Bearcats, Redskins make Friday's regional quarterfinal playoff games

Following the conclusion of the football regular-season last Saturday night, the Ohio High School Athletic Association released its final computer ratings and regional quarterfinal playoff pairings last Sunday. Athletes from Bedford and Cuyahoga Heights will play in the quarterfinals.

The Division II Bedford Bearcats (9-1) will play Eastlake North (6-4) on Friday, Nov. 3, at 7:30 p.m. at Bedford stadium. The Division VII Cuyahoga Heights Redskins (8-1) will play Warren John F. Kennedy (4-6) on Friday, Nov. 3, 7:30 p.m., at Cuyahoga Heights.

Cuyahoga Heights game will be available for purchase in the high school's athletic office on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday this week from 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tickets are \$8 for students and adults in advance; \$9 at the gate starting at 6 p.m. Friday. Proposed Tax Levy (renewal): A renewal of a tax for the benefit of the City of Maple Heights for the purpose of the payment of salaries of permanent police personnel, and to provide and maintain motor vehicles, communications and other equipment used directly in the operation of the Division of Police at a rate not to exceed 2 mills

for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to 20 cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for five years, commencing in 2018, first due in calendar year 2019.

Proposed Tax Levy (renewal): A renewal of a tax for the benefit of the City of Maple Heights for the purpose of the payment of salaries for fire fighters in the Division of Fire and providing, maintaining and operating fire apparatus, appliances, buildings and sites at a rate not exceeding 2 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to 20 cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation, commencing in 2018, first due in calendar year 2019.

Proposed Charter Amendment: Shall Article XV, Section 2 of the Charter of the City of Maple Heights be amended to give the authority to the Civil Service Commission to determine whether competitive written examinations for lateral entry transfers of police and fire cadets into employment are appropriate or necessary?

Proposed Charter Amendment: Shall Article XV, Section 3 of the Charter of the City of Maple Heights be amended to provide that the city's Civil Service rules, regulations, orders or decisions prevail over conflicting State law provisions?

Cuyahoga County

Proposed Tax Levy (renewal): A renewal of a tax

for the benefit of the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority for the purpose of providing funds necessary for the Port Authority at a rate not exceeding 0.13 mill for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to 1.3 cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for five years, commencing in 2018, first due in calendar year 2019.

Proposed Bond Issue: Shall bonds be issued by the Cuyahoga Community College District for the purpose of paying the costs of acquiring, constructing, furnishing and equipping the capital facilities, or such other acquisition of sites, erection, furnishing and equipping of buildings, or acquisition, construction or improvement of property in the principal amount of \$227,500,000, to be repaid annually over a maximum period of 25 years, and an annual levy of property taxes be made outside of the ten-mill limitation, estimated by the County Fiscal Officer to average over the repayment period of the bond issue 0.5 mill for each one dollar of tax valuation, which amounts to 5 cents for each one hundred dollars of tax valuation, commencing in 2017, first due in calendar year 2018, to pay the annual debt charges on the bonds and to pay debt charge on any notes issued in anticipation of those bonds?

State Issues

Two Ohio state-wide issues will be on the November 7th ballot, one involving rights for crime victims and the other addressing prescription drug pricing.

Issue 1: Rights for Crime Victims, Proposed Constitutional Amendment, Proposed by Initiative Petition

To repeal and replace the existing language in Section 10a of Article I of the Constitution of the State of Ohio. A majority yes vote is necessary for the amendment to pass. The proposed amendment would expand the rights of victims under the current Section 10a and require that the rights of victims be protected as vigorously as the rights of the accused. More specifically, for the purpose of ensuring due process, respect, fairness, and justice for crime victims and their families in the criminal and juvenile justice systems, the amendment would provide victims with:

- the right to privacy and to be treated with respect, fairness, and dignity;
- the right to information about the rights and services available to crime victims;
- the right to notification in a timely manner of all proceedings in the case;
- the right to be present and heard at all court proceedings, including the

right to petition the court to protect the victim's rights;

• the right to a prompt conclusion of the case;

• to refuse discovery requests made by the accused, except as authorized by Article I, Section 10 of the Ohio constitution;

• the right to reasonable protection from the accused;

• the right to notice of the release or escape of the accused; and

• the right to restitution.

The proposed amendment would not establish a cause of action for damages or compensation against the state or any political subdivision.

If approved, the amendment will be effective 90 days after the election.

Issue 2: To require state agencies to not pay more for prescription drugs than the federal Department of Veterans Affairs and require state payment of attorney fees and expenses to specific individuals for defense of the law. Proposed Law, Proposed by Initiative Petition

To enact Chapter 194 of the Ohio Revised Code. A majority yes vote is necessary for the law to pass. To enact Chapter 194 of the Ohio Revised Code, which would:

- Require the State of Ohio, including its state departments, agencies and entities, to not pay more for prescription drugs than

the price paid by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

- Establish that the individual petitioners responsible for proposing the law have a direct and personal stake in defending the law; require the State to pay petitioners' reasonable at-

torney fees and other expenses; require the petitioners to pay \$10,000 to the State if the law is held by a court to be unenforceable and limit petitioners' personal liability to that amount; and require the Attorney General to defend the law if challenged in court.

- 4-5 (6-7 oz.) bone-in, skin on chicken thighs
- 4 Tbsp. olive oil, divided
- 1½ Tbsp. red wine vinegar
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 Tbsp. each minced fresh thyme, sage and rosemary, plus more for serving
- Salt and ground black pepper
- 1 large sweet potato (peeled if desired), chopped into ¾-inch cubes
- 1 lb. Brussels sprouts, sliced into halves
- 2 fuji apples, cored and sliced into half moons about ¾-inch thick
- 2 shallot bulbs, peeled and sliced about ¼-inch thick
- 4 slices hickory smoked bacon, chopped into 1-inch pieces

Preheat oven to 450°. Pour 2 Tbsp. olive oil, red wine vinegar, garlic and herbs into a gallon size resealable bag, add chicken, season with salt and pepper then seal bag and massage mixture over chicken while working to evenly distribute herbs. Set aside and let rest while chopping veggies.

Place sweet potato, Brussels sprouts, apples and shallot on a large rimmed baking sheet. Drizzle with remaining 2 Tbsp. olive oil then toss to evenly coat and season with salt and pepper to taste. Spread into an even layer then set chicken over veggie/fruit mixture. Sprinkle bacon (separate any pieces that stick together) evenly over veggie/fruit mixture. Roast in preheated oven until chicken and veggies are golden brown, about 30 minutes (chicken should register 165 in center). Broil during last few minutes for a more golden skin on chicken if desired. Sprinkle with more herbs and serve immediately.

Spiced Pumpkin Raisin Cookies

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 2/3 cup old-fashioned oats
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- ½ tsp. baking soda
- ½ tsp. fine salt
- ¼ tsp. ground allspice
- ¾ cup raw sugar, plus additional for sprinkling
- ½ cup pumpkin puree, (canned)
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1 Tbsp. pure maple syrup
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- ½ cup raisins

Position a rack in the center of the oven and preheat to 350°. Line two heavy large baking sheets with parchment paper.

In a medium bowl, combine the flour, oats, cinnamon, baking soda, salt and allspice. Stir to blend well. In a large bowl, combine the sugar, pumpkin puree, oil, syrup and vanilla; whisk to blend. Using a flexible rubber spatula, gradually stir the dry ingredients into the pumpkin mixture. Stir in the raisins.

For each cookie, drop one generous tablespoon of batter onto the prepared baking sheet, spacing the mounds about one inch apart (or use a mini ice cream scoop). Using moistened fingertips, flatten each to a 2-inch-diameter round. Sprinkle each cookie with a bit more raw sugar.

Bake the cookies until brown and a bit firm to the touch, 17 to 20 minutes. Using a metal spatula, transfer the cookies to a rack and cool completely.

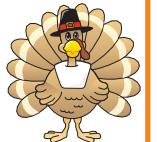

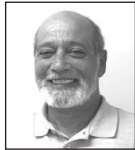
