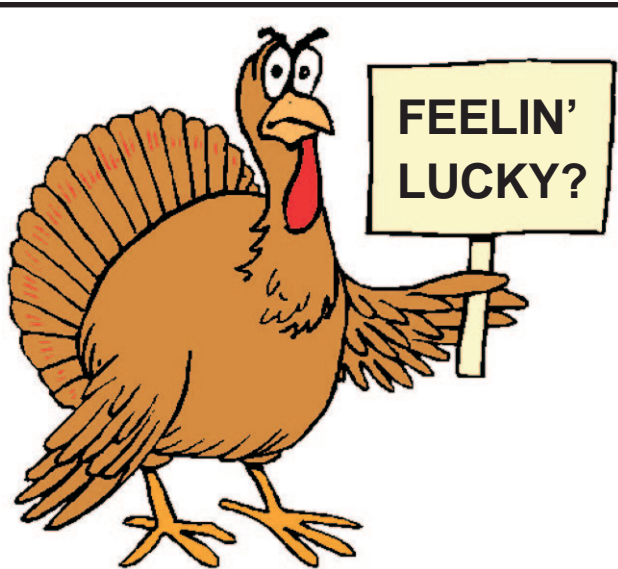

US Bank in Garfield Hts. robbed again; suspect at large

The US Bank at 5007 Turney Rd. in Garfield Heights was robbed Monday afternoon according to Cleveland FBI Special Agent Vicki Anderson. This is the third time the bank has been robbed this year which brings the total to 11 bank robberies in Garfield Heights since January.

Around 12:20 p.m., a man in his 40s, wearing a tan coat, gloves, light-colored scarf covering everything but his eyes and a fishing hat went into the bank and presented a note indicating a bank robbery to the teller, according to Anderson.

Sgt. Todd Cramer said the note demanded money or he would kill the teller. After receiving an undisclosed amount of money, the male fled northbound on Turney Rd. on foot, Cramer said.

A weapon was not seen and no physical injuries were reported.

MHPD investigating Stafford Park homicide

Maple Heights Police need help in identifying a gunshot victim they found dead in Stafford Park yesterday morning, according to a press release from MHPD Lt. Joseph Mocsiran.

Just before 2:30 a.m., the Maple Heights Police Department received a call about a male on the ground in Stafford Park. Officers responded and found a young man in the park who was deceased and had a gunshot wound, according to Mocsiran. MHPD Detectives and the Bureau of Criminal Investigation are investigating the case.

The victim has not been identified. He is a young adult, African American male, with a slim build, facial hair and close-cut hair. He was wearing beige pants, a white t-shirt, and a blue hoodie zip-up jacket under a blue nylon jacket. The male had on camouflage tennis shoes. He appeared to be about 5'10" to 6' tall.

The Maple Heights Police Department is requesting assistance in identifying the male and any information to assist in the investigation.

Energy assistance programs offered to Cuyahoga County residents

The Ohio Department of Development (ODOD) offers several programs to help low-income eligible homeowners and renters pay their utility bills and improve the energy efficiency of their homes. The County Fiscal Officer's Community Service Department offers assistance in processing the applications for the following programs:

- Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP), a federally funded program designed to help meet the high cost of home heating. Open enrollment for HEAP started August 1st thru May 31st.

- Home Weatherization Assistance Program (HWAP), a federally funded, low income residential energy efficiency program. This program can save energy, cut your gas and electric bills and make your home more comfortable. If you qualify for this program, you could receive the following services at no cost: Furnace

tune-ups, clean and check; minor repair of windows, doors and weather-stripping; attic and sidewall insulation; hot water tank insulation.

- Winter Crisis Program (WCP), a special component of the HEAP emergency home energy assistance program (E-Heap) the E-Heap is administered by local agencies. This program provides assistance once per heating season to eligible households.

- Summer Crisis Program (SCP), the low-income home energy assistance program (LIHEAP) - summer crisis program. The program is designed to help qualified households pay for summer cooling.

- Percentage of Income Payment Plans (PIPP), an extended payment arrangement that requires regulated gas and electric companies to accept payments based on a percentage of the household income. You must re-certify yearly for this program.

Applications are available in the Community Service Department.

Homeowners and renters who participate in HEAP, PIPP, receive Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), or receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) automatically qualify.

Other homeowners and renters can qualify for the program based on the following income limits: The total household income of an applicant must be at or below 200 percent of the Federal Fiscal Year. Visit energyhelp.ohio.gov for a list of all included and excluded income.

Renters who receive HEAP, PIPP, TANF, SSI or meet the income limits are eligible to apply.

Your landlord must sign an agreement and pay a small contribution toward the cost of services. (Landlord contribution is greater if heat is included in the rent or extensive heating work is needed). Landlords who meet the income limits themselves may have their contributions waived.

A household applying for HEAP must report total gross household income for the past 12 months for all members, except wage or salary income earned by dependent minors under 18 years old. Both homeowners and renters are eligible for assistance.



MHHS assistant coach arrested in Bedford

Bedford police arrested Marcus Pearl, an assistant basketball coach and para-professional at Maple Heights High School, after he crashed his car into a tree on Natalie Road in Bedford on October 21st. According to a Bedford police report, marijuana and a gun were found inside the car.

Pearl admitted to being distracted while driving which resulted in the crash, according to the report. Police found a bookbag in the back seat containing numerous clear sandwich bags, two of which contained a small amount of loose marijuana. A black Fuzion scale was also found.

Pearl was charged with improper handling of a firearm in a motor vehicle, possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia, and was issued a citation for driving under suspension and reasonable control, according to the police report.

It was stated in the police report that the city of

Bedford is requesting restitution from Pearl for \$775.99 for the removal of the damaged tree and the planting of a new one.

Pearl's preliminary hearing in Bedford Municipal Court is set for November 13th. Superintendent of Maple Heights City Schools Charlie Keenan said Pearl is on paid leave while following due process and is not currently working or coaching at the school.

Garfield Hts. Council notes

A special meeting of Garfield Heights Council was held Monday evening to consider an emergency ordinance involving tax incentives for OverDrive Inc.'s expansion.

OverDrive's Blue Sky Campus, Inc. in Garfield Heights intends to construct an addition to the existing office building as well as add additional parking spaces "provided that the appropriate develop-

ment incentives are available to support the economic viability of said Project," according to the legislation.

The ordinance, which was passed on first reading by council Monday night and will be considered for final passage at a future meeting, directs the mayor to execute a "Community Investment Area" agreement between the city and Blue Sky Campus, Inc. and OverDrive to provide incentives for the construction of an addition to the existing building.

The next regular meeting of Garfield Heights Council is scheduled for Monday, Nov. 13.

New tool helps keep drug court participants on road to recovery

Ohio courts overseeing individuals struggling with drug addiction now have access to an additional tool to ensure they comply with court ordered treatment. The State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy announced that drug court programs have access to the state's prescription drug monitoring program, known as the Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System (OARRS), to provide judges and court personnel with critical information regarding a participant's use of controlled substance medications.

"The use of OARRS by Ohio drug courts gives judges and staff additional monitoring capability that contributes to their effectiveness in helping participants change their behavior," said State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy Executive Director Steven W. Schierholt.

Data from the state's prescription drug monitoring program is an invaluable resource for prescribers,

pharmacists, and law enforcement. For courts in Ohio to take full advantage of this tool, the Board of Pharmacy worked with Governor John Kasich, the Supreme Court of Ohio and the Ohio General Assembly to provide access through the most recent state budget. Access to OARRS is granted to drug courts certified by the Supreme Court of Ohio and other specialized dockets treating individuals for substance use disorders such as those relating to mental health, veterans and human trafficking.

"Judges who preside over specialized dockets will now have an additional means of verifying that those in court ordered treatment are complying with treatment as they navigate the difficult road to recovery," said Ohio Supreme Court Chief Justice Maureen O'Connor.

Established in 2006, OARRS is a statewide database that collects information on all prescriptions for

controlled substances that are dispensed by pharmacies or furnished by prescribers in Ohio.

To assist judges and court personnel with using the system, the Board of Pharmacy has developed a training guide that can be accessed by visiting: www.pharmacy.ohio.gov/drugcourt.

United States Army & Air Force Veteran, Vietnam War

John A. Evans, Sr., 81, of Cleveland, served in the U.S. Air Force and U.S. Army in the Vietnam War. John is a life member of the American Legion, AMVETS, Disabled American Veterans and the VFW. John served the American Legion 13th District as a Service Officer, chairman of the Gifts for the Yanks Program and chairman of the Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation Committee. After his military career, John experienced firsthand the unfavorable welcome home as a Vietnam veteran. He promised himself then that when he had more time, he would make sure he would do whatever he could to support all veterans. In 1992, upon retirement from a 16-year career with the Federal Aviation Administration, John began volunteering at the Louis Stokes Cleveland VA Medical Center and is presently serving as the American Legion VA Voluntary Services Deputy-Representative. In 2016, John received the Cleveland VA Medical Center Volunteer of the Year/You Make a Difference Award and the VA Voluntary Services Superior Service Award for 17,500 volunteer hours. One of John's first assignments as a VA volunteer was in the Cleveland VA Medical Center's Day Hospital for seriously mentally ill veterans. John is a champion for fellow veterans and his continued support and advocacy ensures these veterans have everything they need to engage successfully in their treatment and recovery.

Richard L. DeChant Jr.

United States Coast Guard Veteran, Operation Desert Shield/ Operation Desert Storm, Operation Iraqi Freedom

Richard DeChant, Jr., 61, of Fairview Park in Cuyahoga County, served in the U.S. Coast Guard including tours in the Gulf War and Operation Iraqi Freedom. Richard is the executive director of the Veterans' Initiative for Cuyahoga Community College. Under his leadership, the College was recognized as a Military Friendly Institution in 2017, marking eight consecutive years with this distinction. He was chair of a White House Council on Strong Cities/Strong Communities seeking best practices in developing a seamless transition for veterans looking for employment and employers looking for veterans. During his tenure with the TSA Operations for Northeast Ohio, he received both the Department Homeland Security Heroism Award and the Cleveland Police Department 2006 Citizen Heroism Award for helping to subdue an armed gunman at Cleveland Hopkins Airport. He is the co-chair of the Northeast Ohio Veterans Community Task Force, focusing on leveraging VA resources. He also is active in the Greater Cleveland Fisher House, the Ohio Values Veterans Military Committee and Hospice of the Western Reserve among many other organizations. He co-authored Ohio House Bill 488, which requires all state colleges to establish veteran service offices and review military training for college credit. He also helped create national legislation that established the first standard Military Training Transcript for use by colleges through the 2012 Defense Re-Authorization Act.

The Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame was established in 1992 by former Gov. George Voinovich to recognize outstanding professional achievement, service to the community and selfless acts of veterans following their military service.

Holly S. Koester

United States Army Veteran, Cold War Era

Holly Koester, 57, of Walton Hills in Cuyahoga County, served in the U.S. Army from 1981 to 1991 until she was injured. A 2006 graduate of Cleveland State University, Holly is a substitute teacher for grades K-8.

In 1996, she started racing in marathons, displaying her amazingly competitive spirit. In fact, she is the first person to complete a marathon in all 50 United States in a wheelchair. In 2017, the National PVA honored Holly with the Speedy Award, the highest honor that the group bestows. Holly is involved in local organizations including the Heritage Congregational Church and Berea Millstream Quilters, making children's charity quilts and veterans' valor quilts. In 2013, NASCAR driver Sam Schmidt presented Holly with the Spirit of Ability Award by Braun Mobility.

She is a peer counselor for newly injured spinal cord veterans at the Cleveland VA and a motivational speaker who has addressed veterans' organizations, school groups and attendees at Memorial Day and Veterans Day ceremonies.

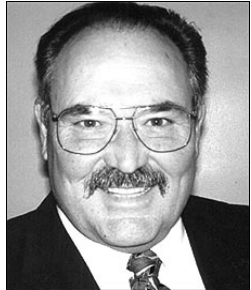

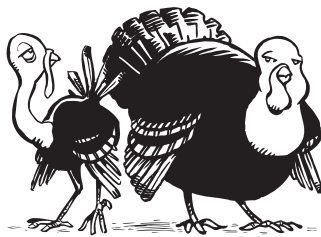

Maple Heights gets grant funding to aid new businesses

Small businesses in Maple Heights that want to create jobs will benefit from grant funding awarded to the city, after council passed an ordinance to accept the Cuyahoga County SBA Small Business Performance Grant at its meeting last week.

The city has set aside \$50,000 to start and finance the program, and the fund and the county will provide up to \$150,000 in matching funds to further assist the grant program, according to the agreement between Maple Heights and the Cuyahoga County Department of Development.

Passage of the legislation will enable the city to enter into an agreement with the county to implement the grant program "to provide performance grants to qualifying small businesses in the city in the form of forgivable loans."

The county established the grant program "to assist small businesses in the county by providing sources of capital that help those businesses grow and create jobs," the ordinance states.

Council's passage of the ordinance also allows Finance Director Tracy Smith to establish a Maple Heights-Cuyahoga County Credit Enhancement Fund in the amount of \$50,000, "to provide the capital necessary to make the performance grants to qualifying small businesses through the program."

The agreement is effective for two years from the date of authorization, according to information provided by the city.

Economic development ordinance on first reading

Also addressing the encouragement of potential economic growth in Maple Heights, council placed a resolution on first reading to amend a previous contract with inSITE Advisory Group, LLC, to perform economic development services for the city.

In March 2017, council retained inSITE to perform these services at an hourly rate of \$175, "in an amount not to exceed \$17,500... since then, inSITE has worked tirelessly to perform economic development initiatives

as directed by the city administration," the legislation states.

Initiatives performed by inSITE, according to the legislation, have included "marketing development property; compiling property reports containing the city's demographics, site plans and incentives, preparing a RFI [request for information] for light industrial buildings for sale in the city, identifying and securing grants, and conducting business retention meetings and expansion visits."

The resolution states that inSITE has reached the maximum allowed amount of \$17,500. If approved at a future meeting, the resolution will amend the previous legislation, allowing payment to inSITE for services rendered at the same rate of \$175 an hour, in a total amount not to exceed \$32,500.

Increased salt dome costs approved

After two previous resolutions addressing the costs of a salt dome being constructed for the city, council approved a third piece of legislation authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell to enter into a second amendment to the Community Cost Share agreement with the NEORS (Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District), after the project cost exceeded the total amount of \$135,000 in awarded program funds.

The NEORS provides funding to member communities for community specific storm water management projects under the Community Cost Share program. City Engineer Ed Hren was informed by the NEORS that the construction of a new salt storage facility "would effectively serve as a Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping Best Management Practice and thus qualify as a storm water management project," making it eligible for the funding.

Hren was successful in applying for NEORS funds in

the amount of \$109,467 last year, and the city accepted bids for construction. However, the winning bidder defaulted, requiring Hren to re-advertise for bids for the project. In the process of preparing the plans and specs for the rebid, Hren determined that concrete floors were necessary to better manage the salt dome facility, according to the legislation. This resulted in an additional cost not to exceed \$25,533.

The salt dome has been completed, but Hren and Smith determined that the total amount of eligible construction and engineering costs associated with the project exceeded the total amount of \$135,000 in the awarded funds.

Therefore, the NEORS agreed to a second amendment to the agreement to include the eligible construction and engineering costs, and allocate an additional \$13,500 for the added work. This brings the total cost of the project to \$148,500, as covered by the NEORS funds, the resolution stated.

Unclaimed funds ordinance on second reading

Placed on second reading was legislation amending the codified ordinances of the city, enacting a new section relating to the establishment of an unclaimed monies fund.

If approved at a future meeting, unclaimed money will be deposited in the Unclaimed Monies Fund and will be retained in that fund until it is claimed by its lawful owner, the ordinance states.

Withdrawn from the agenda by Councilman Stafford Shennett was a resolution declaring a property on Dunham Road to be a structural and maintenance nuisance property, after city officials had discussions with the property owner, Council Clerk Leonette Cicirella stated.

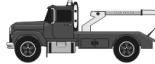

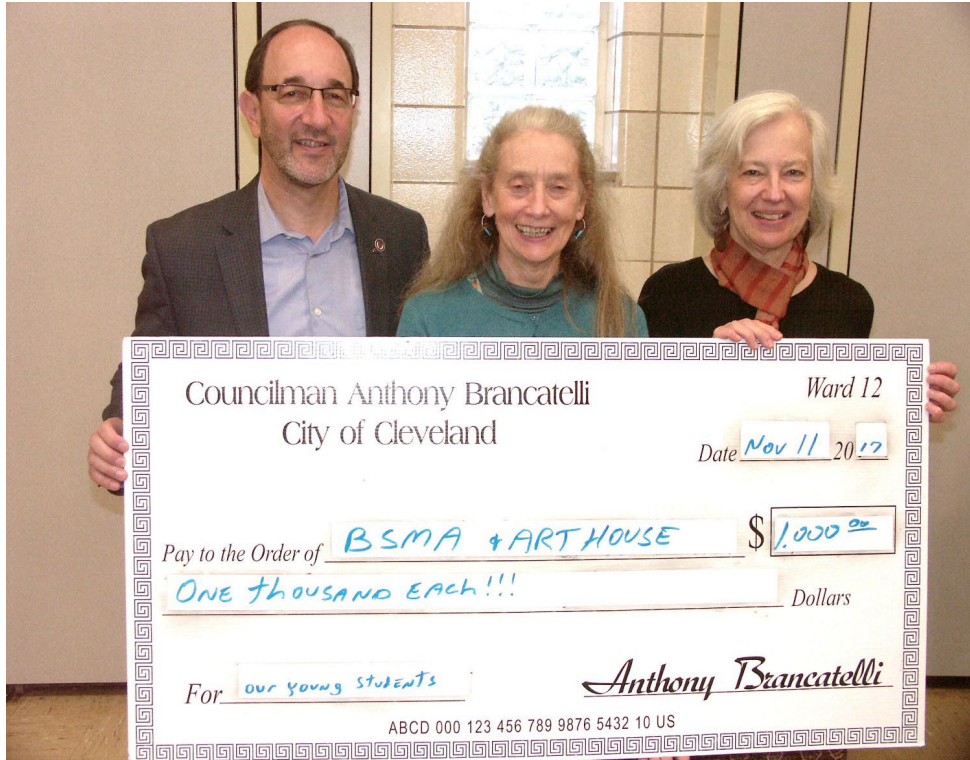
