## Garfield Hts. residents should get their (trash) cans in gear; violators could face stiff fines

After Garfield Heights Mayor Vic Collova's impassioned plea at last month's council meeting for residents to take responsibility for cutting their own grass, his focus at Monday night's meeting was the garbage can issue.

Collova said Service Director Tim McLaughlin sent foremen in his department out for a month to check on how many garbage cans were not being brought back to houses in a timely fashion. A city ordinance requires that residents bring in their cans at least 12 hours after garbage pickup.

The mayor said trash can violators averaged between 500 and 600 homes per week with the number as high as 770 violators in a one-week period.

"We have to do something about this," Collova said.

He said the city was looking into sending out warnings to all residents before actually issuing tickets to offenders.

"If it costs them (violators) some money, they might start caring," he said.

In his report to council, Police Chief Robert Byrne said the city's dispatch center returned to Garfield Heights as of May 31st. He said residents with emergencies should call 911; the police non-emergency number is now 216-475-1234.

Byrne also said he has received complaints of cars without handicapped placards being parked at the Civic Center in the disabled

parking area across from the center's back entrance. He said violators will now be ticketed.

City Engineer Dave Krock reported that the Granger Road Hill Rock Scaling Project could be behind by three of four months because of a delay with the utility companies moving poles from one side of the road to the other.

Three pieces of legislation were passed by council at Monday night's meeting:

## Woman reports attack in Garfield Park

A woman jogging in Cleveland Metroparks Garfield Park Reservation was attacked by an unidentified suspect on Saturday morning, according to Crime Stoppers of Cuyahoga County.

Around 6:45 a.m. Saturday, June 9, the suspect approached the woman, 54, on an exercise trail near the old boating pond bridge, grabbed her by the throat, and instructed her not to say

anything or he would kill her, according to Crime Stoppers.

A violent struggle ensued during which the suspect overpowered the victim, covered her mouth, and repeatedly punched her in the head.

The victim forcibly bit the suspect's finger, and ultimately the suspect managed to pull his hand free and run from the scene, according to Crime Stoppers.

## Maple Hts. police probe death of husband, wife; possible murder-suicide

The Maple Heights Police Department is investigating the circumstances that led to a man and woman being found dead in a home on Gardenview

Drive Monday morning, according to a press release from MHPD.

On Monday, June 11, around 7:40 a.m., police received a call from a woman who stated her brother called her and told her he had killed his wife and he was going to kill himself, according to the press release. Officers went to a home on Gardenview Drive and attempted to make contact with the residents without success. As the situation unfolded, evidence indicated there may have been shots fired prior to police arrival, according to the release.

The suspect was said to have fled northbound from the park, toward the intersection of Broadway Avenue and Chaincraft Road in Garfield Heights.

The Metroparks report of the incident said the victim was taken to Marymount Hospital with injuries to her arm, mouth and head. She was in stable condition at the time of the report. Potential DNA and trace evidence was collected for analysis.

The suspect is described as a black male in his mid-20s to 30s, approximately 5'8" tall with a thin build, medium length black hair and a short beard or goatee. He had word(s) tattooed above both eyebrows and was wearing a white v-neck tee shirt, pale green shorts and tan leather work boots.

Additionally, the suspect should have a visible, and potentially significant injury to a finger on his right hand from the victim's bite, according to Crime Stoppers.

The South East Area Law Enforcement SWAT Team and Crisis Intervention Team were requested and arrived at the scene. SWAT went into the home and found two people dead, Aclee Dudley, 57, and Arlene Dudley, 56, according to the release. The Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation was called to continue the investigation.

# Ballot issues on law director position placed on first reading in Maple Hts.

Two pieces of legislation to enact charter changes on the position of law director in Maple Heights,

one that would eliminate the mayor's power to appoint and remove those serving in the post and the other mandating that candidates have at least five

years of experience in municipal law, were placed on first reading by city council at its meeting last week.

Currently the mayor has sole power to "appoint and remove or suspend" whoever is serving as law director in the city, according to city ordinances.

One of the proposed charter changes is stated as follows: "The Director of Law shall be appointed annually by the Mayor with the approval of Council, and may be removed only by affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council at any time during that period, provided that such removal shall not impair any contract rights which the Director of Law may possess."

According to current city ordinances, whoever serves as Maple Heights Law Di-

rector must be an attorney admitted to practice in the state of Ohio, and must have been an actively practicing, full time attorney for five years or more.

The other charter change in the proposed legislation states that candidates must have five years or more of "experience in municipal law" and "The municipal law requirement may only be waived by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council."

Both pieces of legislation will be discussed by council before consideration at future meetings. As stated in both ordinances, they must be passed by Friday, September 7, to go to voters on the Tuesday, November 6 ballot.

Passed by council at last week's meeting was a resolution authorizing Engineer Ed Hren to begin preparing plans and go out for bids for the Lee-Libby Pocket Park Project, after the city received a \$50,000

Cuyahoga County grant.

Council also passed a resolution for the city to contract with vendors to provide grass cutting and landscape work at vacant and nuisance properties within all seven districts of the city, at a cost of \$30 per single lot, \$60 per double lot, \$90 per triple lot and \$120 per quad lot.

And also passed was an ordinance to accept titles to four parcels of land obtained through the Cuyahoga County Land Bank on Lincoln Street, Hazelwood Court, Morgan Street and Garfield Avenue.

In the Comments by Citizens portion of the meeting, a Meadowbrook Road resident asked city officials to change existing city regulations to allow her to keep a pig and chickens on she and her husband's property. She said they have foster children and the animals are "therapy" for them and also provide an economical food source.

The city's codified ordinance in this regard states: "No person being the owner or harbinger, or having charge of any horse, mule, cow, sheep, goats, swine, chickens, geese, ducks or any other fowl or animals shall keep, harbor or permit same within the city."


Councilmen Matt Burke and Tom Vaughn said they would work with the resident and perhaps bring the issue to a Legislative or Ways & Means Committee meeting.

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## NOACA awards grants

The Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency (NOACA) Board yesterday approved \$1,787,130 in projects to serve older adults and individuals with disabilities in the area.

Locally, the city of Maple Heights will receive \$84,665 for vehicle replacements, and University Settlement in Slavic Village has been awarded \$42,000, also for vehicle replacements.

The Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program helps communities and organizations purchase wheelchair lift-equipped vehicles, computers and dispatch software to serve the unique transport needs of special populations.

NOACA received 27 total grant requests amounting to nearly \$4.2 million. After a rigorous evaluation, 15 organizations, including transit authorities, municipalities, non-profits, for-profits, and social service agencies, were chosen to receive awards.

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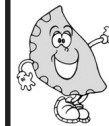

That the whole cost of said improvement, less one-fiftieth thereof, and the cost of intersections shall be assessed by the percentage of the tax valuation on the following described lots and lands. All lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the streets named above between the termini above set forth which lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement. The cost of said improvement shall include the cost and expense of the assessment, and printing, publishing the notices, resolutions and ordinances required, including notices of assessment, the cost of lighting said streets and any other necessary expenditure.

Section 4. That it is hereby determined and provided that notice of the passage of this Resolution and the filing of the estimated assessments under Section 727.12 of the Revised Code, be given by publication of such notice once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Bedford, Ohio and provided for in Section 727.14 of the Revised Code.

Section 5. That the assessments herein provided for shall be collected before the improvement herein provided for shall be completed so that funds may be available for the payment of said improvement.



Section 6. The owner of any property assessed may, at this option, pay such assessment in cash within thirty (30) days after passage of the assessing ordinance.


Section 7. That no bonds or notes shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessments and that the remainder of the entire cost of said improvement shall be paid out of the general fund.

Section 8. This Resolution is hereby determined to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Bedford and for the further reason that it is necessary to provide for such lighting as soon as possible for the general safety and welfare of the citizens of this city and the general public.

WHEREFORE, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage.

Valley View Mayor Jerry Piasecki swore in David Niro as the new police chief for the Village of Valley View at last Tuesday's council meeting. Niro has been with Valley View PD since 1989.

"I came up through the ranks as a patrolman, detective sergeant and deputy chief," said Niro.

He was a member of the Southwest Enforcement Bureau Tactical Unit for 24 years, where he served as regional commander for five years and finished his career with the tactical unit as a hostage negotiator.

Niro is 55, has been married to his wife, Maria, for 27 years and has two children.

"I look forward to continuing the tradition of service to the community demonstrated by the five police chiefs that I worked under," he said.

At the meeting, council passed an ordinance establishing a Tree Service Pro-

complete removal with all stump mulch removed.

Council members authorized that the recreation department receive \$6,000 for the men's and women's softball program, \$6,000 for the flag football program and \$10,000 for the fall 2018 and spring 2019 soccer program.

The Village has also been authorized to hire Terracon Consultants, Inc. to complete a wetlands delineation and mitigation analysis for the Bank Stabilization Project on

Brockway Drive at a cost not to exceed \$25,000.

Members of council also carried a motion to authorize the fire department to purchase 11 sets of turn out gear from Phoenix Fire Safety at a cost not to exceed \$30,000.

Engineer Todd Sciano was authorized by council to prepare plans and specifications and advertise for bids for the Alexander Road Ramps and Portions of Canal Road. The project includes partial funding from Cuyahoga County and is being modified to include a portion of Canal Road between the Mill and first curve north of the North Alexander Road ramp to Canal Road.

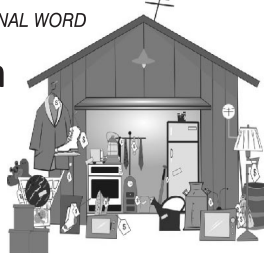

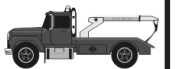
