Newburgh Hts. Council amends vicious dog bill; requires permit to park on parts of Beta Avenue

The Village of Newburgh Heights Council met in regular session February 20th and passed an ordinance to amend a codified ordinance entitled "Vicious Dogs" by eliminating any reference to pit bull terriers or any specific breed of dog.

The legislation notes that lobbying groups for pit bull terriers and other specific breeds of dog have successfully lobbied against breed-specific vicious dog ordinances and have brought litigation against various municipalities regarding such ordinances.

Council also okayed an ordinance requiring all on-street parking on streets or portions of streets as designated by Council shall be by permit only, and no person shall stand or park any vehicle on any such Village street without a permit.

The restricted area covered under this ordinance is that portion of Beta Avenue located east of East

41st Street and West of East 42nd Street, made necessary by the opening of Mike's Pizza and events at the Newburgh Heights Social Club.

Three parking permits per residential unit shall be issued by the police chief or his or her designee to the resident of an address within the restricted area or an address immediately adjacent to the restricted area.

Other legislation passed by Village Council at its February 20th meeting included:

- Providing Village employees with behavioral services through Assist Now, the EAP division of Recovery Resources.

- A change order with OHM Advisors for additional inspection and testing efforts for undercuts and base stabilization in connection with the East 54th Street and Brow Avenue Improvements Project, and declaring an emergency.

- Resolution calling on Ohio's elected leaders to support and protect the right of workers to come together and bargain collectively.

- Entering into a contract with OHM Advisors to perform design, engineering and construction services in connection with the East 42nd Street parking lot, and declaring an emergency.

In his report to council, Mayor Trevor Elkins said the salt shortage in the village continues. In order to prevent this situation in the

Broadway Ave. bridge over I-77 to close this weekend, says ODOT

Demolition operations on the Broadway Avenue bridge over I-77 will close I-77 north and southbound between I-480 and I-490 starting this Friday, March 9, from 8 p.m. through 6 a.m. Monday, March 12, reports the Ohio Department of Transportation.

The following closures will be implemented to accommodate the overhead bridge work:

- I-77 north at I-480.
- I-77 south at I-490
- I-480 east and west ramps to I-77 north.
- I-490 east and west ramps to I-77 south.

All traffic will be detoured via I-490, SR 176 and I-480. The entrance and exit ramps along I-77 north and south between I-480 and I-490 will remain open. However, northbound traffic will be directed to exit at Pershing Avenue.

ODOT said that, weather permitting, the weekend of March 23, the closure of I-77 will occur again for additional demolition operations.

Adults arrested after they hauled teens in trunk to 4th District, police said

Three adults are facing felony assault and kidnapping charges after allegedly putting three 14-year-olds into the trunk of a car and taking them to Cleveland's Fourth District Police headquarters after the teens stole a vehicle from one of the adults who pursued them, according to filed police reports.

Garfield Heights police were initially dispatched to the Sunoco gas station at 4925 Turney Rd. on Sunday, March 4, around 4:10 p.m., and spoke to a woman who said her car, a Chrysler 200, had just been stolen with the keys, according to a police report.

The owner of the stolen car told police it had a GPS tracking device and relayed GPS coordinates to dispatch. The car was located by police near Miles Ave. and E. 123rd St., and they attempted to pull the vehicle over. As the Chrysler gained speed and pulled away from police the pursuit was terminated on Princeton Ave., according to the report.

Officers went back to the car owner's home on East 111th St. in Garfield Heights and told her no further police action would be taken. According to the report, the woman became upset and said, "I'm going to get my car." Police warned her of the potential danger and a male companion said, "We ain't worried about that," according to the report. GHPD then notified Cleveland

police that the victim and two others were going to be in their city chasing after the stolen vehicle.

According to a Cleveland police report, the adults located the Chrysler and saw it crash into a house in the 6800 block of Anita

Kennedy Rd. in Cleveland. The teens continued to flee in the car to E. 80th St. and Bessemer Ave., where they crashed into several poles and left the Chrysler disabled.

The adults caught up to them and one of them ordered them out of the car at gunpoint, then forced them into the trunk of a car and took them to police

headquarters, according to the report. Officers found the Chrysler abandoned with flat tires and heavy front end damage.

Once at the police station, officers spoke to one of the teens who said his friends picked him up in the Chrysler. They then headed to Anita Kennedy Rd. to visit one of the teens' cousin when two men pulled up to them and said, "You stole the wrong car.

Get out," according to the Cleveland police report. The teen also told police one of the men shot at the vehicle multiple times.

FOX8.com reported one of the teens suffered minor injuries and another remained in the hospital recovering on Monday.

Garfield Heights Police Chief Robert Byrne said police are working on getting surveillance video covering the Sunoco gas station premises. No charges against any of the teens have yet been filed but the matter remains under investigation, according to Byrne.

Elkins also noted that discussions continue with a developer related to adding homes on various vil-

Officers were told that immediately after the first minivan hit the store, a second minivan pulled up. Several suspects loaded the ATM into the second minivan and fled the scene, according to the release.

During the incident, 7-11 was open for business. Police said no one was injured during the incident. There are no known suspects and the investigation is ongoing.

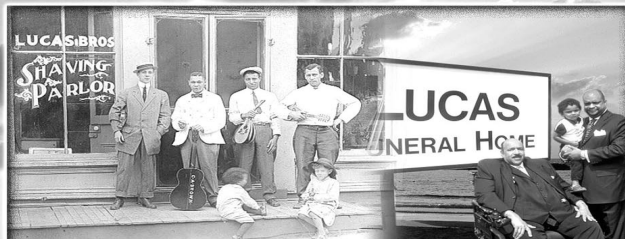

Last chance to sign up for Sheriff's Department Citizens Academy program

Cuyahoga County Sheriff Clifford Pinkney last week announced the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department is accepting applications for the 3rd annual Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department Citizens Academy. Applications will be accepted through March 9th.

"The Sheriff's Department Citizens Academy has proven to be a valuable program to our residents, and I'm proud to bring this program back for a third year," said Pinkney.

"Once again, we've extended our program to 12 weeks to allow for more activities, so our residents can gain a vast pool of knowledge about our department and community partners," he said.

Beginning March 21st, the academy will meet Wednesday evenings from 6 to 9 p.m. in the Justice Center. Residents can expect to participate in interactive demonstrations, presentations, and field trips that will cover some of the following topics: Correc-

tions and Healthcare; Crime Stoppers; Firearm Safety; Civil Complaints; Special Weapon and Tactics (SWAT).

The Citizen's Academy is free of charge and open to all eligible residents. Eligibility requirements include:

- Resident of Cuyahoga County

Police were able to view footage from one of the city's cameras and determined the incident occurred in the 8600 block of Garfield Blvd. The footage showed the following:

Two people were engaged in an altercation in the middle of Garfield Blvd. One of them then got into a maroon van parked on the south side of Garfield Blvd. with its hazards flashing and fled, while the second person, a male, chased after the vehicle and appeared to be dragged by the van a few feet. A third person, possibly a female, can be seen standing on the sidewalk.

The video shows the van make a U-turn in the middle of the road and drive towards the man still in the street. The driver ran over the man in the street, striking him with the front bumper and open driver's side door. The driver then drove the van onto the sidewalk in an attempt to hit the female. The van then lost control and struck a pole on the corner of E. 86th St. and Garfield Blvd., then turned onto E. 85th St. out of view.

A witness told police she saw the van run over the male in the road and the female began shooting at the van as it drove off. She said the man and woman walked down the alleyway on E. 86th St. out of sight, but the woman returned a few minutes later to retrieve shoes left in the road. The witness asked the female if the man who got run over was "all right" and the female replied "Yes," then walked back down the alley.

Officers found the van abandoned in the 4700 block of E. 85th St. with severe damage to the driver's side door and fender. All of the driver's side airbags were deployed and the driver's side window was completely shattered. Inside the van, police found mail from the Adult Probation Department addressed to a Cleveland Heights man who has several warrants, a temporary protective order and a caution for being armed and dangerous. Dispatch said the man has a history with GHPD and a possible Maple Heights address. Police continue to investigate the incident.

M.H. Council shelves pay ordinance for now

An ordinance to amend the authorized pay schedule for some city employees was placed in Finance Committee at a special meeting of Maple Heights council last week.

Cleveland man faces attempted murder charges after robbery attempt in Bedford

A 24-year-old Cleveland resident was arrested by Bedford police last week after allegedly shooting at two males he tried to rob, according to a Bedford police report.

the 24-year-old. Both males said the man had tried robbing them and shot at them when they wouldn't give him money, according to Bedford Police Deputy Chief Rick Suts.

Officers were called to the Valleyfield East Apartments, 19955 Rockside Rd. in Bedford, on February 18th, around 5:30 a.m., for a call of shots fired. When police got to the scene they saw two males striking a third male on the ground,

According to the police report, the 24-year-old was able to get up and flee the scene, possibly in a grey SUV. Officers chased after the vehicle but lost sight of it in Bedford Heights.

The males at the apartment had minor injuries

injuries. Two guns were found at the scene; no gunshot injuries were reported.


The 24-year-old faces attempted murder and attempted aggravated robbery charges, according to the police report. He is being held on a \$750,000 bond. The case has been bound over to the Cuyahoga County Grand Jury.
