US Marshals announce Community arrest of Glen Adkins

United States Marshal Pete Elliott, Cuyahoga County Prosecutor Mike O'Malley and Cleveland Police Chief Calvin Williams announced last Wednesday the arrest of Glen Otto Adkins, age 20, wanted for multiple charges including felonious assault, assault on a police officer and burglary. He is also suspected in a string of burglaries in Cleveland's Old Brooklyn and Slavic Village neighborhoods.

Adkins was arrested Wednesday morning, Sept. 27, at the Red Roof Inn in Independence. Scholarship Program. The program, administered by the Ohio Department of Education, is available for students in grades K-12 who have a current Individualized Education Program (IEP).

Previously, the program held two application win-Bill 49, the state operating budget, changed the procations all year.

Jon Peterson Special Needs Scholarships are worth up to \$27,000 per year, depending on the child's special education category. The scholarship school graduation or the student's 22nd birthday, if he or she has not met graduation requirements.

Recipients are to use their scholarship for educational services and/or tuition at the participating private school and/or private service providers of the family's choice. There are currently more than 360 registered schools and private providers statewide.

to be broken into. Inside the home, police found five grams and services and free rifle rounds on a shelf and collected them as evidence, then secured the home, according to the report.

A neighbor in the 5000 block of E. 86th St. had security camera footage which showed two males run from the 8500 block of Band Ave. and get into a light-colored SUV and flee the area around the time of the incident.

Police noted that around 1:30 a.m. on September 26th, a vehicle was pulled over near E. 119th St. and Granger Rd. The passenger admitted he was in possession of two handguns, both of which had mounted lasers on them. They were confiscated and stored at GHPD.

Residents of the 8300 block of Care Ave. told police two men with guns robbed them inside their home on September 29th, around 7 a.m.

One of the residents said he was asleep on the couch when he heard what he thought was a gunshot. As he unlocked the front door to look outside, two males had guns with mounted lasers pointed at him and they demanded he get on the ground. A female resident who came to investigate a noise she heard was also ordered to the ground at gunpoint, according to the report.

The males stole about 70 guns and thousands of rounds of ammo that had been locked in a safe. The male resident told police he would get all makes, models and serial numbers of the guns to be entered into


The Detective Bureau was called to collect any evidence from the scene. Garfield Heights police continue to investigate both robberies.


