving was entered stolen from Cleveland. He fled on foot from the scene and was caught. He had Xanax and a small of marijuana on his person.

The 24-year-old was charged with attempted drug possession, issued citations for running a stop sign, driving with a temporary permit and hit skip. He was also issued a summons for possession of marijuana. The suspect and a female passenger, 29, of Cleveland, were held for investigation of receiving stolen property.

In other recovery of stolen vehicles by GHPD, a truck was found in a parking lot in the 10600 block of Broadway Avenue with its column peeled, all four tires missing, battery missing and cables cut on June 21st, around 1:20 p.m. The truck had been entered stolen by Cleveland PD. The vehicle's owner was notified.

On June 22nd, around 11 p.m., a woman said an SUV struck her vehicle near Broadway Avenue and E. 135th Street. She followed the vehicle into the lot of a nearby Marathon station where a group of males got out and fled in an unknown direction. The vehicle was entered stolen out of University of Akron PD. Police searched the area for the suspects with negative results.

Just before midnight on June 22nd, police were dispatched to the 13100 block of Grannis Road. The caller said people were getting in and out of a black Toyota and a red Mazda and walking up and down driveways. When officers arrived they saw three males and two females fleeing the area. The Toyota had been stolen out of Bedford and the red Mazda was stolen out of Maple Heights.
