## Garfield Hts. Council news Controversial law director bill in M.H. on second reading

The following legislation was passed unanimously at Monday night's meeting of Garfield Heights Council:

- Two emergency ordinances authorizing the execution of the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the city and the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association and the Fraternal Order of Police, Lodge 67 (sergeants and above).

- Entering into an agreement with Lexipol, LLC for the updating and maintaining of the Garfield Heights Fire Department policies and procedures.

- Entering into an agreement with Cintas for rental uniforms and facility services.

- Entering into an agreement with System 4 for the regular cleaning of the Garfield Heights Police Department and Municipal Court.

- Adopting the tax budget of the city for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2019, and submitting it to the Cuyahoga County Budget Commission.

Also during the meeting Monday night, an E. 104th Street resident urged council to consider adopting a ban on texting and driving with stiff fines for violators.

City Council President Matt Burke said he agreed with the resident that texting and driving was a serious problem and should be addressed. He said he would call a meeting of either the Safety Committee and/or Legislative Committee to discuss what should be done.

Placed on second reading at the Maple Heights Council meeting last week were two pieces of legislation to enact charter changes concerning the position of law director that may be on the Tuesday, November 6 ballot, if passed on third and final reading in the coming weeks.

One of the charter changes proposes the elimination of the mayor's sole power to appoint and remove those serving in the post; the other mandates that candidates must have at least five years' experience in municipal law.

According to the city's current ordinances, the mayor has sole power to "appoint and remove or suspend" whomever is serving as law director in the city.

Legislation on the proposed charter changes states, "The Director of Law shall be appointed annually by the Mayor with the approval of Council, and may be removed only by affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council at any time during that period, provided that such removal shall not impair any contract rights which the Director of Law may possess."

Current ordinances stipulate that the individual chosen to serve as law director must be an attorney admitted to practice in the state of Ohio, and must have been an actively practicing, full time attorney for five years or more.

The other proposed charter amendment states that candidates must have five years or more experience in municipal law, and the municipal law requirement may only be waived by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of council.

Placing the ordinances on second reading will allow council to discuss them in depth before consideration at a future meeting. The legislation states that both of them have to be passed by Friday, September 7, for appearance on the November 6 ballot.

### Lee Road repairs

Lee Road South is expected to be repaired soon, as council passed legislation last week accepting a \$150,000 grant from Cuyahoga County to fund the improvement project.

The resolution authorizes city officials to begin preparing plans and specifications and to advertise for bids for the Lee Road South repair project. Mayor Annette Blackwell and City Engineer Ed Hren filed for the Community Development Block Grant for the project in June.

The county recommended that Maple Heights be awarded the \$150,000 grant.

# Bedford Council ok's \$410K for street improvement projects

Several streets in the city of Bedford will receive a much needed facelift this summer. Council passed an ordinance at its meeting last week to approve a \$410,000 contract with Ronyak Paving for the 2018 Street Improvement Program.

Streets to be repaved include Eldred, Gould and Wandle, all from Southwick to Grand; the entirety of Mitchell, Wheelock and Powers; the section of Lee Road South located in Bedford; roads located in the Bedford Cemetery; and crack sealing on Columbus and Rockside roads, city officials stated.

The Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works will reimburse the city \$25,000 for the crack sealing part of the project.

City Manager Mike Mallis stated that some of the roads had not been repaved in almost 30 years and

credited voters' passage of a .75 percent income tax increase last year for helping to raise the much needed funding for the project.

The work will be done as soon as possible, Mallis said. "And then we'll be back at it next year, and it'll be year after year. It'll take us a little while to get caught up."

He said crews will also be going out to determine which sidewalks in the city need repairs and this work will begin this year as well.

A sinkhole located in the vicinity of the Sunoco gas station at Northfield and Union streets will be fixed, after council approved legislation to accept a proposal from Northeast Ohio Trench for the repairs, at a cost of \$21,905.

## Septic service

Council passed legislation for the city to accept a proposal from Walt Kucharski Septic Service Inc. for sludge removal at the wastewater treatment plant at a cost of \$37,950, to complete improvements to the plant's digester.

"There was an issue with the mixing system which is installed in our large digester," Mallis said. "The manufacturer and the installer will come in and make the necessary repairs, at their cost, and actually upgrade the mixing system in that digester."

## Cell phone legislation passed

In recognition of an Ohio House bill that will go into

effect on July 31, council passed an ordinance enacting a new chapter, "Use of Public Ways for Small Cell Wireless Facilities and Wireless Support Structures," which will provide standards for construction, installation and operation of facilities for wireless phones in the city, to "preserve the character of the city, including neighborhoods, downtown and historic districts."

Fees for applications will be \$250 each, adjusted by 10 percent every five years, and annual fees for each facility will also be \$250 each, also adjusted by 10 percent every five years, according to the legislation.


Law Director John Montello stated, "The state legislature is trying to take control of those small cell wireless facilities and wireless support structures, but they are allowing facilities to enact guidelines and laws to protect their interests. This is our attempt to ensure we'll return some home rule over the use of small cell wireless facilities and wireless support structures... This gives the city more control over your construction of these facilities."

Mayor Stan Koci explained that the average size for small cell equipment is 28 cubic feet, the size of a refrigerator, which will hang on poles all over the city. He said that's why it is important to regulate them.

## Other legislation passed

Council passed an ordinance to adjust the 2018 budget. Finance Director Frank Gambosi explained that due to Bedford joining the Chagrin Valley Dispatch Center, the city would be saving about \$65,000. There will also be transfer of \$150,000 in funds in response to the loss of revenue caused by the closing of US Bank's mortgage facility in the city this month, Gambosi said.

### New salt facility

Council passed a resolution for Blackwell to enter into a contract with Caves Road Construction Co., at a cost of \$202,972.30, to build a second new salt storage facility at the Dunham Road Service Center.

Caves built the first new salt storage facility in 2017.

Storage of salt can release pollutants into storm sewers that can end up in the state's waterways. Building a new facility will reduce the potential amount of salt released and also fulfill the Ohio EPA's permit requirements to provide effective storm water management, according to the legislation.

The earliest start date for the project is Monday, July 16, with a completion time frame of 75 days, Hren stated.

Also passed by council was

an ordinance adopting the Alternative Tax Budget Information for the city, for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2019.

The tax budget information will be submitted to the Budget Commission of Cuyahoga County and enable the county to certify tax rates to the city by September 1, 2018 as required by state law.

Also passed was legislation to adopt the Bedford Law Enforcement Trust Fund Internal Control Expenditure Policy to conform with Ohio Revised Code. This was passed to address expenditures related to the purchase of a police K-9 officer, which assists the police department in drug enforcement and other duties, Mallis stated.

A resolution requesting the Cuyahoga County Auditor's Office to advance the city its tax revenues from 2018 was approved, as were ordinances to declare 129 Greencroft Avenue a nuisance, and to condemn a property at 188 Greencroft.

Council approved a motion to accept the Planning Commission's recommendation for Charles Miller, an architect who is representing Gus Kafantaris, owner of Chris' Restaurant, 84 Broadway Ave., on a proposal to construct a 96 square-foot addition on the south end of the building to enclose a new walk-in cooler.

### GARFIELD HTS.

#### Aggravated Robbery
