## Closing of U.S. Bank office in Bedford to affect city's coffers

With U.S. Bank announcing the closing of one of its mortgage offices in Bedford later this year, city leaders commented at the council meeting last week on how the loss of about 260 jobs and the consequent loss of an estimated \$350,000 in annual revenue will affect the city.

U.S. Bank officials confirmed earlier this month that their mortgage and consumer banking office at 17500 Rockside Rd. will begin shutting down operations in July.

As required by state law, Andrea Bond, U.S. Bank Human Resources director, gave notice to the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services Dislocated Workers Unit on Wednesday, May 9, stating, "This action is expected to be permanent, and it will affect approximately 260

employees... the first separations of employment will commence on July 9, 2018."

U.S. Bank spokesperson Molly Snyder, in a statement released at the time of the notice, said, "After a strategic review of our real estate footprint, we have made the decision to close the U.S. Bank satellite office in Bedford when its lease expires this fall."

Work currently being done at the Bedford location will be transferred to other offices, and employees will be offered a severance and job placement program to help them transition to new careers, Snyder stated.

Bedford City Manager Mike Mallis said he met with Finance Director Frank Gambosi and staff members to explore ways to tighten up the city's budget in light of the bank's closing and the loss of rev-

enue it will mean to the city.

On a positive note, Mallis commented that the city would be saving money by transferring its dispatch services from the Southeast Emergency Communications Center to Chagrin Valley Dispatch, a dispatch-

## G.H. woman sentenced in hit-and-run death of child

Lacynthia Tidmore, 23, of York Blvd. in Garfield Heights, was sentenced to eight years in prison for the hit-and-run death of a nine-year-old Euclid girl, according to court records.

Tidmore struck De'Zyer Mays while she was walking to school in Euclid in November 2017, then fled the scene, according to cleveland.com. Court records show Tidmore changed her plea to guilty of vehicular manslaughter in April.

Prosecutors said telephone records showed Tidmore was using her cell phone at the time of the crash, according to cleveland.com.

## G.H couple dies as SUV catches fire

Jo Ann Svihlik, 65, of Garfield Heights, died last Friday when her SUV caught fire as she was travelling with her husband on Ohio Rt. 2 near the Ohio 269 Lakeside-Marblehead exit, according to The Plain Dealer. The newspaper also reported her husband, Dennis, 71, died Sunday morning at MetroHealth Medical Center from injuries sustained in the crash.

Published reports said the woman was driving a 2005 Chevy Trailblazer when it began to smoke and catch fire and was engulfed in flames in seconds. Dennis Svihlik was able to get out of the SUV while it was still moving and fell onto the road, but his wife was unable to get out and was pronounced dead at the scene, according to The Plain Dealer.

## Slavic Village groups awarded grants

Neighborhood Connections Grant Making Committee, with additional funding from Cuyahoga Arts & Culture, invested in 101 resident-led projects in Cleveland and East Cleveland with \$293,118 in grants this spring, many of which will

be distributed locally.

Neighborhood Connections offers small grants to groups of residents in Cleveland and East Cleveland to do projects that improve the quality of life in their communities. Grants range from \$500 to \$5,000.

Proposals are accepted twice each year on the second Friday in February and August. The next grant deadline is August 10.

The following Neighborhood Connections grants have been awarded to projects in Slavic Village:

• **Broadway Christian Church** - \$3,000 to continue its Summer Reading Program and hire teens in the area to act as tutors.

• **Just For Girls** - \$4,000 for its afterschool program

to provide girls with tutoring, crafts, exercise, social skills and a healthy meal.

• **Skaters Next Door** - \$3,655 to offer skateboarding lessons and host the 11th annual East Meets West Game of Skate.

• **Slavic Village Artist Collective** - \$1,240 (co-funded by Cuyahoga Arts & Culture) to create a network of art gardens with installations by local artists.

• **Speak into the Light** - \$1,500 for its "Don't Be Rude" etiquette class and field trip for youth.

• **Stella Walsh Recreation Center** - \$2,500 for its "Dancing in the Village" program for youth.

• **Village Food Group** - \$3,270 to host The Village Feast for a meal and conversation across boundaries.

ing center based in University Hospitals of Bedford that serves numerous communities in the Northeast Ohio area.

"By adding more cities to that center, our costs are actually going down," Mallis said. "We are going to save probably between \$50,000 and \$60,000 there, and we may make some other decisions. There are some pur-

chases that we were planning to do, improvements, that we're simply going to have to put off for right now. We've made about \$200,000 to \$250,000 in cuts."

Mayor Stan Koci commented, "We do have businesses coming in. Xellia is hiring, they're going to be starting production. It's going to offset some of those jobs."

### Former Chanel property owner to be fined

Before ownership of the former Chanel High School property on Northfield Road transfers to the Bedford City Schools, council passed legislation to collect a total of \$1,700 in fines imposed on the property, due to violations of the false alarm ordinance.

The city has notified Saint Servan Chanel LTD, current owner of the property, that it owes \$600, and Rock Church, an occupant of the premises, that it owes \$1,100, for police response to false alarms, as of February 23, 2018.

Neither Saint Servan nor Rock Church has paid the fines, which will be placed on the property taxes.

### Legislation passed

Council approved two ordinances at last week's meeting, one to purchase a 2018 Ford SUV from Lebanon Ford for \$31,929 to replace a police car that was totaled in an accident, and another to pay North Coast Two-Way Radio \$7,151.90 to purchase and install police equipment in the vehicle.

Three pieces of legislation for lighting improvements on city streets were placed on first reading by council.

Also placed on first reading was an ordinance for assessments for the expense of garbage collection, recycling and disposal. The legislation, if passed by council at a future meeting, would also allow for the costs to be placed on property taxes if the bills are not paid within 30 days of being received.

### Announcements

City officials honored the Bedford V.F.W. with a presentation on their annual "Poppy Days" sales, which helps veterans and their families.


The Rotary Club Rib Fest will be held Friday, June 1, through Sunday, June 3, on the Bedford Commons, Gambosi stated.

The annual Strawberry Festival will be held on Public Square from Friday, June 8, through Sunday, June 10, Councilman Donald Saunders said. There will also be a Car Show planned during the festival on Saturday, June 9.

The fire department will be flushing hydrants in the city throughout the month of June, Mallis said.

WHEREAS, the City of Bedford has previously declared by ordinance various activities to be in violation of the City's False Alarm, and


