## Armed robbery at Sunoco Bedford tree lighting next Wednesday

Employees of the Sunoco gas station at 6009 Turney Rd. in Garfield Heights told police the store was robbed at gunpoint around 1:30 a.m. last Friday, according to a Garfield Heights police report.

Employees said two males came into the store around 1:30 a.m. One of the males jumped over the counter, held a gun to their faces and demanded all the money from the register while telling them to "hurry up," according to the report. The employees complied and the suspects fled on foot.

One of the employees told police he followed the suspects outside and saw them fleeing on foot. He said he pulled out his gun and fired several rounds into the air in an attempt to scare the robbers as they ran across the parking lot towards Rockside Road.

Police watched security camera footage which matched the events described by the employees. However, officers said the employee who had fired his gun did so in the direction of the males, not into the air, according to the report.

Police confiscated the employee's gun and collected three spent shell casings in the area as evidence. Officers said a bullet went through the window of a home in the 12800 block of Rockside Road but no one was injured. The man was issued a summons for discharging a firearm within city limits.

Officers searched the area for the suspects with negative results. Police continue to investigate.

## 2017 November election recap Brancatelli wins big in Cleveland's Ward 12

Cleveland Ward 12 Councilman Tony Brancatelli soundly defeated opponent Shalira Taylor in his bid for re-election last week in the Tuesday, November 7th general election.

Brancatelli has been a member of Cleveland City Council since 2005, representing Slavic Village and parts of the Tremont, Brooklyn Center and Old Brooklyn neighborhoods. Over the last decade, the councilman has been a leader in the fight against urban blight brought on by a national foreclosure crisis and followed by a global recession.

"I am honored to be overwhelmingly elected to another term," he said.

"We are making great strides in our city and our neighborhoods and there is much more work to do," he continued. "I look forward to the next four years as your councilman."

Kevin Bishop soundly defeated challenger Geoff

Fitch in the Ward 2 race, a seat formerly held by mayoral hopeful Zack Reed, who lost to Mayor Frank Jackson, who sailed to an unprecedented fourth term.

In Ward 5, incumbent Phyllis Cleveland won big over opponent Richard Starr.

### Garfield Heights

There were only two contested council races in Garfield Heights, as five of the seven members, along with Mayor Vic Collova, ran unopposed.

Incumbents Joe LaMalfa in Ward 2 and Eugene Glenn in Ward 4 faced challengers, but both were returned to their council seats by voters.

"I want to thank all the voters who came to the polls," Glenn said. "And all the campaign workers who stood out in the cold and got the job done. I feel from the exit poll questions we had that many homeowners came out and voted against higher taxes and wanted an experienced councilperson on the job."

Joe LaMalfa also thanked the residents of Ward 2 for returning him to council. "I'm going to continue working hard to keep the city moving forward," he stated.

Winning by a more than two-to-one margin was a zoning amendment to change portions of McCracken Road from single family residential to industrial park.

### Bedford

In contested council races in Bedford, Victor Fluharty came out on top in Ward 3, and Heather Rhoades in Ward 5.

"I want to thank the people

of Ward 3 for their support and votes," Fluharty said. "For the residents in Ward 3 that did not vote for me, I will work very hard to earn your support and to make our ward stronger and be everyone's voice and make a difference. Rhoades commented, "I would like to thank everyone who supported me both inside and outside Ward 5 during my campaign. My first priorities as a council member for the city of Bedford and Ward 5 is to start improving the communication between the city and its residents, working on getting a Main Street program launched so that we can revitalize our downtown area and helping the city create a comprehensive marketing plan so that we can start to show the surrounding communities that Bedford is a great place to live and to have a business."

Elected to the Bedford Board of Education were Robert C. Kennedy, Phil Stevens and Tim Tench.

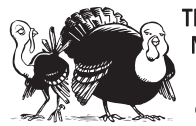

derstand what goes into that event the following day, so they will have their crews out there."

Mayor Stan Koci added, "We're going to be encouraging all our local businesses to be open and lit up on that morning. Some businesses downtown don't open up until noon; we'll contact all those individuals and remind them to keep their lights on so downtown looks really nice. It's a good thing."

Koci also mentioned that Bedford native Tim Taylor, a former newscaster at FOX-8, would be doing a "This is My Hometown" piece for the channel.

Also regarding the upcoming season, the annual Holiday Lighting Ceremony will be held in Bedford's Public Square at 6 p.m. sharp on Wednesday, Nov. 22, to kick off the holidays in the city, Mallis noted.

## Break-ins update

Addressing the recent increase in car break-ins reported in the city of Bedford and the surrounding area, Mallis said, "We did have break-ins again with vehicles and I can tell you that with the police we've worked to establish an additional unit in the evenings. And we have some patrols going on."

"We are going to get them," Mallis continued, "and we do have suspects in mind." He said the suspects travel on foot and there is more than one of them.

"So if you notice individuals walking down the street, if you come home late and see these individuals, please give us a call. It doesn't hurt. We'll get out there and we'll check," he said.

## Police, fireman honored, Eagles thanked

Police officer Ben Lang was honored as the Officer of the Year and Firefighter Chris Novak was honored as the Firefighter of the Year recently, Mallis said. He also thanked the Bedford Eagles for their generous donations to the city.

The Eagles contributed \$5,000 apiece to each of the city's safety forces for a total of \$15,000, Mallis stated, adding that the donations had been used for training equipment, vests and "a wide range of items... it's a great partnership and I want to thank them."

The Eagles also donated towards the Historical Society and the Food Bank, he said.

Councilman Donald Saunders mentioned that the Eagles Auxiliary also made contributions in the amount of \$500 apiece to the safety forces.

## Legislation

Council passed an ordinance to make additional appropriations needed because of changes to the budget for this year, Finance Director Frank Gambosi stated.

He said that an additional \$10,000 clothing allowance was needed for new officers; \$5,000 in building department overtime; \$7,000 for the new recreation department director and assistant director for the last quarter of this year; \$19,635 for a new employee in the economic development department; \$3,000 for finance department separation pay/overtime in the office and \$1,500 in Workers Comp costs; \$3,000 for the tax department due to one less employee and \$10,000 for costs of outside contracting of invoicing and postage; and \$15,000 for law department costs related to legal disputes and contracted out legal projects.

Fund balances were also adjusted, Gambosi stated, to account for the Broadway Park construction and to use Neighborhood Services Program Income Funds and to budget for demolition of 38 Gould; \$28,000 for separation pay for Service Department roof replacement; \$8,000 for Drug Prevention Equipment costs; \$10,260 to account for a Worker's Comp grant to buy firefighter gloves and boots (grant \$8,550/city match \$1,710); \$45 Juvenile Diversion fee; overtime for fire medics; \$12,000 and \$25,000 front funds for Dominion for Sunoco Union/Northfield storm sewer; for meter replacement costs as borrowed with bonds; and for costs of electricity bills.

An amended ordinance was passed to raise the fee from \$10 to \$40 on individuals and entities who request that the city research whether assessments exist on properties located in Bedford.

Also approved was an ordinance to rezone 46 Center Rd. from business to residential classification, and a contract with Nicks Tree Service Division to perform removal of trees too large for city crews to handle, at a cost of \$17,575.

Council moved to approve the following recommendations of the Planning Commission:

- Conditional use approval for architect James Gerald of Pittsburgh, for proposed tenant Ronald Flauto, M.D.,

of Akron, for a renal dialysis clinic located in the former TJ Maxx property at 22101 Rockside Rd.

- Approval for use of existing tenant space (Dairy Queen) 397-405 Broadway Ave., by owner, Ahuja Commercial of Solon, which is proposing to subdivide the space and renovate the front of the building to include an additional storefront.

## Zarlino remembered

Former Councilman Joe Zarlino, who served on city council for 15 years and started the city's Food Bank program, was honored with a moment of silence at the meeting after passing away recently at the age of 88.

Zarlino was remembered fondly by city officials, who recalled him as being "a character" with a colorful personality, sharp intelligence and lively sense of humor, who loved his city and its residents.

## G.H. Municipal Court again offers '2nd Chance' program

Persons with warrants out for their arrest are getting a second chance to do right by the law. The Garfield Heights Municipal Court will again offer its "2nd Chance" program to allow people to pay outstanding balances without further legal action or extra fees.

The "2nd Chance" program applies to anyone who has not paid fines and court costs from a criminal or traffic case. "At any given time, we have between 8,000 and 10,000 outstanding warrants for people's arrest, and many of those are because people did not

come back to court for hearings on their fines and costs," Garfield Heights Municipal Court Judge Deborah Nicastro said.

Along with an arrest warrant issued, the person's driver's license is suspended. These outstanding cases are also sent to a collection agency that adds an additional 30% charge to the outstanding balance.

The "2nd Chance" program allows the person to pay the court in full without penalty. The \$100 warrant cost and the collection agency added fees are removed. "By law, we can't suspend the fines, but we can suspend these additional costs," Judge

Nicastro added.

Paying the court also means the person will again have a valid driver's license and avoid being charged with driving under suspension.

Payment can be made in person or by phone to the Garfield Heights Municipal Court cashier, Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. One can also pay online at ghmc.org. The court accepts cash or credit cards. A 3% convenience fee is added to all credit card payments. There is no need to go before the judge again or incur any additional court costs. ## Claims now accepted for \$586 million Western Union Fund for fraud victims

Ohio Attorney General Mike DeWine recently announced that Ohioans who sent money to scammers using Western Union's wire service may now apply for compensation from a \$586 million fund held by the U.S. Department of Justice's victim asset recovery program.

The fund is related to a multistate settlement Attorney General DeWine announced in January.

Consumers may be eligible to receive compensation if they sent a fraud-induced wire transfer through Western Union between January 1, 2004 and January 19, 2017.

"It's not often that scam victims have a chance to recover some of their money, so we want people to know about this opportunity," DeWine said. "If you think you're eligible, file a claim."

A settlement administrator is sending claim forms to over 500,000 consumers. Ohioans may receive a form in the mail if they reported to Western Union or to the Ohio Attorney General's Office that they had been the victim of a scam using Western Union. The form will contain instructions on how to file a claim.

Completed claim forms must be submitted online or mailed back to the settlement administrator by February 12, 2018.

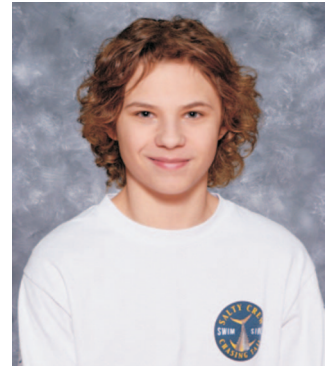

Preheat oven to 325°. Pull the neck and giblets out of the cavity; throw away the liver and save the rest of the giblets for gravy. Dry the turkey with paper towels, then season inside and out with salt and pepper. Fill the turkey with aromatics like chopped onions, carrots, apples and herbs, then place breast-side up in a roasting pan and brush with melted butter. Tent with foil and roast for 2 hours (for a 10- to 12-pound turkey; add an extra 15 minutes per pound for larger birds). Remove the foil, baste with more melted butter and turn the oven up to 425°. Roast for another hour or until the meat at the thigh registers 165°. Let rest before serving.

- 1 small Granny Smith apple, cored and sliced into 8 (1/2-inch) slices
- 1 (8 oz.) can Pillsbury original crescent rolls

Preheat oven to 375°. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. In a small bowl, combine brown sugar and apple pie spice. Set aside. Melt butter and toss apple slices in butter, set aside.

Arrange crescent roll triangles on baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Evenly distribute brown sugar mixture onto each triangle. Sprinkle each triangle evenly with chopped pecans. Place an apple slice on the wide end of each triangle. Wrap crescent roll dough around each apple.

Brush each crescent roll with remaining butter. Sprinkle lightly with additional apple pie spice. Bake for 10-12 minutes, or until golden brown. Cool for 5 minutes before serving.

Collova, in his report to council, proudly stated that Garfield Heights had received a total of slightly over \$1 million in county demolition funds. Economic Development Director Noreen Kuban was thanked for her hard work in securing the funding.

The mayor also men-

tioned the amounts received for demolitions by neighboring municipalities, which amounted to far less than Garfield Heights received.

In other good news, Collova said the expansion at OverDrive in the city and the additional employees they are hiring will result in \$1.7 million in extra payroll for tax purposes for the city.

The following legislation was passed by council Monday night:

- An emergency ordinance to provide Blue Sky Campus, Inc. and OverDrive, Inc. with tax incentives for their expansion.

- An emergency ordinance to contract with the State Auditor's Office to provide the city "with basic general purpose external financial statements" for 2017, 2018 and 2019.

- Amendment of an ordinance to change the purchase of five 2017 vehicles for the police department

to 2018 vehicles.

- Renewal of an agreement with the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court to continue participating in the Cuyahoga County Community Diversion Program.

- An emergency resolution to apply for a grant through the Firehouse Subs Public

Safety Foundation to purchase two CPR units.

The next regular meeting of council is scheduled for Monday, Nov. 27.
