Rooms to Let returns to Village this weekend

This Saturday from noon to 7 p.m., and Sunday from noon to 5 p.m., the next generation of Rooms to Let: CLE will kick off its fifth year of transforming vacant Slavic Village houses with innovative art installations.

Led by Slavic Village Development, dozens of local artists and makers will create one-of-a-kind works in three vacant homes slated for demolition.

An event headquarters will be located in the Slavic Village Lavender Garden, 6520 Sebert Ave., where attendees will find enjoy music and food. Hands on interactive installations will be found outside the houses and on vacant lots.

Three vacant homes in Slavic Village will be transformed room by room by artist Dana Depew, artist and neighborhood resident Scott Pickering, and The Visit Arts Collective at 6720 Forman Ave., 6806 Fleet Ave. and 6904 Fleet Ave.

Preceding Rooms To Let, artists, community members and volunteers will come together for a street cleanup, fix-a-thon, and a community art project led by the Better Block Foundation to further improve the neighborhood landscape this Friday, July 27, from 5-9 p.m. at the intersection of East 65th and Fleet Avenue.

Fugitive of the Week Garfield Hts. Council votes to put charter changes on Nov. ballot

The Garfield Heights Charter Review Committee has recommended several changes to the City Charter and ordinances to address those changes were all passed Monday night at a special meeting of council, with one exception.

All ordinances dealing with charter changes passed by council will go to Garfield Heights voters for approval or rejection on the November 6, 2018 ballot.

Charter changes approved by council Monday night which will go to the voters include:

- Prohibiting first term council members from holding the office of President Pro Tem.
- Prohibiting first term council members from holding the office of President of Council.
- Making it mandatory for council candidates to be five-year residents of the city and three-year residents of the ward they seek to represent.
- Making it mandatory for mayoral candidates to be five-year residents of the city.
- Amending Section 8 of the Garfield Heights City Charter relative to redistricting boundaries for wards.

The only charter change to be voted down by council was relative to appointing alternate members of the Charter Review Committee and setting a time limit for appointments to the Charter Review Committee.

Ward 4 Councilman Eugene Glenn voted against almost all the charter changes Monday night. He took exception to the fact that all the changes were "emergency" ordinances and insisted they were not emergencies and should have the required three readings.

He also objected to council members not being given the minutes of the Charter Review Committee meetings to study the changes proposed. His objections were echoed by Ward 5 Councilman Joseph Suster, who said he didn't agree with "90 percent of what the committee changed."

Ward 1 Councilman Michael Dudley, Sr. voiced his concerns in requiring mayoral candidates to be five-year residents of the city, saying it could result in a loss of some potentially good candidates. He did, however, vote for the charter change.

Law Director Tim Riley explained to council that minutes of the Charter Review Committee "have been available for weeks," but were not given to council members unless requested because it was not a council committee.

Mayor Vic Collova pointed out that all members of council had been invited to the last Charter Review Committee meeting, so if they didn't attend it was their choice.

The Northern Ohio Fugitive Task Force is offering a reward for information which would lead to the capture of fugitive Gianni Gray.

Gray, 35, is a black male, standing approximately 6'4" and weighing 235 pounds. He has ties throughout Garfield Heights and the west side of Cleveland.

Gray is wanted by the United States Marshals Service and Cleveland Division of Police for aggravated murder. It is alleged that Gray fatally shot two men in a vehicle on the West 117th Street exit ramp off I-90 on July 14th, around 7:30 p.m.

Closing of I-77 between I-490 and I-480 rescheduled

The following closures will take place on I-77 to install bridge concrete beams at Broadway Avenue and steel bridge beams erection at the SR 21 ramp beginning Friday, July 27, at 8 p.m. through Monday, July 30, at 6 a.m. All motorists will be detoured to SR 176.

I-77 northbound at I-480; I-77 southbound at I-490; I-480 east and westbound ramp to I-77 north; I-490 east and westbound ramps to I-77 south. I-77 southbound at the SR 21 exit ramp.

The closure was originally scheduled to begin Friday, July 20, but was cancelled due to inclement weather in the forecast. The new dates are also tentative.

Maple Hts. Council to meet tonight

Maple Heights Council will hold a special meeting at 6:30 p.m. tonight, Wednesday, July 25, at the Maple Heights Senior Center, 15901 Libby Rd., to discuss two pieces of legislation, one regarding use of public properties and rights of way for small cell wireless facilities and wireless support structures in the city, and the other to consider new design standards and guidelines for small cell equipment.

Both ordinances, which will give the city more control over the installation and appearance of cell phone equipment, must be passed before Tuesday, July 31, when Ohio House Bill 480 goes into effect, Law Director Frank Consolo stated, in a memorandum to Mayor Annette Blackwell and council members explaining the reason for the legislation.

Telecommunications companies, including AT&T, Verizon, Sprint and T-Mobile, had proposed legislation seeking to amend the

Ohio Revised Code "to eliminate the authority of municipalities to regulate small cell facilities and related equipment on public property and rights of way," Consolo stated. He said the proposal would have given cell phone service providers "nearly unrestricted access to any municipal structure that can support a wireless antenna - street lights, stop signs, water towers, public right of way, utility poles, etc., and prohibit municipalities from recovering their costs in many cases."

Consequently, several communities have filed a lawsuit claiming that the initial proposal was unconstitutional because it violates the home rule amendment to the Ohio Constitution, according to Consolo.

The state responded to the litigation by allowing municipalities to establish design guidelines that ensure the installation of these facilities has minimal impact on local communities, Consolo stated, adding that since the House Bill goes into effect on July 31, municipalities are encouraged to adopt their local regula-

tions and guidelines before then.

Also to be considered by the council will be appeals of two separate decisions by the Planning and Zoning Commission, regarding 19807 Libby Rd., and 5709 Dunham Rd., in the city, Council President Ron Jack-

son stated. The public is welcome to attend.

Immediately following the special council meeting tonight, Councilwoman Sharrri Thomas, chair of the Housing/Economic Development Committee, said there will be a committee meeting held at the Senior Center to discuss rental registration legislation and other city housing business.

•The trial of Monte Woodley, the man accused of murdering his wife, Lavora Allen, in Garfield Heights last May, was rescheduled for reasons unknown according to Cuyahoga County Court records.

Woodley's trial was scheduled for Wednesday, July 18, with Judge Dick Ambrose. It has been rescheduled for October 1st.

•Courtney Alfred, an administrator at a Bedford alternative school accused of having an inappropriate relationship with a student, recently changed her plea from not guilty to guilty, and will be sentenced on August 21st, according to Cuyahoga County Court records.

•Leonidas Knox, 24, of Cleveland, was recently sentenced to three years in the Lorain Correctional Institution for robbery with firearm specifications.

The charge stemmed from an incident at Valleyfield East Apartments in Bedford in February. It was reported

that Knox tried to rob two men in the parking lot and shot at them when they wouldn't give him money. The victims physically fought Knox off, and police later arrested him.

Editorial:

Good, Bad & the Ugly

Here's our take on what's been happening recently in the NN readership area.

GOOD: The Slavic Village property on which the powerhouse for the massive Cleveland Worsted Mill Co. complex once stood will soon have a new life as a nature preserve and outdoor learning center. Neighborhood organizations, including Boys & Girls Clubs of Cleveland, the City of Cleveland, Cleveland Metropolitan School District, Slavic Village Development and West Creek Conservancy, have secured funding to create the 4-acre Morgana

Bluff Nature Preserve and Learning Center on Broadway Avenue. Morgana Run Trail runs between the planned preserve and the remaining part of the mill site, now the Boys & Girls Clubs headquarters.

Construction is expected to start in August and be completed in fall 2019.

The project will be funded entirely with money from the state's Clean Ohio Greenspace Conservation Fund (\$300,000) and a Green Infrastructure Grant from the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (\$240,000). It will have ADA-compliant trails and boardwalks and will be accessible to more than 1,700 area children.

Third Federal Foundation has agreed to provide \$25,000 for maintenance and upkeep.

NN readers write

BAD: A Garfield Heights resident emailed - "In speaking with our neighbors, one of the big disappointments is that inconsiderate people litter all the time. Daily we are out there cleaning our streets and sidewalks on Edgepark.

BAD: Another voice on litter - "So what happened to the good people that never, ever thought of throwing litter down on the streets, sidewalks, out of car windows, all over the place? When did so many of us lose our community sense of pride in place, neighborhood and in hometown no matter whose hometown?"

MORE BAD: A Garfield Heights resident writes - "If Cuyahoga Heights was able to determine when someone's car radio is too loud, Garfield Heights can do the same. We need an ordinance to keep the noise level down after dark - and even during the day. The 'music' being played is so vulgar and morally demeaning. I wouldn't want my children hearing these blaring obscenities. And yet they are being BLASTED from their cars." (See

GOOD: Jeff Jerome in the Garfield Heights Law Department assures The Neighborhood News there is a noise ordinance in Garfield Heights and that one of the many noises it prohibits is loud music. Garfield Heights Codified Ordinance 535.02, No. 11, makes the following illegal: "The operating, playing or permitting the playing of any radio, television, musical instrument, sound amplifier or similar device or the sound of human communication, at any time, at a volume that disturbs a person of reasonable sensibilities." GARFIELD HEIGHTS

Arson

Police were dispatched to an active house fire in the 4900 block of Orchard Rd. on July 17th, around 2:50 a.m. The home was unoccupied, and police spoke to the renter who said he uses the house for business purposes only and for storage and paperwork. The Fire Marshals were to inspect the property for an official cause but arson is suspected.

Breaking & Entering

An employee of Affordable Uniforms in Turneytown Shopping Center told police she arrived at work on July 12th, around 8 a.m., and found the front door unlocked. Inside police found two cash registers had been opened and the money had been stolen, clothing was on the floor and three office desks had been rummaged through. OVI

On July 18th, around 1:40 a.m., an officer saw a truck that was stopped on Antenucci Blvd. at Turney Rd. blocking the flow of traffic. The truck was running and the driver was slumped over the wheel sleeping. He was awakened and got out of the truck. Police smelled alcohol on the man's breath and he failed several field sobriety tests and was arrested. Inside the car police found several opened and partially consumed containers of alcohol.

At City Jail the man threatened a police officer and was placed in a holding cell. He was given a breath test which registered .155% blood alcohol concentration, nearly double the legal limit. Police said the man has three prior OVI convictions within 10 years. He faces felony OVI charges.
