Suspects charged in last week's Seven Roses theft

A man and woman accused of robbing the owner of Seven Roses Polish Deli in Slavic Village last week have been arrested, according to Cleveland Fourth District Police Commander Brandon Kutz. The owner of Seven Roses, located at 6301 Fleet Ave., has been robbed twice within the last month.

Owner Sophie Tyl said she and another male were cleaning the restaurant, which was closed at the time, on May 14th, around 1:20 p.m., when they heard a knock at the front door. Tyl said she recognized the woman so she opened the door for her. As she opened the door an unknown male stepped into the doorway from the left, pulled out a gun and pointed it at Tyl's head demanding money, according to a police report. Tyl complied and the suspects then fled toward E. 65th St. Police searched the area for the suspects at the time with negative results.

Demetrius Smith, 26, and Venus Vanitzan, 38, are being charged with aggravated robbery and being held on a \$150,000 bond, according to Cleveland Municipal Court records. A preliminary hearing for Vanitzan is scheduled for Tuesday, May 29.

The deli was also robbed overnight between April 27th and 28th. Tyl estimated that about \$3000 worth of prepared foods had been stolen from two freezers, according to a police report.

"Both suspects in the robbery of the Seven Roses have been arrested and charged," said Kutz. "The arrests also generated some leads on the break in at the same location," he added.

"I want to commend Commander Kutz and the officers of the Fourth District for arresting these suspects in the robbery of Sophie Tyl after she was held up at Seven Roses last week," said Ward 12 Councilman Anthony Brancatelli.

"Their arrests may also help solve a number of other crimes that have occurred in the area," he said.

M.H. to apply for county senior services funding

In an effort to secure continued funding for the Maple Heights Senior Center, Maple Heights Council approved a resolution at its meeting last week to apply for

an award through the Cuyahoga County Division of Adult and Senior Services.

The resolution, which was the only piece of legislation on the agenda at the meeting, also authorizes Mayor Annette Blackwell to enter into a contract with the County Senior Services division for community social services for the city for two years.

The county funding would go for congregate meals and transportation services for the period January 1, 2019, through December 31, 2020.

Council Clerk Leonette Cicirella announced council's schedule of meetings for the summer months of June, July and August.

Council meetings will be held once a month at 7 p.m. at the Maple Heights Senior Center, 15901 Libby Rd., on the following dates: Wednesday, June 6, Thursday, July 5 (due to the July 4th holiday), and Wednesday, August 1. Council caucus will be held before the meetings at 6:30 p.m.

The woman sustained minor injuries, including a small bump on her face near her eye and small abrasions on her lips. She was taken to Marymount Hos-
