Bedford Council votes to ban payday lenders from **Historic Downtown District**

Bedford Council approved legislation at its meeting last week to add another type of business to its list of those prohibited in the Historic Downtown District payday lenders.

The ban for these types of establishments is not citywide but only in the historic district, which includes portions of Broadway Avenue and the Public Square area, both Mayor Stan Koci and City Manager Mike Mallis con-

Payday loan businesses are defined in the ordinance as those "who loan a small, short-term unsecured loan, regardless of whether repayment is linked to a borrower's pay day. Said loans are also referred to as 'cash advance' or 'title loans,' though that term can also refer to cash provided against a prearranged line of credit such as a credit card, but can also rely on the consumer having previous payroll and employment records.

Payday lenders now join other businesses that are prohibited in the Historic District, according to legislation passed by council in 2014. Those include: day care centers as defined in the codified ordinances, tattoo shops, body piercing shops, gambling establishments,


