Independence to partner for mixed use development on Rockside Road

Independence City Council passed an ordinance last week authorizing Mayor Anthony Togliatti to execute a Letter of Intent to negotiate an agreement with Industrial Realty Group, LLC (IRG) for the \$2.5 million purchase and subsequent development of a 33-acre city-owned site on Rockside Road near the I-480/I-77 interchange.

The site, one of the largest parcels of undeveloped land in Independence, is located at the northwest corner of Rockside Road and Oak Tree Boulevard. The city's Area Plan for this parcel calls for its development as a mixed-use employment center combining office space, retail uses, restaurants and possibly a hotel under Planned Unit Development (PUD) regulations adopted in 2015. PUDs enable developers to

plan large areas as single entities, with the design flexibility to combine land uses that would typically develop separately.

The development will be the first project to develop under these regulations, according to Mayor Togliatti. "The city has been seeking the right partner here for several years," he said. "We're looking forward to bringing a new, vibrant option to the City of Independence, and IRG has the vision and capacity to develop the property to its fullest potential."

"This public-private partnership is an outgrowth of the growing momentum we see for exciting mixed-use projects in suburban communities," said Peter Goffstein, IRG senior vice president. "In a PUD, different land uses can en-

gage with each other in pedestrian-friendly ways, and we plan to open up this site's possibilities with appealing amenities unique to this area."

PUDs are subject to public hearings and council approval following a process to align proposed developments with a site's natural features, what is feasible in the real estate market, and approved are plans. Goffstein said the first order of business is to work through wetlands issues with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. That will have a significant bearing on how buildings are configured on the site, which also has some steep natural topography.

The completed development is expected to generate up to 1,500-2,000 new jobs, sewer service to the site.

Valley View man dies in motorcycle accident

Nathaniel VanNostran, 22, of Valley View, was killed in a motorcycle accident on I-480 eastbound on October 14th, according to Garfield Heights police.

Officers were dispatched to I-480 between Transportation Blvd. and Granger Rd. around 8:35 p.m. on a report of an accident. Dispatch said several motorists had stopped to help, including an off duty nurse, according to the police report. Officers limited the traffic to one lane and VanNostran was pronounced dead at the scene by a doctor from Marymount Hospital. Dispatch notes indicated he was not wearing a helmet.

Garfield Heights Police Chief Robert Byrne said VanNostran was driving at a high rate of speed and rear-ended a vehicle which then struck another vehicle.

Officers found the motorcycle in the berm on the south side of the highway and later learned VanNostran was borrowing it from a friend.

Police identified the rest of the motorists/passengers involved in the three-vehicle accident; three people were taken to MetroHealth Medical Center and two more were taken to Marymount Hospital to be treated for minor injuries, according to Byrne. The Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner was called to further investigate.

The library's early literacy skill-building programs as well as its GED, adult basic literacy, tech training and job/career services will be convenient for families participating in the Centers' early learning facility.

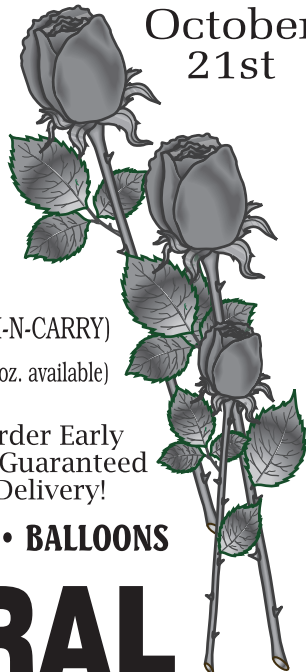

The Cleveland Opera will open its 22nd season with a series of free concerts that are open to the public. An opportunity to "Fall in Love" with The Cleveland Opera will be held Sunday, Oct. 22, at 3 p.m. at the Polish American Cultural Center, 6501 Lansing Ave. in Slavic Village.

The concert will open with the toast — "Brindisi" — from Verdi's La Traviata, followed by the most famous arias and duets of Violetta, Alfredo, and his father Giorgio Germont. Other beloved duets include that of Nedda and Silvio from "I Pagliacci" by Leoncavallo; the "Mimi-Rodolfo" duet from Act 1 of "La Bohème" by Puccini; and the duet from "The Pearl Fishers" by Bizet.

Lighter repertoire for this program will include selections from contemporary

American musicals sung in English. The featured artists are Dorota Sobieska, soprano; Kyle Kelvington, tenor; Jeremy Gilpatrick, baritone; and Jacek Sobieski, piano and music director.

The performance is free, but free-will donations will be gratefully accepted.

The "little opera company that could" was founded in 1995 as "Opera Circle" by husband and wife team Dorota Sobieska, executive artistic director, and Jacek Sobieski, music director. Since then, the company has grown significantly and has presented a full-scale production at Playhouse Square's Ohio Theatre annually since 2013.

Last year the company changed its name to The Cleveland Opera to properly reflect its preeminent

role in the region's cultural landscape. The Cleveland Opera continues the mission on which the company was founded - opening the magical world of opera to everyone by presenting both beloved and unknown masterpieces to help see the beauty within every person.

Gun buy back event this Saturday in Cleveland

Cleveland Mayor Frank G. Jackson and Chief of Police Calvin D. Williams urge Clevelanders to participate in the 2017 City of Cleveland Gun Buy Back event being held this Saturday, Oct. 21, beginning at 9 a.m. at the Third District Headquarters, 4501 Chester Ave., Cleveland.

In exchange for operable handguns or semiautomatic weapons, citizens will be given either a gas or food gift card valued at \$100 (handguns) or \$200

(semi-automatic weapons). Cleveland Police have partnered with the Cleveland Police Foundation, ArcelorMittal and Burt Saltzman, owner of Dave's Supermarkets, to organize this year's Gun Buy-Back.

How to participate:

1. Bring a working handgun or semi-automatic rifle to the Third District Headquarters.
2. The weapon must be unloaded, in a clear plastic bag, and inside a second

container (gym bag, backpack, etc.).

3. Transport the unloaded and properly bagged weapon locked in the trunk of your vehicle.

4. Pack ammunition separately. Non semi-automatic rifles and shotguns can be turned in but NO incentive will be given for these weapons.

5. A Cleveland Police Officer will inspect the weapon to ensure that it is operable.

6. After the officer determines that the weapon is operable a \$100 gift card will be given to those who turn in a handgun and a \$200 gift card to those who turn in a semi-automatic rifle.

"The Gun Buy Back is an event which we look forward to participating in every year because this program saves lives," said Chief Williams. "We are fortunate to have the sponsorship provided by the Cleveland Police Foundation, ArcelorMittal, Dave's Supermarkets, True North and Target. Without their backing, this would not be possible."

Mike Madar, vice president and general manager, ArcelorMittal Cleveland, said his company will melt down the weapons collected in the gun buy-back and recycle them into new steel.
