Cleveland police suspect homicide in the death of 88-year-old Vineyard Ave. resident Bruna Talani, according to Cleveland Public Information Officer Reginald Lanton

Officers were originally called to a home in the 7900 block of Vineyard Ave. for a well being check on December 16th, and learned that Talani had not been seen since December 9th. Police found the front door unlocked and upon entry, found the 88-year-old woman on the first floor, unresponsive, according to Lanton.

EMS arrived and pronounced the woman dead on arrival. The Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner will determine the official manner of death, according to Lanton.


Besides her years of service in council, Duszynski was also an interim mayor of the Village, was actively involved with the senior citizens organization, flower fund and recreation committees and "worked countless hours to maintain and excel the opportunities that our residents enjoyed," the proclamation said in part.

In legislative action, council approved the appointment of Angel Meriwether to the position of chief fiscal officer for the Village. Robert Unger will maintain a position as part-time council clerk.

The 2018 budget for Cuyahoga Heights was approved at a cost of \$11,600,000.

Passed was a contract with Fabrizi Trucking & Paving, Inc. to perform various services in connection with localized flooding at 811 Harvard Ave.

A resolution was okayed authorizing agreements necessary to acquire an access and utility easement over the rear portion of the property at 4661 E. 71 St., in order to perform sewer work.

Also authorized was an easement agreement with the city of Cleveland for Stage 1 of the Towpath Trail.

Council amended certain sections of the codified ordinances of the Village to modify the procedure for promotions in the police department, in some cases making interviews a part of the process as well as written examinations and allowing the mayor broader discretion in the selection of those eligible for promotion.

Also among other legislation passed was a contract for the purchase of property at 4585 E. 71 St., as well as three other parcels the Village is acquiring for future industrial development.

Footprints lead police to thief caught red-handed

Garfield Heights police arrested a 21-year-old male for theft last week after following a series of footprints he left in the snow. His prints led police right to him as he was rummaging through a car on Plymouth Ave., according to a Garfield Heights police report.

Police were originally called to the 5000 block of E. 114th St. on December 12th, around 4:25 a.m., and spoke to a woman who said her car door was open and items inside had been strewn about. She said nothing valuable appeared to be stolen.



Police followed fresh footprints in the snow from E. 114th, to Edgepark Dr., onto Plymouth Ave., then to Park Heights Ave., and began searching the area. Officers found a vehicle with its door open in the 11200 block of Park Heights; the owner was contacted and said nothing appeared to be missing.

Police followed further footprints to McCracken Rd., onto E. 104th St., then to E. 98th St. and onto Plymouth Ave. Vehicles in the 9700 and 9600 blocks of Plymouth Ave. had been broken into and rummaged through. In the snow, police saw the word "Jordan" in one of the

As they continued following the footprints, police found the 21-year-old rummaging through a car parked in a driveway in the 9500 block of Plymouth Ave. and he was immediately arrested. Police said he was wearing Jordan tennis shoes that matched the footprint left in

Police found a gun on the passenger seat of the vehicle the man was rummaging through. The owner of the vehicle said the gun was not his and it should not have been in his car. Police later learned the gun had been stolen from a car on Corridon Ave. in Maple Heights.

The 21-year-old was carrying a backpack that contained nearly \$40 in loose change, two bottles of prescription drugs that had been confirmed stolen from a vehicle and a brand new North Face jacket, also confirmed stolen from a car theft overnight.

The 21-year-old was arrested and held on investigation of receiving stolen property, possessing criminal tools, theft and vehicle trespassing.

Black Walnut Bread

2 cups all purpose flour 1 cup granulated sugar 1 cup black walnuts 1 cup buttermilk 3/4 tsp. baking soda ½ tsp. salt 1 egg

Adjust baking rack so it is in the center of your oven. Preheat oven to 350°. Grease and flour a loaf pan.

In a large bowl, whisk the flour, sugar, baking soda and salt together until they are well blended. Stir in the nuts, making sure that they are evenly distributed. In a small bowl, whisk together the buttermilk and egg. Slowly (a bit at a time) add the liquid to the dry ingredients until well mixed. Pour into pan and place on rack in the middle of the oven. Bake for one hour. Test to see if a toothpick comes out clean after one hour, if not, bake a few minutes longer, but do not over bake. Remove from oven and place on a cooling rack. As soon as possible, remove from pan and let cool. Place in a plastic bag and store for a day before serving. Bread will keep for a week in the refrigerator.

Symphony Brownies


1 (20 oz.) pkg. (family-sized) boxed brownie mix 2 king-sized almond-toffee Symphony brand candy bars (made by Hershey)

Prepare the brownie mix according to package directions. Line 9x9 inch cake pan with aluminum foil and spray with nonstick cooking spray. Spoon in half the brownie batter and smooth with a spatula. Break apart the candy bar into sections and space them out so they cover the surface of the brownie batter. Cover with remaining batter. Bake according to package directions, approximately 40 minutes. Let cool completely, then lift from pan using the edges of the foil.





U.S. Marshals say scammers may take advantage of holiday season to steal your money; urge reporting phone scams to FTC

The U.S. Marshals is alerting the public of several nationwide imposter scams involving individuals claiming to be U.S. marshals, court officers or other law enforcement officials. They are urging people to report the calls not only to their local U.S. Marshals Service office, but also to the Federal Trade Commission.

The FTC has the ability to detect patterns of fraud from the information collected and share that data with law enforcement

During these calls, scammers attempt to collect a fine in lieu of arrest for failing to report for jury duty or other offenses. They then tell victims they can avoid arrest by purchasing a prepaid debit card such as a Green Dot card or gift card and read the card number over the phone to satisfy the fine.

The U.S. Marshals would never ask for a credit/debit or gift card number, banking routing numbers, or ask for funds to be wired for any purpose," said U.S. Marshal Pete Elliott. "If the caller is urging you to provide this type of information or any other personal or financial information, hang up and report the call to the Marshals and the FTC. You can even report to both agencies anonymously.'

Scammers use many tactics to sound credible. They sometimes provide information like badge numbers, names of actual law enforcement officials and federal judges, owner said she locked her and courthouse addresses. They may also spoof their phone numbers to appear on caller ID as if they are calling from the court or a government agency.

> If a citizen receives a potential scam phone call, the U.S. Marshals office is urging the public to call the clerk of court's office of the U.S. District Court in your area and verify the court order. If an order does not exist, then it is likely the individual is being scammed.

> If you believe you were a victim of such a scam, you are encouraged to report the incident to your local U.S. Marshals Service office (https://www.usmarshals.gov/ news/phone_scam_alert.htm) and to the FTC (www.ftc.gov).

Things to remember:

- U.S. Marshals will never ask for credit/debit card/gift card numbers, wire transfers, or bank routing numbers for any purpose.
- Do not divulge personal or financial information to unknown callers.
- Report scam phone calls to your local U.S. Marshals Service office and to the FTC.
- •You can remain anonymous when you report.
- Authenticate the call by calling the clerk of the court's office of the U.S. District Court in your area and verify the court order given by the caller.
