Slavic Village music festival to hold Friday finale at Dan Kane Park

Slavic Village's Iron Ward Music Festival concludes its fourteenth summer concert series this week. The Goodbye Summer Party is this Friday evening, August 31st, beginning at 7 p.m., at Dan Kane Park, East 65th Street and Kenyon Avenue, just south of Broadway. The event has been moved from its regular Monday time slot to Friday to better accommodate school-aged children and working adults. MHPD investigates shooting

Maple Heights police are investigating a shooting in the 14400 block of Tokay Ave. that occurred last Wednesday, according to a press release from Police Chief Todd Hansen.

Around 7:17 p.m. on August 22nd, MHPD received a call from Cleveland EMS reporting that someone had been shot near 14423 Tokay Ave. Upon speaking with the original caller, it was reported that a male had been shot in the leg and that numerous youths were running from the area.

The victim, Benjamin McLeod, 22, was later found in the 14400 block of Reddington Avenue with a non-lifethreatening wound and was taken to South Pointe Medical Center where he was treated and released, police said.

For months rumors have been flying around Garfield Heights that Ikea, a Swedish furniture retailer with stores all over the world, was coming to Bridgeview Crossing. Mayor Vic Collova confirmed to The Neighborhood News Monday that it isn't going to happen.

In a conference call received by Mayor Collova last Thursday from Bridgeview Crossing developer Steve Craig of Craig Realty Group and an Ikea representative, it was made clear that Ikea had taken Bridgeview off its list for future expansion.

Collova said Craig had given Ikea an August deadline to decide about Bridgeview, as he was anxious to find other tenants if Ikea was going elsewhere. The mayor said Ikea stated a "wetlands issue" was one of the reasons it had rejected the Bridgeview Crossing site.

"There is no wetlands issue at Bridgeview," Mayor Collova told The Neighborhood News. "It was just a total excuse."

He said that he was "extremely disappointed" that Ikea's plans no longer include Bridgeview and was not sure of the direction Craig will now take with the property.

Craig Realty Group has financed widening of the bridge over I-480 at Bridgeview and adding turning lanes on Granger Road in anticipation of the site's development. A request for more information from Craig Realty Group Monday went unanswered as of press time Tuesday.

Woman held in CVS robbery on Harvard

A 28-year-old Cleveland woman was arrested Saturday in connection with a robbery at the CVS store at 6301 Harvard Ave. in Slavic Village, according to a Cleveland police report.

Officers were dispatched to the CVS on August 25th, around 6:30 a.m., and found someone had broken through the wall of the store, then cut a hole in a safe and had stolen money from the safe. The cash contained a tracking device, which police followed to the area of E. 95th St. and Pratt Ave.

A woman in that area was walking in the street towards a home she claimed was her own in the 9600 block of Pratt. Police asked her to sit in the back of the police cruiser for her safety, saying a suspect in a robbery may be near the home. Police said that the woman was carrying a backpack/purse, and inside officers could see it was stuffed with varying denominations of cash, according to the report. Dispatch then said the money tracker was in the 9600 block of Pratt and the woman was arrested.

In the driveway of the same home on Pratt Ave. the woman said she was headed to, police found a vehicle that had varying denominations of cash inside of it and around it on the ground outside. Various tools were also found in the car as well as a used grinding wheel in the foot well of the driver's area. More cash was found in the trunk.

The woman was to be charged with breaking and entering and safecracking. Fourth District detectives are continuing the investigation.

After the report on August 20th, police searched the area again and found the vehicle unoccupied on Horton Rd. Officers eventually spoke to a man who had admitted he was driving the car and had been parked on Blythin. He was identified as a 69-year-old Cleveland resident, He told police he frequently stops near the day care but denied taking pictures of children. Police reported that while speaking to the man, he began deleting photos from his phone. He was then handcuffed and detained while the investigation continued.

Two employees of the day care were separated and positively identified the man as the driver of the red vehicle. He was arrested and taken to City Jail. Police said a search of the man's phone did not reveal any photos of children. He was charged with public indecency and held on a \$2500 bond.

Police were dispatched to the area of Garfield Blvd. and E. 96th St. on August 26th, around 10:30 p.m., and observed a car weaving in and out of lanes on the Boulevard. Police pulled the driver over and smelled alcohol on his person. He was also concealing a knife on his right hip with his hand. He was asked if there were any other weapons on him and he said no. He was identified as a 34-year-old Garfield Heights resident, and during a pat-down police found a loaded gun in his pocket. A check through LEADS confirmed the gun was entered stolen out of Oakwood Village.

The man was arrested and provided a breath sample which registered .246% blood alcohol content, which is over three times the legal limit of .08%. He was held at City Jail for carrying a concealed weapon, weapons while intoxicated, receiving stolen property and operating a vehicle while intoxicated. Police said he had a prior OVI conviction in 2016.





Slavic Village streets scheduled for repaying; traffic to be maintained

Local street resurfacing has started on several streets in Ward 12's Slavic Village, Councilman Tony Brancatelli has announced.

The following streets are scheduled for resurfacing: East 65th Street from Fleet to Broadway avenues; East 82nd Street from Harvard to Finney avenues; Finney Avenue from its west end to East 82nd Street; East 75th Street from Worley to Canton avenues: Gertrude Avenue from East 71st to East 65th streets; East 78th Street from Spafford Road to Broadway Avenue.

One lane will be maintained for local traffic for the duration of the project and no detours are expected. Access to all businesses, residences and side streets will be maintained during construction; on-street parking will not be allowed.

"Thank you for your patience during the construction projects," Brancatelli said. "You will be inconvenienced for a short time but the long term improvements will be worth the effort. Between our local paving project as well as improvements for main streets, such as the Broadway Avenue bypass road, we will see millions invested in our infrastructure.'

He said this year the engineering design will also begin for rebuilding East 55th from Broadway Avenue to Harvard Avenue through the use of NOACA Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) funds.
