US Marshals announce arrest of Glen Adkins

United States Marshal Pete Elliott, Cuyahoga County Prosecutor Mike O'Malley and Cleveland Police Chief Calvin Williams announced last Wednesday the arrest of Glen Otto Adkins, age 20, wanted for multiple charges including felonious assault, assault on a police officer and burglary. He is also suspected in a string of burglaries in Cleveland's Old Brooklyn and Slavic Village neighborhoods.

Adkins was arrested Wednesday morning, Sept. 27, at the Red Roof Inn in Independence. Also in the hotel room with him were his mother, Mary Leach, who was wanted for assault on a police officer, and his two juvenile brothers, one who was wanted for escape and the other wanted for felony violations, according to a US Marshals Service press release. All three were arrested along with Adkins.

U.S. Marshal Pete Elliott said, "I would like to thank the community for their invaluable assistance in this case and recognize Cleveland Council President Kevin Kelley and Councilman Tony Brancatelli for putting up reward money out of their own pockets to help catch this fugitive who was victimizing their neighborhoods."

Guns with lasers used in several G.H. robberies

Garfield Heights police are searching for men who have recently robbed Garfield Heights residents with guns that have lasers mounted on them, according to police reports filed with GHPD.

A 34-year-old Band Ave. resident told police he was sitting and talking in the passenger side of his friend's vehicle on September 25th, around 11 p.m., when he was robbed at gun-

point by two males.

He said he began stepping out of the vehicle in his driveway in the 8500 block of Band when he was approached by two males with guns that had lasers mounted on them. One of the males demanded all of the victim's belongings, including his clothes, and the victim complied, giving the man his shoes, swimming trunks and wallet, according to the report.

The second male pointed a gun at the victim's friend in the driver's seat and demanded her purse. Police noted that the woman left prior to police arrival and so were unable to speak with her at the time of the report.

While searching for suspects, police saw two males running in the 4900 block of E. 86th St. Officers were unable to capture the suspects, but found a vacant home nearby that appeared

Special needs scholarship apps. accepted year-round

Eligible students can now apply year-round for Ohio's Jon Peterson Special Needs Scholarship Program. The program, administered by the Ohio Department of Education, is available for students in grades K-12 who have a current Individualized Education Program (IEP).

Previously, the program held two application windows annually, but language included in House Bill 49, the state operating budget, changed the program to now accept applications all year.

Jon Peterson Special Needs Scholarships are worth up to \$27,000 per year, depending on the child's special education category. The scholarship is renewable through high school graduation or the student's 22nd birthday, if he or she has not met graduation requirements.

Recipients are to use their scholarship for educational services and/or tuition at the participating private school and/or private service providers of the family's choice. There are currently more than 360 registered schools and private providers statewide.

To apply, families research the participating providers in their area and choose the private school and/or providers that are the best fit for their child's unique learning needs. Families may choose more

than one approved provider to fulfill the services listed on their child's IEP.

Students will go through the admissions process at the participating school and/or providers of their choice. Once the student has been accepted, the family will ask the primary provider to apply for the scholarship on their behalf. While students who have an Evaluation Team Report that determines they are eligible for special education and related services are eligible to apply for the scholarship, the student must have a finalized IEP in order to receive the scholarship award.

The number of available scholarships is capped at five percent of the total number of students with special needs in the state. Current private school students are eligible to apply for this program. Students cannot receive a scholarship and remain in their resident public school district.

to be broken into. Inside the home, police found five rifle rounds on a shelf and collected them as evidence, then secured the home, according to the report.

A neighbor in the 5000 block of E. 86th St. had security camera footage which showed two males run from the 8500 block of Band Ave. and get into a light-colored SUV and flee the area around the time of the incident.

Police noted that around 1:30 a.m. on September 26th, a vehicle was pulled over near E. 119th St. and Granger Rd. The passenger admitted he was in possession of two handguns, both of which had mounted lasers on them. They were confiscated and stored at GHPD.

Residents of the 8300 block of Care Ave. told police two men with guns robbed them inside their home on September 29th, around 7 a.m.

One of the residents said he was asleep on the couch when he heard what he thought was a gunshot. As he unlocked the front door to look outside, two males had guns with mounted lasers pointed at him and they demanded he get on the ground. A female resident who came to investigate a noise she heard was also ordered to the ground at gunpoint, according to the report.

The males stole about 70 guns and thousands of rounds of ammo that had been locked in a safe. The male resident told police he would get all makes, models and serial numbers of the guns to be entered into LEADS.

The Detective Bureau was called to collect any evidence from the scene. Garfield Heights police continue to investigate both robberies.

Presentations on crime prevention, personal protection available

At a 2016 council meeting, some Bedford residents called attention to their concerns on rising crime in the city. As a public service, the local PACT Consultant

Group volunteered to do a presentation on both crime prevention and "Personal Protection for the Thinking Person®." And earlier this month, Ron Borsch, manager of PACT, did a two-hour presentation at the Bedford Recreation Center.

The 50 attendees were encouraged to use their smart phones to help police with documented pictures or video activity of suspicious persons, their car's license plate and for the fast paced PACT presentation, to capture any of the PowerPoint slides they thought were important.



appears to bend over a pole and possible snort something off of it, according to the police report. A short time later, while still speaking to the unknown male, the 33-year-old becomes wobbly and his legs give out, according to the report. The unknown male then quickly walked away heading westbound toward Turney Rd.

Rape

On September 25th, around 1 a.m., police saw a woman walking in the roadway who looked scared and upset. Her shirt was ripped and there were marks visible on her neck. She said she was sexually assaulted by unknown male while walking in the alley near Save-A-Lot at Turney Rd. and Garfield Blvd. The 33-year-old told police a man covered her face with a cloth that smelled like a chemical which made her

pass out briefly. She said at some point the man threw her to the ground, held a knife to her throat, threatened to kill her, then raped her, according to the police report. She told the police the man kept saying she "deserved it for walking out late at night." After the assault, the man put a cloth over her face, stole her cell phone and told her to stay where she was for 20 minutes. Once the man was gone, she threw the cloth in a nearby dumpster and began walking home.

She described the suspect as a black male, about 5'8", large muscular build, short dreadlock hair, wearing a white muscle shirt and gray shorts with a red stripe. She was taken to Hillcrest Hospital for evaluation. Police searched the alley and nearby dumpsters for evidence. Police continue to investigate.

Trespassing

Police were dispatched to the E. 98th St. and South Highland area on September 28th, around 9:55 p.m.,

for reports of three males on bicycles breaking into cars. Police were taking reports from nearby residents and also searching for suspects. Around 10:20 p.m., an officer saw three males on bikes and two of them matched the suspect descriptions given by victims. While speaking to the males, police learned a blue iPad had been stolen from a home inside a home on E. 88th St., and the third male was in possession of an iPad that matched the stolen item's description.

Two of the males, 16 and 18, were taken to GHPD and placed on an investigative hold for burglary. The third male was issued a summons for vehicle trespassing.

Weapon Offense

A resident of the 5400 block of E. 135th St. told police she was asleep on the couch on September 25th, around 2 a.m., and heard a loud noise, like glass breaking. She looked outside but "didn't think much of it." When she woke
