Cleveland police probe shooting on playground at Willow Elementary

Cleveland police are investigating a shooting of a 30-year-old Cleveland resident on the playground of Willow Elementary School last week, according to a Cleveland police report.

On August 30th, around 6:15 p.m., police were dispatched to Willow Elementary School, 5013 Finn Ave., for a male shot. When they arrived there was no one at the school but police found blood splattered on the playground's basketball court leading to Finn Avenue and several spent shell casings on the street.

Officers spoke to a nearby resident who said she heard 6-7 gunshots and then saw a young male getting carried into a dark-colored SUV. A second witness said he saw a dark-colored car driving down Finn towards Broadway occupied by one male before seeing the victim get put into the SUV, according to the report.

Police were then notified that a 30-year-old male arrived at MetroHealth Medical Center and MetroHealth PD had the driver of the SUV and a passenger in custody.

Officers spoke to the victim who said he "was just hanging out" at the playground when a black car pulled up. He said the driver got out of the car and began shooting at him without saying a word.

The passenger of the SUV told police he had been walking down the street when he saw the man get shot so he helped him into the SUV driven by the other male. The SUV passenger was initially uncooperative with police and gave several false names before identifying himself. He was arrested and charged with obstructing official business.

Detectives were to continue investigating the shooting.

Cuy. County residents can submit appeals to property reappraisals

Following the sexennial reappraisal and concerns from property owners that their property values have risen, Cuyahoga County has extended the informal appeal process. Residents now have until September 14th to file an informal appeal.

Residents who are concerned that their property values may have been overestimated can appeal to the Cuyahoga County fiscal office by going online or by calling 216-443-4663 (HOME).

If you are not able to appeal informally by September 14th, don't worry. You may still file a formal appeal with the County Board of Revision between January 1st and March 31st, 2019.

Investigators seek tips in series of Garfield Hts. fires; up to \$5000 reward offered

The Division of State Fire Marshal's Fire and Explosion Investigation Bureau is seeking tips from the public regarding four residential fires in Garfield Heights. Due to the locations, officials believe they may all be connected.

The first incident occurred in the early morning hours of August 3rd when at least one person broke into the backyard of 4886 E. 97th St. and used an unknown liquid in an attempt to ignite the rear porch but was unsuccessful. The home owner was out of town at the time of the incident. A doorbell camera captured footage of the suspect.

Four days later, at the same residence, the owners were inside their home at approximately 2:30 a.m. when an unknown suspect threw a device through a window and set the house on fire. All occupants escaped the home unharmed.

On August 5th, neighbors witnessed three males using gasoline to set fire to the back of the home at 4892 E. 97th St. at approximately 5:30 a.m. One of the three suspects was arrested a few blocks from the scene.

The fourth incident occurred at approximately 6 a.m. August 26th when an unknown suspect threw a device through the front window of 12808 Thraves Rd. in Garfield Heights, and set the dining room ablaze. The occupants extinguished the fire and were not injured.

A reward of up to \$5,000 is being offered by the Blue Ribbon Arson Committee for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for each fire.

The Fire and Explosion Investigation Bureau is working with the Garfield Heights police and fire departments to investigate these incidents. Anyone with information is encouraged to call the State Fire Marshal's office tip line at 800-589-2728 or Cuyahoga County Crime Stoppers at 216-252-7463.

Indy Council holds special meeting

A special meeting of Independence Council was held on Monday, August 27, at 4:30 p.m. in the Council Caucus Room at City Hall to vote on three ordinances reflecting changes to the City Charter which were recommended to council by this year's Charter Review Commission.

These ordinances were voted on at a previous special council meeting. However, at the recommendation of the Board of Elections, the language used in the ordinances was changed to clearly show the exact change proposed for the City Charter.

All three amended ordinances were passed and will go to voters in November.

The ordinances dealt with: sending to the electorate the question of whether the charter should be amended to allow council to approve or reject any Planned Use Development in the city without going to the electorate; sending to the electorate a charter change that would increase the amount the city could spend on purchases without public bidding from \$7,500 to \$15,000; and sending to the electorate a charter change regarding the term of office of an appointed finance director.

Residents who have experienced value increases should also be aware that, in 1976, the State passed House Bill 920 which is designed to protect residents against an increase in their taxes just because their property value goes up.

Key Facts

Will my taxes go up if my property value did?

- Your taxes will not increase proportionately with the value increase; they may not increase at all.
- Property owners are protected against significant tax increases by House Bill 920.
- The county will also be releasing an online calculator that allows residents to get an estimate of their taxes by inputting the new valuation. It is important to note that the calculator only provides an estimate.

If I'm still concerned, how can I appeal my valuation?

The county is extending the informal appeal process until September 14th. This is just the first, informal opportunity for homeowners to appeal.

The Board of Revision provides a formal complaint process from January 1, 2019 to March 31, 2019. Homeowners do not need to get a professional appraisal for their homes as part of the appeal process.

Suggested documentation for an appeal can include any of the following:

- Complete Appraisal Report (prepared within the last 12 months);
- Total cost of new structure (certified by builder);
- Photographs of structural damage and estimates for repairs;
- Purchase agreement with closing statement;
- Certified estimates from a contractor for repairs cited as the reason for a change in value;
- Sale prices of comparable homes in the neighborhood.

Bedford CDC awards grants to local businesses

The Bedford Community Development Corporation (BCDC), which works to help businesses in the city, was awarded a \$45,000 Community Development Supplemental Grant in 2018, which it in turn has awarded to 12 small businesses, according to the city's Business Development liaison, Jennifer Kuzma.

"The BCDC has worked to develop a storefront renovation grant for the small businesses along the Broadway corridor," Kuzma said.

"The BCDC is pleased to announce the awards for 12 projects, totaling \$37,671 in grants which spurred over \$89,000 in storefront renovations in Bedford businesses," she continued.

The renovations include new signage, windows and awnings as well as painting of storefronts and repairs to storefront parking areas since June, Kuzma said.

Rounds one and two awardees of the storefront grants include the following businesses: Kulis Freeze Dry, Chain Saw Sales, Inc., Johnson-Romito Funeral Home, Bedford Business Center, St. John Funeral Home, Project Search Promotions, Robert Otto Carson, Attorney, T-Jay's Service, Bedford Floral, Bedford Historical Society, and Cleveland Ballet.

Businesses can still apply for the third and final round of storefront grants. Applications will be accepted until September 21, Kuzma said.

Police arrived outside Sheila's Bar and Grille, 6510 Lansing Ave. Officers did not locate the victim but found seven shell casings and a cell phone at the scene. Dispatch notified police that a man with two gunshot wounds was at MetroHealth Medical Center.

At the hospital, Metro PD had two individuals detained who said they brought their friend, 28, of Cleveland, to the hospital after receiving a phone call from someone saying he had been shot around 2:30 a.m.

Police then spoke to the victim who said he had been standing outside the bar when a fight broke out. He then heard gunshots and ducked, but was struck by the gunfire. There were no suspects at the time of the report. The Fourth District Detective Bureau continues to investigate.

Criminal Damage
