Bedford recognized in 'Architectural Digest'

Broadway Avenue in Bedford has been recognized as one of "The 15 Most Beautiful Main Streets Across America" in the national magazine "Architectural Digest," but officials acknowledged at the August 7th council meeting that crime and other issues need to be addressed in the city.

Bedford was named eighth out of the 15 towns for its "charming main street lined with shops, restaurants and other small businesses... with vintage flair intact" as "a quintessential hub of any small community," in the July article written by Stefanie Waldek.

Included in Waldek's article is a picture of Broadway Avenue in the city, with this description as the reason for Bedford being included: "This suburb of Cleveland was founded in 1823 as settlers began building mills along the waterfall-laden Tinkers Creek. Broadway Avenue is the hub of Bedford's Historic District, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places."

City officials credited the work of the Bedford Historical Society for the national distinction, including Councilwoman Marilyn Zolata, who along with other council members and city officials, supports and participates in the activities of the historical society.

Fatal crash on Dunham

A Maple Heights man was pronounced dead at the scene of a car crash on Dunham Road in Maple Heights Monday morning and the road was closed for nearly six hours, according to Maple Heights police.

Around 2:45 a.m. Maple Heights officers observed a white 2013 Jeep Laredo in the area of Dunham Rd. and Woodbrook Ave. It appeared to have rolled over numerous times and the driver had been ejected from the vehicle, according to police. Timothy Larkin, 40, was pronounced dead at the scene.

Maple Heights police say Larkin lost control of his vehicle and are waiting on the medical examiner's report for further information on the cause of the crash, according to Lt. Joseph Mocsiran with MHPD.

Mosquito trap in V.V. tests positive for West Nile Virus

The Village of Valley View was recently notified by the Cuyahoga County Board of Health (BOH) that a mosquito trap in the Hathaway Road area tested positive for West Nile Virus, according to the Valley View Fire Department's public Facebook page.

No human cases have been reported but the BOH encourages the public to take the following precautions:

1. Use insect repellent containing DEET
2. Dispose of outdoor containers that collect water
3. Empty and refill bird baths weekly
4. Clean and drain pools or hot tubs not in use
5. Unclog all gutters to drain properly
6. Fill tree holes with tar or cement
7. Make sure all door and window screens are tightened
8. Wear long sleeve shirts and pants when possible
9. Keep children indoors during peak mosquito activity (one hour before and after sunset)

To report areas of persistent standing water or a heavy population of biting mosquitos, contact the BOH at 216-201-2000.

For Sister Margaret Mary Grochowski, age 91, who recently celebrated 75 years in the Sisters of the Holy Spirit, it has been a legacy of providing loving compassionate care at Jennings Center in Garfield Heights.

Jennings opened under the sponsorship of the Sisters of the Holy Spirit, she was received as a novice at the age of 15. Sister professed her final vows in 1947, and has faithfully used her gifts to serve as a nurse, director, artist and friend.

She grew up in the parish of St. Mary of Czestochowa in Cleveland, and her mother, a very devout Catholic, was an inspiration through her faith, prayer, involvement in the parish and praying the rosary.

"She instilled the importance of the love for the church and for Christ," Sr. Margaret Mary remembers, adding "I would put the pillowcase on my head and pretend to be a nun."

Sister first ministered at Jennings in housekeeping and as a nursing assistant. After becoming a licensed

practical nurse in 1956, she served as Jennings' Director of Nursing for many years as well as the Director of the Restorative Program. Her creativity, coupled with training for activities coordinators in the 1970s, led her to continue her work at Jennings as a life enrichment coordinator. Now retired, she continues as a volunteer with a particular passion for those living with Alzheimer's disease.

Sr. Margaret Mary held many positions of leadership within the Sisters of the Holy Spirit. She served as a local Superior at Jennings and also as a council member for many years. She has been revered by staff members for her spirituality, loving and compassionate demeanor, her high standards and her zest for life. Her gift of creativity

continues to shine, having won many awards for her craft work with residents as well as practicing her own artistic talents.

Community police reports

(The following information was obtained from filed police reports and police dispatch logs.)

BEDFORD

Stolen Vehicle

Bedford recognized

(Continued from Page 1)

Spinks also addressed recent bad news in the city, including a drive-by shooting on Grand Boulevard in her ward earlier this month during the day with numerous neighbors witnessing the incident. Despite multiple shots fired in a densely populated residential area, no injuries were reported.

Although officers arrived quickly on the scene, the suspect vehicle was not located, she said.

Another incident reported in recent weeks happened around midnight when someone shot into the picture window of a house in her ward. She said law enforcement depends on residents to let them know what is going on in the neighborhoods, and urged them to call police when anything or anyone seems suspicious.

City Manager Mike Mallis also praised police for their outstanding work on solving recent crimes in the city, including the apprehension and arrest of two suspects in several armed robberies in Bedford and surrounding communities.

New dispatch center

Mallis stated that as of August 1st, calls to Bedford's safety forces are now officially being handled by the Chagrin Valley Dispatch Center, located in the University Hospitals facility in Bedford.

"Other than some minor, minor glitches, everything seems to be running very, very smoothly," he said.

Legislation passed

All legislation on last week's meeting agenda was passed, including an ordinance providing a 30 percent discount on water and

sewer rates for disabled and senior homeowners in the city. The combined yearly household income (including any household members over 18 years of age) living in the property must not exceed \$32,681 for the year 2016, to receive the discount for 2018. Also, no household member may receive more than \$3,000 annually in dividend and interest income.

Finance Director Frank Gambosi said that the ordinance clarified certain income guidelines, explaining, "Those that are on state disability would not be in-

cluded in the calculation." Also passed was an ordinance amending a Job Creation and Retention Program Grant that was developed to provide incentives to businesses "to create, retain and expand employment opportunities" within the city.

After voters approved increasing the city's income tax rate from 2.25 percent to 3 percent in May, which will take effect in January 2018, current agreements between Bedford and some of the city's businesses had to be changed.

Also addressed was \$126,147 in unforfeited funds confiscated by the SEALE (Southeast Area Law Enforcement) Narcotics Unit in association with drug busts, with Bedford's

portion to be used for its SEALE operations and equipment.

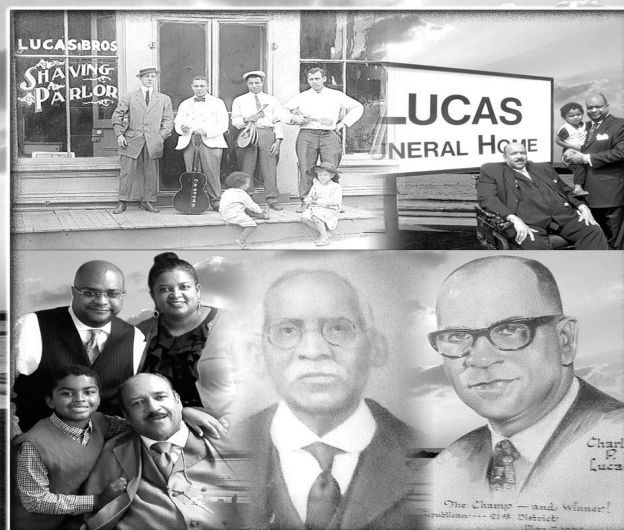
