## Police, fire levy renewals head to November ballot in Maple Heights

Maple Heights Council, at its meeting last week, approved placing the renewal of two levies on the November ballot for the city's police and fire departments.

As stated in the legislation, the levies, in the amount of 2.0 mills each, are projected to raise \$516,837 apiece, according to the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer's figures. This revenue for both departments, totaling about \$1.03 million, will be collected each year for five years if the levies are passed by voters on Tuesday, November 7. Collection would begin in 2019 for tax year 2018.

First passed in 1998, the levies have been approved by voters every time they have been up for renewal. The funds raised not only pay salaries, but also provide and maintain motor vehicles, communications and other equipment used in the police department; and also provide, maintain and operate fire equipment, buildings and sites for the fire department.

Finance Director Tracy Smith said the owner of a \$50,000 home in the city, for example, currently pays \$70 per year towards both levies, or a little under \$6 per month. However, the amount paid by each individual homeowner is contingent upon the value of their home.

## Man fatally shot on Macomb

Cleveland Police and the Homicide Unit are investigating the shooting death of a 52-year-old Willoughby resident on Macomb Avenue in Cleveland last week.

According to a police report, when police arrived in the 8800 block of Macomb Avenue last Thursday around 7:15 p.m., they saw several witnesses and neighbors attempting to give a man first aid. Police saw a gunshot wound to the man's chest and left hand and he was taken to MetroHealth

Medical Center where he later died, according to Cleveland police.

The victim's children told police their father was communicating with a man on an Internet app called "Offer Up" and was going to trade his daughter's vehicle for another vehicle, according to the police report. The trade was originally to have taken place on Vineyard Avenue, not Macomb, according to the report.

Sgt. Jennifer Ciaccia, public information officer with CPD, said the suspects in this case were described as four black males all wearing hoodies.

Witnesses said they saw one of the suspects brandish a handgun and the victim grabbed it to push it away, then let go of it. The suspect shot the 52-year-old twice, stole his wallet and fled in the daughter's car. The others fled on foot towards Warner Road, according to the report.

Officers searched the area for the suspects with negative results. Police noted that there may have been several security cameras in the area that could have captured the fleeing suspects. Cleveland police continue to investigate and anyone with information is asked to contact homicide investigators at 216-623-5464.

## Police, fire levy renewals

"Both the police and fire levies are renewal levies, and neither levy will generate any new taxes to homeowners," Smith stated.

She said homeowners would only see an increase or reduction in the taxes they currently pay if their particular property was valued at a higher or lower amount than it was previously.

"The expectation is that the property is at a similar valuation as it was when the previous levies were passed (in 2012), and therefore there would be little to no increase or reduction to the homeowner's property taxes," Smith stated.

### Charter changes also on ballot

Several months after they were first placed on a meeting agenda and a month after they were tabled at the July meeting at the request of Law Director Frank Consolo for further discussion, council passed two ordinances at last week's meeting to place proposed charter changes regarding civil service requirements for potential police officers and firefighters on the November ballot.

The first proposed charter change states that Mayor Annette Blackwell has recommended submitting the issue to voters "to provide that competitive civil service examinations shall not be required for lateral entry [same level] transfers into employment."

If voters approve the charter change, the Maple Heights Civil Service Commission will have the authority to determine that competitive written exami-

nations for lateral entry for police cadet and fire cadet positions "may be dispensed with."

Instead of a written exam, police and fire cadets would be able to complete an application, submit proof of experience and training, undergo an oral interview and be subject to other requirements, as determined by the Civil Service Commission.

The second proposed charter amendment states that the city's civil service rules, orders or decisions would prevail over conflicting state law provisions.

This piece of legislation states that in any matter where a rule, regulation, order or decision of the Civil Service Commission conflicts with state law, "the rules, regulations, order or decision [of the commission] shall prevail over, and render null and void, the state provision with respect to the city."

### Affordable housing pact

Council approved a resolution authorizing Blackwell to establish a working

relationship between her as mayor of Maple Heights; Chris Alvarado, executive director of Slavic Village Development (SVD); and Gus Frangos, president, Cuyahoga County Land Reutilization Corporation (CCLRC), "to make low cost, lightly distressed homes in Maple Heights available through an affordable homeownership and renovation program."

The program will follow a similar approach to SVD's "Neighbors Invest In Broadway" [NIB] program, a low cost housing sale and renovation program with an emphasis on a decent, safe and sanitary rehabilitation. The program will utilize SVD's expertise, with the assistance of the city in property acquisition, at low-cost or through donation from CCLRC."

The NIB program reclaims low priced vacant and foreclosed homes using a purchase-rehab approach. Homes are acquired either by donation or at very low cost. These homes then are offered "as is" through an application process, and buyers must prove that they have the financial capacity to both purchase the home and finance the needed repairs.

Emphasis is placed on exterior repairs, including roofs, siding and driveways.

According to the memorandum, Maple Heights and SVD will jointly market the CCLRC houses with development potential in the city with investors or potential homeowners, and Maple Heights and SVD will jointly determine the purchaser of the property. Also, an \$8,000 transaction fee will be equally split between Maple Heights and Slavic Village Development.

### To apply for firefighters grant

Council approved legislation for Blackwell and Fire Chief Vito Kavaliunas to apply for a Firefighter Exposure to Environmental Elements grant through the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation for equipment to protect firefighters from "dangerous environmental elements," in an amount not to exceed \$15,000.

If the grant is awarded, the BWC would pay up to \$12,000, and Maple Heights would pay up to \$3,000 as a match, according to the ordinance.

Also passed was a resolution for a contract with AT&T for Internet service and a 36-month service plan, and a resolution to increase the city's fees for ambulance transportation services.

## Garfield Hts. man arrested in connection with rapes, other sex offenses

Yesterday morning, agents of the United States Marshals Violent Fugitive Task Force arrested Scott R. Brundage, age 49, of Garfield Heights, based upon a warrant for alleged multiple sex offenses involving seven female victims ages 10-15, all residents of Stow, according to a press release from the City of Stow Police Department.

The charges, four counts of rape, nine counts of gross sexual imposition, two counts of sexual imposition and one count of corrupting another with drugs, came after an investigation completed by the Stow Police Department. The latter charge resulted from allegedly inducing one victim to ingest illegal substances.

According to the press release, the investigation was initiated in January 2017, when the youngest victim disclosed to her mother that Brundage, who at that time lived in Stow, had allegedly been sexually assaulting her. Further investigation revealed female siblings had also allegedly been victimized, according to the release. In March 2017, another parent reported her daughters had also allegedly been sexually assaulted by Brundage, the release said.

Following a lengthy investigation and testimony by a Stow Police detective before the Summit County Grand Jury, a secret indictment was issued on August 2, 2017.

Brundage was arrested at his residence on Granger

Road in Garfield Heights and was transported to the Summit County Jail pending arraignment on the charges, according to the release. If convicted, he could face life in prison without parole on rape charges.

Brundage has no criminal history, according to Stow police.

display of plate, no seatbelt and other traffic violations.

John Word, accused of firing shots into Club 228 in Bedford and killing a man last year, pled guilty in Cuyahoga County Court last Wednesday to involuntary manslaughter, attempted murder, and felon in possession of a firearm, according to Deputy Chief Rick Suts with the Bedford Police Department.

Word fired the shots into Club 228 on Northfield Road in Bedford on New Year's Eve that claimed the life of Trevis Stephens, Suts said. Stephens, 33, was a patron at the bar and was taken to the hospital where he later died from his injuries.

Word was sentenced to 22 years with no chance of parole and he is still facing a Federal holder for previous crimes, according to Suts.

"We hope this sentence

gives some manner of closure to the victim's family," said Suts.

## Safe Passages program for addicts

### Newburgh Hts. PD

With the support of Mayor Trevor Elkins, the Newburgh Heights Village Council and Police Chief John Majoy, the Village of Newburgh Heights is adopting the Safe Passages program to address the needs of any Cuyahoga County resident who comes into the Newburgh Heights Police Department requesting help with their opiate addiction.

Effective immediately, any Cuyahoga County resident entering the police station and requesting help

will be immediately screened into the Safe Passages Initiative. If the person requesting help with their addiction is in possession of drugs or their drug equipment (needles, etc.), they will not be charged. Rather, officers will follow established protocol and work with the individual toward entering a treatment facility. This will include placement, transportation and follow-up to ensure the individuals making progress.

### Bedford PD

The Bedford Police Department has announced it will participate in the Safe Passages program for residents suffering from heroin addiction.
