Bedford to seek grant for major Broadway project

Plans are underway for a grant application to the Ohio Public Works Commission for a significant improvement project for Broadway Avenue in Bedford, City Manager Mike Mallis announced at the city council meeting last week.

Mallis was addressing plans by Dominion to replace gas lines in the city, including in the Broadway area, earmarked for 2019, and stated the importance of staying on schedule with those plans. "The reason why it's important that Broadway does not get pushed back is we're actually working on a large scale grant application for street resurfacing, all new water lines, electrical repairs, all downtown Broadway as well as Union Street.

Mallis said that a portion of grant funding was still available through the Bedford Community Development Corporation that could be used by small businesses in the Broadway corridor for physical improvements.

He said that any local business looking to do signage, painting, windows, doors and more should get in touch

Garfield wants to close Topicz bar

Garfield Heights Council is hoping that the liquor license of Topicz Sports Lounge, 11321 Broadway Ave., will not be renewed by the Department of Liquor Control in Columbus. It passed an emergency resolution at its regular meeting Monday night objecting to the renewal and asked the Department of Liquor Control to schedule a hearing on the objection.

Topicz has been the scene of several police calls in the past, the most serious being last February when six people were shot and one found dead on the sidewalk in front of the bar.

- Seeking grant funding for the Multi-Street Reconstruction & Waterline Replacement Project, Phase 5.

- Certifying special assessments for lots at CityView.

- Hiring additional housing inspectors.

- Authorizing unpaid fees for cutting of grass and high weeds be placed on property tax bills.

- Authorizing unpaid fees for garbage and refuse collection be placed on property tax bills.

- Contracting with Teletronics, Inc. to provide Wide Area Network (WAN) support.

- Requesting financial

help from Cuyahoga County for the resurfacing of East 131st Street.

- Authorizing the mayor to enter into negotiations for the purchase of two parcels of land for the Justice Center Project at CityView.

- Ratifying the appointment of Frank Tagliarini as a member of the Zoning Board of Appeals to fill the unexpired term of David Mays.

- Urging the Ohio governor and members of the Ohio General Assembly to invest the state budget surplus in municipalities.

In his report to council, Mayor Vic Collova gave a special thanks to Pompili Precast Concrete for its donation of a bench at Veterans Plaza and to all the local businesses, vendors, safety forces, volunteers and residents who visited Sunday's Summerfest at the Garfield Heights Civic Center and made it such a great success.

CPD still investigating teen homicides; seeks information from public

Cleveland police are still searching for suspects in the shooting death of Andrew Hart and the hit-and-run death of David Bourne, Jr.

Hart, 18, was shot in the head in the East 65th Street and Kenyon Avenue area in Slavic Village on New Year's Eve, according to information provided by Cleveland police. He was taken to MetroHealth Medical Center where he was pronounced dead.

"Andrew was a very special person to the community that he lived in," said a friend of Hart's. "He tried to help everyone around him. He was a very happy and cheerful person to be around."

Bourne, 15, was struck by a car and killed while walking in the 6800 block of Union Avenue on June 13th and was taken MetroHealth Medical Center where he died from his injuries. Police are still searching for the driver.

with the city's Economic Development office for assistance with the application.

The city manager also reported that Bedford had provided a letter of support for the Simon's Supermarket chain, which is planning on opening another branch in the Meadowbrook Shopping Center at Northfield and Rockside roads.

Police officers sworn in

Mayor Stan Koci swore in two new police officers at the meeting, Jordan Fisher and Matthew Ganska. Both will serve the city in the rank of patrolman.

Legislation on agenda

Council passed several pieces of legislation at last week's meeting, including an ordinance to appropriate \$45,000 in funds to the Bedford Community Development Corporation to fund the Broadway Corridor Storefront Pilot Program. The city will be reimbursed the funds from the county later this year.

Also passed were ordinances accepting a proposal with 64 Seconds for a GIS (Geographic Information System) and Asset Management program for the city's water and sewer distribution systems for three years, at a cost of \$11,668.82; a contract with ProudCity for development

of the city's website at a cost of \$5,569; accepting the proposal of J.D. Striping and Service Inc. for longline striping of city streets at a cost of \$18,460.24; accepting the proposal of NextGen Restoration Inc., for drop ceiling and drywall repairs caused by asbestos abatement at Ellenwood Recreation Center, at a cost of \$47,525; accepting the proposal of Gardiner to replace two rooftop compressors at City Hall, at a cost of \$15,504; approving additional sludge removal at the city's wastewater treatment plant to complete digester improvements.

Council also passed three ordinances to levy assessments for the following: delinquent water bills; failure to pay for violations of the criminal activity nuisance ordinance on properties; and failure to pay for false alarm responses. The assessments will go on county property tax bills. Council also approved a motion to reappoint Krisi Glazer to a three-year term to the Board of Zoning Appeals.

Two ordinances were placed on first reading, one to accept a proposal of Cummins Sales and Service for the service garage generator (\$24,842), and the other to accept a proposal of All Phase Service Company to install the generator (\$4,900).

Placed on second reading was legislation to amend the city's parking ordinance. The amendment states that tickets issued for parking in prohibited areas and on lawns may be waived within 72 hours by paying a \$25 fine. If not paid within 72 hours, the fine will be increased to \$50. Additional fines of up to \$150 and costs will be imposed if court action is necessary, according to the legislation, which also states that the fine for handicapped parking violations is \$250.

The Village of Cuyahoga Heights Council met last Wednesday and passed legislation to create the position of assistant service director in the Service Department and eliminated the position of foreman.

Jeff Baciak was appointed as assistant service director for the village.

Change orders were approved for an additional \$7875 for pavement repairs on Harvard Avenue, and \$5460 more for road work at Nicky Boulevard.

Also passed was a Memorandum of Understanding with the Fraternal Order of Police - Dispatchers, to provide additional compensatory time during a limited period.

A resolution was okayed to enter into a contract for the purchase of property located at 4945 E. 72nd Place.

Legislation was also passed to permit the installation of a central air conditioning unit as an interior qualifying improvement under the George Suhy Grant Program.

In the Communications section of the meeting, a letter to Mayor Jack Bacci was read from Megan Vitanza thanking everyone for awarding her the Cuyahoga Heights Village Scholarship. She will be attending Wright State University to pursue a degree in Sports Science and Pre-Chiropractic.

Rep. Marcia Fudge, local civic leaders highlight workforce development in libraries



U.S. Congresswoman Marcia Fudge was the keynote speaker last Wednesday at a special library symposium at Rakuten OverDrive in Garfield Heights.

Last Wednesday, August 8, Rep. Marcia Fudge, along with a panel of Cleveland area business and civic leaders, discussed the role of libraries in developing the workforce at an event hosted

by Rakuten OverDrive at its world headquarters in Garfield Heights.

Panelists included: Ryan Burgess, Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation; Shontel Brown, Cuyahoga County Council; Jeff Patterson, Cuyahoga County Metropolitan Housing Authority; Denise Reading, GetWorkerFit; and Mick Munoz, Tri-C Veterans Initiative.

Rep. Fudge, who serves on the House Committee on Education and the Workforce, delivered the keynote address. Senator Rob Portman also presented via a prerecorded video.

The event was sponsored by the Cleveland Public Library, Cuyahoga County Public Library, Ohio Library Council, Rakuten OverDrive and the American Library Association.
