Maple Hts. success stories

The city of Maple Heights has had so much to celebrate and be thankful for this year! While there have been many challenges, there have also been many successes.

The city will move forward as beneficiaries of many very important grant wins, competitive contracts and agreements, which include a Community Master Plan Planning Grant, a County Community Navigator Contract which netted enough funds to remodel the Senior Center. In an effort to further our aggressive economic development efforts, an SBA Small Business Municipal Grant Program also has been obtained to assist small businesses to qualify for SBA insured bank loans.

The administration continues to pursue and finalize several quality of life initiatives and programs which include becoming a MyCom Neighborhood, which is a network that connects Greater Cleveland's youth to quality programs in their neighborhoods and beyond so that they can develop 21st century skills and maximize their talents to connect, navigate and be productive. It also coordinates summer employment opportunities. The 99-year lease with the Metroparks for Dunham Park to become a nationally-recognized Metropark was finalized.

The Cleveland Foundation's \$197,540.00 grant approved an East Inner Ring Suburb Five-City Grant (Garfield Heights, Euclid, Maple Heights, South Euclid and Warrensville Heights) for a Property Condition, Parcel Survey Project. This project was approved to address the cities' catastrophic foreclosure crisis, weakened tax base and to assist with the monumental task of clearing the blight left.

The scope of this project for the five cities included completing an inventory of our residential parcels, scoring each with a letter grade based on property condition. Additionally, it was to capture precisely how many vacant properties exist in each community and to compile an accurate list of the location of all distressed properties.

Lastly, we remain committed to reducing our deficit and removing our "Fiscal Emergency" status by year-end 2018 and are very confident that this is achievable. We have already reduced our debt by more than \$1 million!

Topgolf entertainment facility coming to Independence; Indy council okays incentives

Global sports entertainment leader Topgolf has officially announced that the Cleveland market will be home to its third Ohio location. Topgolf plans to start construction on a 65,000-square-foot venue this fall, located in Independence, with a projected opening in 2019.

"Adding Topgolf to the Independence business community is a significant win for us, as it broadens the Rockside area's amenity mix," said Independence Mayor Anthony L. Togliatti. "Its presence here will serve our families and corporate citizens alike with entertainment options that no one else in the region has."

Guests can enjoy point-scoring golf games using microchipped balls that instantly score themselves, showing players the accuracy and distance of their shots on a TV screen in their hitting bay. The venues also feature a chef-driven menu, top-shelf drinks, big screen TVs and music in climate-controlled hitting bays. Year-round programming includes

events for children and families, social leagues, golf tournaments, golf instruction and more.

The new Topgolf in Independence will be located near the Embassy Suites at 5800 Rockside Woods Blvd. N. Other Topgolf locations include the city of West Chester near Cincinnati and the one under construction in Columbus.

At its regular meeting last week, Independence Council passed an ordinance to enter into an Economic Development Grant Agreement with Topgolf Independence Sports Entertainment complex.

"In cooperation with city council, my administration and I have been working on bringing Topgolf to northeast Ohio and Independence for nearly two years," Togliatti said.

"Beyond Topgolf's economic impact, which is substantial, \$1 million dollars in payroll withholdings and \$2.4 million in amusement tax over a 10-year period, not to mention the TIF generated by the \$26 to

\$30 million dollar investment, the project helps us meet one of our goals from the Economic Development Strategic Plan which is to enhance amenity options within the Rockside Road corridor as part of our business retention and attraction efforts," he continued.

Also passed was an ordinance granting a U-3 Special Use permit to Topgolf for amusement/entertainment use at the property located on Rockside Woods Boulevard, North.

An ordinance to enter into a Relocation and Job Creation Grant Agreement with Fairmount Santrol, Inc., to relocate its operations to Independence was okayed by council.

The mayor said Fairmount Santrol will be locating 50 employees with a \$7.7 million annual payroll within the city.

Council also gave final approval to Phase 5 of the Chestnut Woods subdivision. This phase will result in the construction of 34 new residential, single-family homes between Hillside and Chestnut roads.

G.H. distributing free smoke alarms to residents

In an effort to create greater awareness for fire safety, the city of Garfield Heights will be distributing free smoke alarms to residents by ward, from 5 to 8 p.m., March 5th, 6th and 7th at the Garfield Heights Civic Center, 5407 Turney Rd.

Residents must fill out an application and present photo identification as well as another proof of residency such as a tax or utility bill. The program is for homeowners and renters residing in one-, two-, and three-family residences.

Residents of Wards One, Two and Three are scheduled for 5 to 8 p.m., March 5th. Residents of Wards Four and Five are scheduled for 5 to 8 p.m., March 6th. And residents of Wards 6 and 7 are scheduled for 5 to 8 p.m., March 7th. City officials would prefer

residents follow the schedule, however, legitimate exceptions will be made.

Members of the city's Community Emergency Response Team will assist with the distribution and have information about volunteering with the group. Also during the distribution dates, residents will have the opportunity to register for Ready Notify, a mass notification system to inform the public about critical and non-emergency events. Ready Notify is a program of the Cuyahoga County Office of Emergency Management.

Council moves on new senior housing project on Lee Road in Maple Heights

After a previous version of the legislation was defeated earlier this month, Maple Heights Council held a special meeting last

week and approved a revised resolution to enter into a real estate option agreement with an Ohio-based company to try and get financing for potential senior housing on Lee Road.

properties so that it can attempt to secure the financing necessary for the new construction of the senior housing.

Wallick intends to apply for State Housing Tax Credits as part of its attempt to secure financing. Passage of the legislation at the Tuesday, Feb. 13 meeting ensured that Wallick met a Thursday, Feb. 15 deadline to apply for the tax credit financing.

During the third reading period of the previous legislation on the project at the February 7 council meeting, council members Edwina Agee, Sharri Thomas, Stafford Shenett and Terry Woody either abstained or voted against the previous resolution because they were still in need of information concerning the development project.

Council members Toni Jones, Ebony Miller and Tanglyn Madden had voted for the previous legislation, but due to a lack of majority vote it was defeated.

It was noted in the resolution passed at last week's meeting that subsequent to the February 7 meeting, Wallick had "provided additional information satisfactory to Agee, Thomas, Shenett and Woody so that they could make an informed decision."

GHHS bowlers place third

Congratulations to the girls and boys bowling teams at Garfield Heights High School for each placing third in the North East Ohio District Sectional Tournament played at Wickliffe Lanes.

The girls team, coached by William Tabb, Jr., was led by freshman Jenna Waterbury with a 418 series (7th overall). June Fertig finished with 16th overall and a 375 series. Brianna Martinez finished 29th with a 340 series, and Sierra Czerwony finished with a 339 series. Melissa Skatzes finished with a 320 series.

The boys team, coached by Leonard Kaliszewski, was led by Jeremy Krul with a 534 series for 9th overall. Zakary Aughinbaugh added a 493 series that was 14th overall. Tyler Michaelis had a 489 series and was 15th overall. Joshua Loeffler had a 4329 series, 31st overall, and Corey Baczowski had a 410 series which was 35th overall.

The matches for the girls consisted of a field of 10 teams. The boys had 12 teams in their field of competition.

The agreement is with Wallick Asset Management, LLC, of New Albany near Columbus, and will allow Wallick "to attempt to secure the financing necessary to facilitate the new construction of an age-restricted, senior living facility in the city that will provide a quality housing option for seniors," according to the legislation.

Wallick has proposed developing and constructing the 44-unit facility for seniors, aged 55 or older, on six separate but adjoining parcels of land on Lee Road near Libby Road, the site of the former Pettiti's Garden Center.

The six parcels are owned by Maple Heights through its Land Reutilization program, and Mayor Annette Blackwell has stated her wish to sell them at a fair market value of \$30,000, "which takes into account that the city is placing certain deed restrictions on the Lee Road parcels, including use restrictions and building requirements," the resolution states.

The agreement will allow Wallick an option period of up to two years prior to finally purchasing the

Cuyahoga Heights Council authorizes purchases for various repairs, upgrades

For the first time in 40 years, the Cuyahoga Heights Service Department kitchen will receive an upgrade to the tune of \$12,778 thanks to legislation passed last Wednesday by the village council.

Council also authorized \$9,388 for painting of the interior rooms of the Police Department, and \$49,950 for repairs to the village's garbage truck.

A resolution was okayed to enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation Dis-

trict and the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District to provide technical assistance in implementing soil and water conservation measures.

To celebrate the village's 100-year anniversary in style, council passed a contract with Ohio Pyro & Flame and Advantage Entertainment LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.

Several pieces of legislation were also authorized for the Nicky Boulevard Storm Sewer Extension and Slope Stabilization Im-

provements Project, including property acquisition, land clearing services, erosion control, access road construction, materials and supplies.

A memorial resolution was passed for Helen M. Kosicki, 95, who passed away last month.

Newburgh Hts. Council notes

Newburgh Heights Council met in regular session on Tuesday, Feb. 6, and passed the following legislation:

- Authorizing all actions necessary to accept North-

east Ohio Public Energy Council (NOPEC) Energized Community grants.

- Accepting two gifts for the village's Thanksgiving Dinner Program: \$800 from American Legion Post 627, and 52 frozen turkeys valued at \$912.50 from 1888OhioComp.

- Accepting a grant of \$7,173.33 from the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation to purchase Fire Department equipment.

- Authorizing a letter to the Ohio Division of Liquor Control opposing the issuance of a liquor permit to the Family Dollar store.

for a broken jaw, concussion and bruises and lacerations sustained during the attack. She was told by police to follow up with the Detective Bureau for further help.
