New dispatch agreement on first reading in Maple Hts.

A resolution authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell to enter into a New Member Participation Agreement with the Chagrin Valley Dispatch Council for dispatch services for the city effective July 1, 2018, was placed on first reading at last week's Maple Heights Council meeting.

In an effort towards regionalization, Maple Heights was one of four communities that ceased providing their own in-house dispatching services to join the Southeast Emergency Communications Center in Bedford Heights in 2015, along with Garfield Heights, Bedford and Bedford Heights.

Fatal M.H. house fire

A 100-year-old woman, Sophia Lingro, died in a house fire in Maple Heights last Thursday, Feb. 8, according to Maple Heights Police Lieutenant Joseph Mocsiran.

Around 5:45 a.m. last Thursday, Maple Heights police received a call for a possible house fire at 15000 James Ave. Officers responded, along with the Maple Heights Fire Department and other surrounding fire departments. Residents had already evacuated the single family home and indicated a female was still on the second floor, according to Mocsiran.

Firefighters subsequently located Lingro, who was unresponsive. She was transported to Marymount Hospital and later pronounced deceased due to smoke and soot inhalation, according to the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner.

"At this time there is no indication of foul play," said Mocsiran. The State Fire Marshals are investigating.

G.H. man indicted on An agreement with Motorola Solutions, Inc. for the drugs, firearms charges

Tyrone Cammon, 29, of Garfield Heights, was recently charged in a seven-count indictment with possession with intent to distribute carfentanil, fentanyl, heroin and fentanyl analogues, using a firearm in relation to drug trafficking, and being a felon in possession of a firearm, according to the U.S. Attorney's Office, Northern District of Ohio

This defendant sold the same drugs that have killed thousands of our friends and relatives and illegally carried a firearm as part of his drug trafficking," said U.S. Attorney Justin Herdman in a press release.

Cammon possessed fentanyl for distribution on April 9, 2016, as well as a firearm he used in relations to his drug trafficking, according to the indictment.

He possessed heroin and more than 12 grams of methoxyacetylfentanyl, carfentanil and fentanyl pharmacophore for distribution, according to the in-

Cammon possessed two Glock .40 caliber pistols and a FNH 5.7x28mm pistol at various times in March 2016, April 2016 and November 2017, despite three previous convictions for drug trafficking, a previous conviction for assault and a previous conviction for attempted tampering with evidence, the indictment states.

The case is being prosecuted by assistant U.S. attorneys Scott Zarzycki and Kelly L. Galvin following an investigation by the Lakewood and Cleveland police departments, the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms and the U.S. Marshals.

An indictment is only a charge and is not evidence of guilt. The defendant is entitled to a fair trial in which it will be the government's burden to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt, the press release concludes.

At the hospital, police learned the victim had a pacemaker. The cause of death has not yet been determined, according to the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner.


