Bedford recognized in READING FUN AT 'Architectural Digest'

Broadway Avenue in Bedford has been recognized as one of "The 15 Most Beautiful Main Streets Across America" in the national magazine "Architectural Digest," but officials acknowledged at the August 7th council meeting that crime and other issues need to be addressed in the city.

Bedford was named eighth out of the 15 towns for its "charming main street lined with shops, restaurants and other small businesses... with vintage flair intact" as "a quintessential hub of any small community," in the July article written by Stefanie Waldek.

Included in Waldek's article is a picture of Broadway Avenue in the city, with this description as the reason for Bedford being included: "This suburb of Cleveland was founded in 1823 as settlers began building mills along the waterfall-laden Tinkers Creek. Broadway Avenue is the hub of Bedford's Historic District, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places

City officials credited the work of the Bedford Historical Society for the national distinction, including Councilwoman Marilyn Zolata, who along with other council members and city officials, supports and participates in the activities of the historical society.

Fatal crash on Dunham

A Maple Heights man was pronounced dead at the scene of a car crash on Dunham Road in Maple Heights Monday morning and the road was closed for nearly six hours, according to Maple Heights police.

Around 2:45 a.m. Maple Heights officers observed a white 2013 Jeep Laredo in the area of Dunham Rd. and Woodbrook Ave. It appeared to have rolled over numerous times and the driver had been ejected from the vehicle, according to police. Timothy Larkin, 40, was pronounced dead at the scene.

Maple Heights police say Larkin lost control of his vehicle and are waiting on the medical examiner's report for further information on the cause of the crash, according to Lt. Joseph Mocsiran with MHPD.

Mosquito trap in V.V. tests positive for West Nile Virus

The Village of Valley View was recently notified by the Cuyahoga County Board of Health (BOH) that a mosquito trap in the Hathaway Road area tested positive for West Nile Virus, according to the Valley View Fire Department's public Facebook page.

No human cases have been reported but the BOH encourages the public to take the following precautions:

- 1. Use insect repellant containing DEET
- 2. Dispose of outdoor containers that collect water
- 3. Empty and refill bird baths weekly
- 4. Clean and drain pools or hot tubs not in use
- 5. Unclog all gutters to drain properly
- 6. Fill tree holes with tar or cement
- 7. Make sure all door and window screens are tightened
- 8. Wear long sleeve shirts and pants when possible
- 9. Keep children indoors during peak mosquito activity (one hour before and after sunset)

To report areas of persistent standing water or a heavy population of biting mosquitos, contact the BOH at 216-201-2000.

6:10 and 7 p.m., showed four males enter the B building and go to the second floor. Moments later, the males were seen carrying large TVs and a multipiece sofa set through the doors and down the stairs, according to a police re-

Also seen in the footage was a mid-sized black vehicle parked in front of building B prior to the arrival of the males. Inside the car was a woman and two small children. She drove away when the other suspects drove off after the robbery, according to the
