Garfield Hts. Council puts moratorium Vietnam vets on interior Point of Sale inspections event in G.H.

Garfield Heights Council met Monday night and voted to place a temporary moratorium on the requirement to complete an interior point of sale inspection on any dwelling or building being sold, transferred or conveyed in the

According to the legislation, many municipalities have been sued by residents whose sale of their property has been delayed or disrupted by the requirement to first obtain a Point of Sale Inspection.

Once pending litigation in this area has concluded, says the resolution, or the state provides guidance on this issue, the city will review the necessity of the moratorium.

However, during the period of the moratorium, Point of Sale inspections will be offered to residents who request or volunteer to have the interior of their property inspected.

Man dead after hit by car on E. 52nd

Cleveland homicide detectives are investigating the death of a 68-year-old man who was struck by a car on E. 52nd St. in Slavic Village, according to Detective Reginald Lanton.

Last Sunday, March 25, around 11:30 p.m., officers responded to the 3800 block E. 52 St. and found the victim, Nathaniel Primous, Jr., in the street. EMS arrived and took Primous to MetroHealth Medical Center where he expired from his injuries,

Witnesses reported seeing the victim and two unknown males running from Primous's house. Police said the victim jumped into his truck and hit a parked car in an attempt to leave. After hitting the parked vehicle, Primous got out of his truck and was struck by the suspect's vehicle, according to Lanton. At this point, one of the suspects got into Primous's truck and both vehicles drove off leaving

Maple Hts. Council passes amended **Fiscal Recovery Plan**

Three years have passed since the State Auditor's Office declared Maple Heights to be in a state of fiscal emergency, and at its meeting last week council passed an amended version of the ongoing recovery plan to bring the city out of its deficit, possibly by next year.

In early 2015, State Auditor Dave Yost placed Maple Heights in fiscal emergency status, as the city was operating under a deficit of more than \$2.5 million. Consequently, the city was placed under the oversight of a financial planning and supervision commission as part of a five-year plan to reduce the deficit, and officials with Maple Heights and the state have been working together through the years to accomplish that goal.


City officials confirmed recently that the deficit was now less than \$800,000, in contrast to the \$2.5 million reported in 2016.

Revenue generating actions have included welcoming numerous new businesses to the city, most recently Family Dollar, Sav-A-Lot, Longwood Beauty Supply and Shoppers World, as well as encouraging existing businesses, such as Clifton Steel, to expand and/or make improvements to their facilities.

Other actions to improve the city's finances include: Reduction of some city expenses, rebates in Workers' Compensation, sale of assets through GovDeals, sale of homes owned by the city, re-institution of yearly rental registration and a building permit fee schedule in-

The city is also sharing services with other communities to save money, including participation as of July 1, 2018, in the Chagrin Valley Dispatch Council, moving from the Southeast Emergency Communications Center in Bedford Heights.

Other shared services include membership in Southeast Area Law Enforcement (SEALE), a collaboration of police departments in seven southeastern Cleveland suburbs, and membership in the Chagrin Southeast Regional Hazmat Response Team, which consists of firefighters from 30 Cleveland suburbs to provide hazardous material response in crisis situations.



In time for submission to the Fiscal Commission, council passed an ordinance approving the budget for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2018, in the total amount of \$22,445,763.76.

This figure includes a little over \$3 million apiece to run the city's police and fire departments, about \$700,000 for the Building Commissioner services and expenditures, \$677,000 for lands and buildings, \$1.3 million in additional five percent increase added for subsequent miscellaneous services, expenditures, fund transfers and advances, \$2.5 million for the water/sewer maintenance fund, \$1.7 million for solid waste collection and \$1.3 million for the street construction, maintenance

Cuyahoga County for at-risk area youth

A total of 241 students in the 9th through 12th grades were enrolled during the 2016-17 academic year.

OST is a proven strategy for keeping kids out of trouble, improving school performance and preparing youth for careers and stable adulthood.

After-school and summer programs immerse over 3,000 youths of all ages in positive activities like tutoring and educational enrichment, arts and culture exposure. recreation, career exploration and college readiness.

Our goal is to ensure every student stays in school and has the support needed to graduate high school ready for post-secondary completion and career success," said Cuyahoga County Executive Armond Budish.

"Out of School Time and Closing the Achievement Gap are two programs providing the support and resources needed to our region's youth to assist in achieving this goal," he said.


