## Moratorium on water bill rate hikes okayed by Bedford Council

Water bills for property owners in the city of Bedford will remain the same for this year, after council voted at its meeting last week to extend a one year moratorium on a three percent increase in water rates.

It was noted in the ordinance that the city of Cleveland "has waived any increase in water rates to the city of Bedford for the calendar year 2018... and the administration and council

desire to permit another one year moratorium on the increase... to assist residents in the current economic climate."

### New police officers sworn in

Councilwoman Paula Mizsak, acting in her capacity as vice mayor due to the excused absence of Mayor Stan Koci from the meeting, swore in three new officers to the city's police force, and council also approved three pieces of leg-

islation to buy new vehicles and equipment for the police department at last week's meeting.

Mizsak administered the oath to the city's newest patrol officers: Anthony Bucco, Nathan Viets and Brandon Thompson, fulfilling a promise made by city officials to add more police officers following the passage by voters of a .75 percent municipal income tax increase last year.

Police Chief Marty Stemple thanked council, the administration and the Civil Service Commission for making the hirings possible, and also thanked voters for passing the tax increase. "Be true to yourselves and always honor the badge," he told the new officers.

Council passed an ordinance authorizing City Manager Mike Mallis to enter into a contract with Lebanon Ford to purchase a 2018 Ford SUV Utility Interceptor police vehicle, at a cost of \$31,811, through the State Cooperative Purchasing Program.

## Teen sought in attempted murder case in Garfield Hts.

Re'Jon Luttrell, 18, is being sought by the Garfield Heights Police Department for attempted murder, according to GHPD Lt. Robert Petrick.

According to a filed police report, two young women, both 18, said they were shot by an acquaintance after a gathering at an apartment on East 126th Street in Garfield Heights turned into an argument on New Year's Day, around 4 a.m.

Police learned a group of girls went to the apartment around 2:30 a.m. and left around 4 a.m. when the boys there began arguing with them. They said one of the males pulled out a gun and started shooting after they had gone outside, striking one of the girls in the leg, according to the police report.

Police later learned two of the girls from the group went back into the apartment to get the belongings they had left behind, and the same male became angry. According to the report, they began arguing, and once the girls were outside, the same male again started shooting, striking a second girl in the leg.

Petrick said Luttrell's mother had recently rented an apartment for him on East 126th Street but he has not been seen there since the shooting on January 1st.

Luttrell's last known address is on Hildana Road in Shaker Heights. "He is known very well by the Shaker Heights Police Department from his past criminal behavior as a juvenile and he is most likely in that area at this time," said Petrick.

"We are currently still investigating the shooting and attempting to gain information from uncooperative witnesses," Petrick said. Anyone with information should call the Garfield Heights Detective Bureau at 216-475-5686.

## Maple Heights to apply for FEMA funds for fire dept. vehicle, equipment

Maple Heights Council approved legislation at its meeting last week to apply for almost \$1 million in Federal Emergency Management Agency grant funding for the city's fire department, which would be used to buy vehicles, equipment and other needed items.

Two ordinances authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell and Fire Chief Vito Kavaliunas to enter into a contract with Gatchell Grant Resources, LLC, were approved to develop and submit an application for a 2017 Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) from FEMA.

One ordinance is seeking a \$750,000 grant for emergency vehicle acquisition, while the other is seeking a

\$175,000 grant for operations and safety equipment. The total amount being requested is \$925,000.

In correspondence with the city, Kavaliunas stated that the fire department was looking for funding to replace its 2002 Sutphen pumper.

"This grant would cover 90 percent of the cost of the new apparatus and is a significant opportunity to replace this pumper at a very low cost, as the city may have a difficult time replacing it at full cost in the future," he noted.

Kavaliunas stated that the pumper has over 80,000 miles, over 8,000 engine hours and has required \$35,799 in repairs over the past three years.

The department is seeking to replace the pumper

with an aerial ladder truck, Kavaliunas said. Having an aerial truck would have several advantages over a pumper, he stated, because a 75-foot hydraulic aerial ladder would be better able to reach upper windows of multi-story buildings, and would "give us the ability to provide elevated water streams for buildings and homes involved in heavy fire, and reach buildings that are set back from the street or parking lots. This would be extremely important for numerous apartment complexes and warehouses throughout the city."

The height advantage of a ladder truck would also give firefighters a greater ability to cut ventilation holes in roofs during work-

# Garfield Hts. Council notes

Garfield Heights Council met Monday night and passed an emergency resolution appointing Jeffrey Jerome to serve as director of the Garfield Heights Community Diversion Program, retroactive from January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2019.

Under the program, first-time, nonviolent offenders under 18 have a chance to complete community service rather than receive a typical sentence.

Another emergency resolution passed Monday night ratified the appointment of Edward Stanzeski as a member of the city's Civil Service Commission for the term effective January 1, 2018, and ending December 31, 2023.

Emergency ordinances passed by council included:

- Amending an ordinance relating to registered contractors performing work within the city of Garfield Heights.

- A contract between the city and the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District to participate in the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Program.

- A contract between the city and the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District for the purpose of public involvement and public education regarding soil and water conservation.

- Authorizing the extension of the labor agreement between the city and the Garfield Heights Fire Fighters Local 340 of the International Association of Firefighters.

- Applying to NOACA for FTA funds to purchase a bus for the Senior Center under the Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program.

- Authorizing the sale of several city vehicles that have been determined to be no longer needed by the city.

- Directing the mayor to enter into a contract with OHM Advisors to provide construction tasks for the IR-480/Transportation Blvd. Improvement Project - Phase 2, and authorizing the payment of 343,364.00, which will be funded through Craig Realty Group-Cleveland LLC at no cost to the city.

Also passed was an ordinance for Mallis to enter into a contract with Lally Chevrolet to buy two 2018 Chevrolet Tahoes, also through the state purchasing program, at a cost of \$71,974.

All of the vehicle purchases were budgeted items and were purchased at the lowest price available through the state contract, Mallis stated.

The third ordinance passed was for a contract with Hall Public Safety Upfitters to purchase and install equipment in the three new vehicles, at a cost of \$37,387.26.

Council also passed an ordinance authorizing Mallis to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Cuyahoga County Soil and Water Conservation District and the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District to provide technical assistance in implementing soil and water conservation measures, as an annual report must be filed by the city with the Environmental Protection Agency.

## Deer culling

Culling of deer in the Metroparks Bedford Reservation is now taking place, from now through Thursday, March 15. At the request of the Metroparks, the city also has been asked to cull 25 deer.

Various areas of the Metroparks will be closed

during the culling operations, Mallis stated, adding that the Metroparks shooters would be going after the deer "in a safe, humane and effective way... the city is doing their own culling operations, as they have done the past few years."

Culling operations would be concentrated around the city's wastewater treatment plant and the cemetery, among other locations, he said, adding that the police department would be working internally to close off those areas during the culling hours.

## Announcements

The "State of the City" address will be presented by Koci and Mallis at Light of Hearts Villa, 283 Union St., tomorrow, Thursday, Jan. 25. Although the deadline for reservations for the luncheon has passed, interested residents may still attend the speech at noon at no cost. Call 440-232-0115 for more information.

Also tomorrow at 10 a.m., Councilwoman Sandy Spinks will make a special appearance on the FOX-8 television show "New Day Cleveland," with program host David "The Mossman" Moss, for a cooking segment.

Mallis noted that the recent freezing and thawing cycles have resulted in a number of water main breaks throughout Bedford, and if residents observe water pooling along curbs or bubbling in the roadways without any orange cones present, to please contact the city.

Residents of the city of Bedford can now sign up for CodeRED, a system that sends emergency notifications by phone, email, text and social media to keep citizens informed of emergencies such as an evacuation notices, utility outages, water main breaks, fire or floods, chemical spills or other emergency situations.

The City may also activate CodeRED to send general notifications to registered subscribers to communicate non-life safety matters, such as planned road closures, water main repairs, water and power service interruptions, etc. By selecting the box for general alerts, you will also receive these types of notifications.

# Community police reports

## MAPLE HEIGHTS

### Auto Theft

A resident of the 20600 block of Hillgrove Ave. told police she left her car running in her driveway on January 20th, around 12:20 a.m., and when she came back outside the car was gone. Dispatch notes said Independence PD and Cuyahoga Heights PD both attempted to stop her vehicle that same day at 5 a.m. and 6 p.m. respectively, but the driver fled.

### Shoplifting

A man was caught trying to steal a drain snake and two containers of Tide Pods from the Home Depot on Libby Rd. on January 19th, around 2:10 p.m. Police learned the man had an active warrant with Euclid PD for failure to appear/theft. He was issued a summons for theft and advised of trespassing at Home Depot.

## GARFIELD HEIGHTS

### Burglary

A resident of the 12800 block of S. Parkway said that while he was out of town between January 17th and January 20th, someone broke into his home through a side window. The house had been completely ransacked and his gun, two magazines, ammunition and a jug and baggie full of coins had been stolen. He told police no

one was aware he would be out of town and that this is the second time his home had been broken into.

### Drug Abuse

On January 8th, around 4:20 a.m., police saw a vehicle travelling on Broadway at E. 131st St. with no rear license plate illumination and pulled the car over at Forestdale. The driver and backseat passenger provided identification, however the front seat passenger refused. Police said the backseat passenger appeared to be very nervous and the driver and front passenger were evasive when answering questions. The driver also refused to give police consent to search the vehicle.

Officers then called for a K9 unit for a vehicle sniff. A K9 arrived and alerted police to the front passenger side. Inside the car under the front passenger seat, police found a used hypodermic needle, syringe and crack pipe. The passenger gave police false names several times before finally admitting she was a 25-year-old Kent resident. After running her identification through LEADS, police learned she had a felony warrant for dangerous drugs through the Portage County Sheriff's Office and a misdemeanor warrant with GHPD. Officers then arrested her. She was issued a summons for possession of drug abuse instruments and paraphernalia and obstruction of official business.

The driver of the vehicle, 37, of Cleveland, was cited for no rear illumination and she and the backseat passenger were released at the scene.

### Robbery

On January 17th, around 1:10 p.m., police were dispatched to the area near the Garfield Heights Library in reference to an attempted abduction complaint. A 32-year-old Garfield Heights woman told police she was outside the library when two men in their 20s came up to her and asked what she had in her pockets. She told police she then covered her pockets with her arms and the men grabbed her. She said she was able to run away from the males and they left the area in a gray vehicle.

She was not injured and nothing was taken from her. The library was to provide surveillance footage to police if available. Officers searched the area for suspects with negative results.

### Vehicle Theft

A woman said she was at Advanced Auto Parts on Turney Rd. on January 15th and she went outside around 12:50 p.m. to start her car to warm it up. She went back inside the store for several minutes and when she went outside to leave found her vehicle was missing. She told police she did not see anyone in the lot or in the area when she went outside to start the car.

The vehicle was entered into LEADS as stolen and on the same day, around 6:45 p.m., the car was found abandoned on Plymouth Ave. after police received a call for a hit-skip. The incident remains under investigation.

ing fires and could be set up by one firefighter, "which would be extremely beneficial with our limited manpower," Kavaliunas stated.

As for the equipment grant, Kavaliunas said that was being sought to replace "aging and obsolete" Self Contained Breathing Apparatus, which was purchased 15 years ago and needs replacement due to failed testing and required repairs.

If both grants are approved, Gatchell will be paid eight percent of the amount of the grant awarded, up to a maximum payment of \$3,000 apiece, according to the legislation.

## Recycling awareness grant

Council also passed a resolution at last week's meeting directing the mayor and Human Services Director Linda Vopat to apply for grant funds from the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste Management

District's 2018 Community Recycling Awareness Grant, in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.

The grant helps communities educate residents about recycling, and seeks to increase participation in community sponsored programs, the resolution states. Communities are not required to provide matching funds.

In correspondence to the city, Vopat stated that this is the third year the city has applied for the funds, with the first two being successful.

"Funds will be used to provide two Community Shred Days to our residents, one in the spring and one in the fall," Vopat stated. She said there would also be a recycling awareness piece requested to assist residents in using the recycling service more effectively.

## Other legislation passed

Also passed at last week's meeting was a resolution amending and restating legislation that was passed in December authorizing Maple Heights to enter into a 99-year lease agreement with the Cleveland

Metroparks to allow the park system to take over operations of the 53-acre Dunham Park, in the western area of the city.

Two resolutions dealing with insurance for full-time city employees for this year were passed, as recommended by the Fedeli Group. One resolution was an agreement with Sun Life Financial for group life insurance. The other was an agreement with Union Eye Care for group vision insurance.

A resolution observing the birthday of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and honoring his life was also passed by council.

## Other legislation

Placed on second reading was a resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into a real estate option agreement with Wallick Asset Management LLC, which is proposing to develop a 46-unit senior living facility on six separate but adjoining parcels of land on Lee Road, formerly known as the Pettiti Garden Center site.

Wallick is requesting an option period to study the feasibility of the develop-

ment project, which also states that as part of the option, Wallick wants to purchase the six parcels of land for \$30,000. The parcels are currently owned by the city through its Land Reutilization Program.

Blackwell wants to sell them after the option is fulfilled by Wallick, "which takes into account that the city is placing certain deed restrictions on the Lee Road parcels, including use restrictions and building requirements," the resolution states. Council will discuss the legislation before a final vote at a future meeting.

## Western Union giving refunds to scam victims

The Cuyahoga County Department of Consumer Affairs is encouraging scam victims who wired money to scammers through Western Union to apply for refunds by the February 12th deadline.

Western Union agreed to pay \$586 million to settle charges by the Federal Trade Commission and U.S. Justice Department that the company looked the other way while scammers used its money wiring system, despite receiving hundreds of thousands of complaints about scam activity.
