Newburgh Heights offering home maintenance assistance for seniors, vets

The Village of Newburgh Heights Council met on Tuesday, March 6, and enacted a "Home Maintenance Grant Program" which would provide matching grant funds for senior citizens, aged 55 and older, and military veterans, both of whom are residents of the village. The funds would be used for specified interior and exterior home improvements.

Mayor Trevor Elkins said the village plans initial applications for the program to begin in mid-late May. Also passed at the March 6 council meeting was legislation:

- Authorizing an agreement with North Royalton for prisoner housing services.
- Authorizing purchase of body cameras and related software for the police department.
- Okaying a payment of \$70,000 to the Newburgh Heights Community Improvement Corporation to purchase the real property and improvements at 4008 E. 53 St. Elkins said the structure on the property had a history of building code issues, parking problems and tenant turnover. He said demolition of the house would lead to new housing construction, alleviation of parking issues and an overall improvement of the housing stock of the community.
- Entering into a Letter of Agreement with Partners Environmental for groundwater monitoring services for the Bert Avenue landfill post closure monitoring.

Mayor Elkins announced that the village has enough in existing grant money to demolish 10 more properties. The building department will evaluate the list of distressed structures to determine if the village should apply for the latest round of grant funding.

Fire Chief Brian Higginbotham said new radios were acquired via a state grant with Cuyahoga Heights, Valley View and Brooklyn Heights and should be fully operational by April 2.

Service Director Joe Milano reported that the village has used 267 tons of salt so far this season, with the annual average being 200 tons. He said his department is continuing the search for new salt vendors.

Did not warrant felony charges Cleveland 'kidnapping' referred back to city prosecutor by county

Cuyahoga County Prosecutor Michael C. O'Malley announced last week that the kidnapping case involving Shelia Beale, Kenyatta Ware and George Barnes is being referred back to the city prosecutor's office because it was determined that their conduct did not warrant felony abduction charges.

The adults were facing felony assault and kidnapping charges after allegedly putting three 14-year-olds into the trunk of a car and taking them to Cleveland's Fourth District Police headquarters after the teens stole a vehicle from one of the adults who pursued them, according to filed police reports.

On March 4th, Beale's vehicle was stolen from a gas station in Garfield Heights. Garfield Heights Police pursued the vehicle but called off the chase

due to excessive speeds, according to the police report, and Beale was able to track down herself using GPS.

Traveling in two cars, Beale and her two sons, Ware and Barnes, and an unknown male are alleged to have located the vehicle on Anita Kennedy Drive in Cleveland. While attempting to elude Beale, two juveniles driving the stolen vehicle crashed on Anita Kennedy, continued driving, and crashed again at E. 80th St. and Bessemer Ave., according to police.

The unidentified male, Ware and Barnes allegedly assaulted the two juveniles and forced them into the trunk of their car at E. 80th and Bessemer. Beale and Ware drove the juveniles to Cleveland 4th District police headquarters, where they were arrested

by officers.

The investigation of the two juveniles resulted in the State filing charges of receiving stolen property and vandalism, according to the county prosecutors office. There is also an ongoing investigation into shots fired in the area of Anita Kennedy Drive.

After reviewing the matter involving Beale and her two sons, the State will be referring this matter to the city prosecutor to determine if misdemeanor charges are warranted.

Prosecutor O'Malley cautions that citizen's arrests, while lawful, can be extremely dangerous. "We have seen innocent citizens sustain serious injuries as a result of people taking the law into their own hands," said O'Malley. "It is always best to let law enforcement handle these matters."

Broadway bridge over I-77 to close again this weekend

Cuyahoga Heights cracks down on loud noise while driving

Cuyahoga Heights Council met last Wednesday, March 14, and passed legislation making it a third degree misdemeanor to play "loud or distracting sound devices while operating a motor vehicle or motorcycle," in other words, disturbing the peace.

The amended ordinance states that, "No person shall play any radio, music player or audio system in a motor vehicle at such volume as to disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of other persons, or at a volume which is plainly audible to persons other than the occupants of said vehicle."

Whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree and shall be subject to the penalty provided in Section 698.02. In addition, the sound device used during the commission of the offense shall be subject to seizure and payment of a judgment.

Penalties for a third degree misdemeanor are up to 60 days in jail and a maximum fine of \$500.

Separately, the legislation revised a section of the traffic code to make it a minor misdemeanor if loud or distracting music, the operation of a cell phone, or other similar activities cause a driver to fail to give full time and attention to operating the vehicle.

Penalty for a minor misdemeanor is a maximum fine of \$150.

Also passed at the meeting was a resolution declaring the village's old rescue squad as surplus property. It will be donated to the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department to start its new life as a Mobile Command Center.

An agreement with Security Hut to provide off duty police officers in an amount not to exceed \$25,000 for park security was given the okay by council, as was the rental of a garbage truck, in an amount not to exceed \$13,300, for two months from Premier Truck Rental while the village garbage truck is being refurbished.

Mayor Jack Bacci said he received a communication from Firefighter Pete Panizzutti that he will be retiring at the end of May,

with his last day being May 28, 2018. Panizzutti said he "has had a wonderful career and has been truly blessed."

Maple Heights to join Chagrin Valley Dispatch

The city of Maple Heights will be using the Chagrin Valley Dispatch Center for its 911 services, effective July 1, 2018, after council passed a resolution approving the move at its meeting earlier this month.

Maple Heights will join with existing members, including Bedford, Independence, Brecksville, and numerous other Northeast Ohio communities, to have its dispatching services provided through the CVD, headquartered at University Hospitals of Bedford Medical Center in Bedford.

As a new member of the CVD, Maple Heights will pay its dues in five annual installments totalling \$353,178, according to the participation agreement.

No interest is being charged to the city due to current low interest rates, the agreement states.

Additionally, the city will agree to pay the 2018 Operating Cost Share, which is \$305,210, a prorated amount due for July 1, 2018, through December 31, 2018, and one month's working capital advance in the amount of \$50,868.33.

In an effort towards regionalization, Maple Heights, along with Bedford, Bedford Heights

and Garfield Heights, ceased providing their own in-house dispatching services in 2015, in order to join the new Southeast Emergency Communications Center, which was based in Bedford Heights.

However, citing concerns with responsiveness and other issues, Bedford was the first community that chose to leave the SECC last year and join the CVD. Garfield Heights was the second to leave, announcing plans to return dis-

patching services to its city's own Justice Center later this year. Maple Heights' decision to join the CVD in July leaves Bedford Heights as the lone community currently served by the SECC after only three years in operation.

Council also passed a resolution at the meeting authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) and the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORS), to provide U.S. EPA Phase II Stormwater Services for calendar year 2018.

This is a 12-month extension of a previous MOU that the city entered into with the NEORS and the SWCD for calendar year 2017, "to plan and provide a conservation program that includes public education and involvement" on preserving, protecting and improving water resources from polluted storm runoff, the legislation states.

Also passed was a resolution authorizing Engineer Ed Hren and the city's Service Department to apply to the NEORS for Community Cost Share Program Funds, and upon approval, to begin preparing plans and specs and adver-

tise for bids for construction of Phase II of the new salt storage facility at the Dunham Road Service Center.

The existing salt storage facility is in a state of disrepair and can no longer provide adequate protection against the Northeast Ohio climactic conditions, the legislation states.

The NEORS has informed Maple Heights that construction of a new salt storage facility "would effectively serve as a Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping BMP, and thus qualify as a storm water management project eligible for Community

Cost Share Funds." Passage authorizes the city to apply for the funds towards design and construction of the second phase of the new salt storage facility.

A resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into a Collective Bargaining Agreement with the city's full-time mechanics and park technicians, effective January 1, 2018 through December 3, 2020, was passed, as was a resolution designating March 2018 as "Multiple Sclerosis Education and Awareness Month" in the city.

An ordinance for the city's 2018 budget was placed in the Finance Committee.
