Independence Council votes to send charter changes to electorate

At a special meeting of Independence Council last week, four charter changes recommended by the Charter Review Committee were on the agenda, three of which will go to voters on the November ballot.

Council voted to send to the electorate the question of whether the charter should be amended to allow council to approve or reject any Planned Use Development in the city as described in Chapters 1182 or 1183 of the Codified Ordinances without going to the electorate.

In its present form, Article IV, Section 5(d) of the charter under the heading "Zoning of Lands for Multiple Family Dwellings, and Attached Single-Family Dwellings or Cluster Subdivisions," states that a zoning ordinance on these uses, once approved by council, "shall be certified to the Board of Elections to be submitted to the electors at the next general or regular election occurring more than ninety (90) days after such certification. Provided, however, that without approval or rejection of any such ordinance, Council may also vote to submit such ordinance to the electors for approval or rejection at the next general or regular municipal election occurring more than ninety (90) days after certification to the Board of Elections. Such submitted ordinance shall not become effective unless it shall be approved by a majority of the electors voting upon such ordinance.

The proposed amendment would eliminate the need for voter approval in the cases of Planned Use Developments.

Council also will send to voters in November a charter change that would increase the amount the city could spend on purchases without public bidding from \$7,500 to \$15,000.

And finally, Independence voters will also decide if they want to change the charter regarding appointment of a finance director, if the position becomes vacant and the mayor fills the vacancy by appointment. Currently the charter provides that the appointed finance director shall serve for the unexpired term. Under the proposed amendment, the finance director would serve until the next general election occurring more than 90 days after being appointed.

Council voted not to advance Ordinance 2018-105 regarding the minimum qualifications of the finance director to the November ballot.

Officials suspect arson is cause of E. 97th house fires

Garfield Heights police and fire officials, along with state and city fire marshals, are investigating two house fires on East 97th Street as arson. Residents were home at the time of the fire but no one was injured.

Police and fire units were dispatched to a house fire in the 4800 block of E. 97th St. on August 5th, around 5:30 a.m., and found evidence of a "molotov cocktail" at the residence, leaving police and fire officials to investigate the fire as arson.

A witness outside just before the fire started said she saw three males near the home and heard loud noises, then saw two males run in one direction and the third run in the opposite direction; the third male was limping. She told police one of the suspects was wearing a gray sweatsuit.

As police were searching the area for suspects they saw a teen in a gray sweatsuit walking southbound on Turney Rd., who a witness positively identified as one of the males at the scene of the fire. He was arrested and taken to City Jail. The male refused to identify himself at the jail, but once in a holding cell, he told police his name and information. Police learned he was a 17-year-old Cleveland resident.

His clothing and cell phone were collected as evidence and turned over to the State Fire Marshal for further investigation.

Fire officials said a second fire, potentially arson, was reported at a home next door in the early morning hours of Tuesday, Aug. 7. Further information was not available as of press time

Bill on law director rules change voted down in M.H.

Two pieces of legislation that would have given Maple Heights voters the chance to decide on charter changes on the position of law director, one to eliminate the sole power of the mayor to appoint and remove those serving in the post, the other mandating that candidates must have at least five years' experience in municipal law, failed to gain enough votes from council at its regular meeting last week to appear on the November ballot.

Law Director Frank Consolo and Council Clerk Leonette Cicirella both confirmed that neither ordinance, both of which were introduced by Councilman Stafford Shenett, Sr., gained the required five "yes" votes that would have authorized Cicirella to submit the proposed charter changes to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections for the Tuesday, Nov. 6 election.

Current city ordinances state that the mayor has sole power to "appoint and remove and suspend" whomever is serving as law director in the city.

One of the proposed charter changes stated that anyone appointed annually by the mayor also had to have council's approval; also, the law director could be removed only by an affirmative vote of two thirds of council during that time, "provided that such removal shall not impair any contract rights which the Director of Law may possess."

The other proposed charter amendment that failed to gain enough council votes stated that candidates for the position of law director must have five years or more experience in municipal law, and the municipal law requirement may only be waived by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of council.

Current ordinances stipulate that anyone chosen to serve as law director in Maple Heights must be an attorney licensed to practice in the state of Ohio, and must have been an actively practicing, full time attorney for five years or more. This will continue unchanged, following council's decision last week.

Cell legislation passes

At its meeting last week council passed two ordinances regarding use of public properties and rights of way for small cell wireless facilities and wireless support structures in the city and new design standards and guidelines for small cell equipment.

Council's passage of the new ordinance on August 1, will override the state law now in effect, but will not be retroactive, Consolo stated.

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Other legislation approved

Council approved a resolution authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell to enter into a contract with Ronyak Paving Inc., for the Lee Road South Pavement Repair project, at a cost of \$167,200. This follows the city's recent \$150,000 Community Development Block Grant award by the Cuyahoga County Department of Development, which will go towards funding the project.

The project will include repairs to the asphalt pavement on Lee Road South, between Rockside and Turney roads, and also the repair and sealing of joints in the concrete pavement between Turney and Woodbrook

Also approved was a resolution for the city to enter into a fuel supply agreement with the Maple Heights City School District, allowing the district to purchase diesel and unleaded fuel from the city for the district's vehicles.



Council approved a resolution for a contract with Dobbs Landscaping to assist the service department on lawn mowing and landscape work on city-owned lots for

Garfield Heights detectives are investigating the shooting death of a 52-year-old man near East 131st Street and Rexwood Avenue, according to GHPD Detective Sergeant Todd Cramer.

On July 28th, around 11:45 p.m., Garfield Heights officers found the victim seated in his vehicle on East 131st at Rexwood Avenue with a gunshot to the chest, according to Cramer. Awitness said that the vehicle was traveling southbound on East 131st at a slow speed, then went over the curb and struck the utility pole in that intersection. Cramer said the victim was taken to the hospital were he later died.
