Independence joins Strike Force to fight opioid epidemic

met last Tuesday, Sept. 11, and passed an ordinance entering into a memorandum of understanding with the Cleveland Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force Strike Force to address drug trafficking and drug-related crime.

This Strike Force encompasses the Northern Ohio Law Enforcement Task Force which brings together agents from the FBI, IRS, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement and the DEA, along with police from the city of Cleveland, suburbs and Cuyahoga

Independence Mayor Anthony Togliatti said this agreement makes the Northern Ohio Strike Force a reality and assigns the city of Independence as the fiduciary and a member of the Strike Force.

"By acting as the fiduciary to both this newly created Northern Ohio Strike Force, and the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Agency, the city of Independence is truly leading the charge in fighting the opioid epidemic in Northern Ohio," Togliatti said.

Among other legislation passed last Tuesday was the following:

- •An ordinance creating informal procedures required for entering into contracts or purchasing goods and services not in excess of the amount requiring public bidding (\$7500).
- •Entering into a permit agreement with Mcimetro Access Transmission Ser-

- Accepting bids for snow plowing services for municipal lots and senior citizens/disabled persons/active military residents for the 2018-2019 snow sea-
- •Accepting the base bid of Signal Service Company for the traffic signal and the building under stairs street lighting improvements project.
- •A resolution in support of Prostate Cancer Awareness Month and encouraging all male residents to schedule their annual screening.

Found dead outside church

An unidentified woman was found dead outside Broadway Christian Church, 5920 Engle Rd., near Broadway Avenue in Cleveland on Monday evening, according to Cleveland Police Detective Reginald Lanton.

On September 17th, around 7:45 p.m., officers responded to the church for a call about a foul odor/ dead body. The victim was located in the rear yard of with head trauma, according to Lanton. A maintenance worker found the victim after complaints of

'No suspect information is available at this time," said Lanton. The medical examiner will determine the official cause of death.

"No arrests have been made. This matter will be further investigated," said Lanton.

Elderly woman dead, daughter injured in home invasion on Gertrude Avenue; vigil tonight

Police are investigating the death of Eucebia Garcia, 94, and the assault on her daughter, Marina, during a violent home invasion and robbery on Gertrude Avenue in Cleveland's Slavic Village neighborhood earlier this week, according to Cleveland Police Sgt. Jennifer

Avigil for the slain woman will be held at 5:30 p.m. in the 6200 block of Gertrude, according to reports by WOIO Channel 19 news.

Eucebia Garcia and her daughter were from Honduras and were staying in Slavic Village visiting family, according to media out-

Around 1:45 a.m. Monday, Sept. 17, officers were dispatched to a home in the 6200 block of Gertrude for two elderly females who had been beaten during a home invasion. Officers and EMS arrived and both victims were transported to MetroHealth Medical Center for treatment. Marina Garcia, 74, the victim's daughter, is still at Metro with head trauma injuries, according to Ciaccia.

Eucebia Garcia's son, Marco Tabora Garcia, said in a public Facebook post that he will miss his mother's phone calls and said, "Your jokes, your laughter and your way of seeing life, thank you for having educated me your way. Mother Mia, you will always live in my heart."

At the scene it was learned that the suspect had entered the home through a window where he confronted both women who were sleeping in a bedroom, Ciaccia said. The suspect physically assaulted both women and then took property from the home. He was described as a tall, thin black male, approximately 25 years old.

"My sympathies go out to the Garcia family and my trust goes out to the Cleveland Police Department to solve this crime and bring this criminal to justice," said Ward 12 Councilman Tony Brancatelli.

You certainly are punching your ticket to hell by assaulting a senior citizen immigrant. Our neighborhood will not be defined by this criminal act but rather by the resolve of the residents who call our community home," he continued.

Members of the Homicide Unit and the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office responded to the scene for investigation. No arrests have as yet been made.

PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT

ORDINANCE NO.: 58-2018

SPONSORED BY: **MAYOR VIC COLLOVA**

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 8 OF THE GARFIELD HEIGHTS CITY CHARTER RELATIVE TO REDISTRICTING BOUNDARIES FOR WARDS, AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF SAID AMENDMENT TO THE ELECTORATE OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS.

WHEREAS, Section 52 of the Charter of the City of Garfield Heights permits this Council to submit proposed Charter amendments to the electors of the City upon a Council vote of two-thirds in favor of

WHEREAS, an affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of Council members present shall result in this amendment to be presented to the electors of the City on the November 6, 2018, General Election.

WHEREAS, the 2018 City of Garfield Heights Charter Review Committee has studied the Garfield Heights Charter and has recommended to Council the amendment of Section 8 of the Charter to specify the time requirement for redistricting wards, and

WHEREAS, the Council wishes to provide for said amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by this Council of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio that:

SECTION 1. Section 8 of the Garfield Heights Charter shall be amended to read as follows:

Upon the adoption of this Charter by the electors of the City of Garfield Heights and at least sixty (60) days prior to the filing date of nominating petitions for the terms beginning on January 1, 1958, the present City Council shall divide the City into seven (7) wards which shall be as nearly equal in population as is possible, each ward to be composed of contiguous and compact territory bounded by natural boundaries or street lines. In the event Council shall not have fixed the division of wards herein prescribed, the Director of Public Service shall cause such division to be made at least thirty (30) days prior to the filing date herein provided. If and when any territory is annexed to the City, the Council shall by ordinance declare it a part of the adjacent ward or wards.

The Council is hereby given the authority to make future redivisions of the City into seven (7) wards which shall be as nearly equal in population as is possible, each ward to be composed of contiguous and compact territory bounded by natural boundaries or street lines. Council shall redivide wards after each decennial United States census based upon the information contained in said census.

SECTION 2. The question of amendment of Section 8 of the City of Garfield Heights Charter shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electorate of the City of Garfield Heights at an election to be held November 6, 2018 during the regular hours of voting permitted as prescribed by law, where a majority affirmative vote is required for

SECTION 3. The Law Director be and he is hereby directed to transmit by certified mail a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections, c/o the Director's Office, located at 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44115 and/or to hand-deliver the same to the Issues Department located On the Third Floor of the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections and obtain a written and dated receipt therefore and he is further directed to make the necessary arrangements with the Board of Elections, Cuyahoga County, for giving notice of the proposed amendment of the municipal Charter and for compliance with other regulations including but not limited to appropriate ballot language in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure for the best interest of the citizens of Garfield Heights and for the further reason that publication requirements of Ohio law pertaining to Charter amendments necessitates passage without undue delay, therefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption by this Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 13 OF THE GARFIELD HEIGHTS CITY CHARTER PROHIBITING FIRST TERM COUNCIL MEMBERS FROM HOLDING THE OFFICE OF PRESIDENT PRO TEM, AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF SAID AMENDMENT TO THE ELECTORATE OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS,

WHEREAS. Section 52 of the Charter of the City of Garfield Heights permits this Council to submit proposed Charter amendments to the electors of the City upon a Council vote of two-thirds in favor of said

WHEREAS, an affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of Council members present shall result in this amendment to be presented to the electors of the City on the November 6, 2018, General Election, and

WHEREAS, the 2018 City of Garfield Heights Charter Review Committee has studied the Garfield Heights Charter and has recommended to Council the amendment of Section 13 of the Charter to prohibit first term council members from holding the office of President Pro Tem of Council, and

WHEREAS, the Council wishes to provide for said amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by this Council of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio that:

SECTION 1. Section 13 of the Garfield Heights Charter shall be amended to read as follows:

At its organization meeting, Council shall elect a President Pro Tem from among its members who shall preside in the absence of the President of Council and retain his/her rights, powers and duties as a council member, including the right to vote on all issues. No council member shall be elected President Pro Tem until that member has completed one full term in office. In the event no member of Council has completed one full term in office at the time the President Pro Tem is to be elected, all members of Council shall be eligible to be elected.

SECTION 2. The question of amendment of Section 3 of the City of Garfield Heights Charter shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electorate of the City of Garfield Heights at an election to be held November 6, 2018 during the regular hours of voting permitted as prescribed by law, where a majority affirmative vote is required for

SECTION 3. The Law Director be and he is hereby directed to transmit by certified mail a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections, c/o the Director's Office, located at 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44115 and/or to hand-deliver the same to the Issues Department located on the Third Floor of the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections and obtain a written and dated receipt therefore and he is further directed to make the necessary arrangements with the Board of Elections, Cuyahoga County, for giving notice of the proposed amendment of the municipal Charter and for compliance with other regulations including but not limited to appropriate ballot language in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 32 OF THE GARFIELD HEIGHTS CITY CHARTER RELATIVE TO RESIDENCY QUALIFICATIONS OF MAYORAL CANDIDATES, AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF SAID AMENDMENT TO THE ELECTORATE OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO

WHEREAS, Section 52 of the Charter of the City of Garfield Heights permits this Council to submit proposed Charter amendments to the electors of the City upon a Council vote of two-thirds in favor of

WHEREAS, an affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of Council members present shall result in this amendment to be presented to the

electors of the City on the November 6, 2018, General Election.

WHEREAS, the 2018 City of Garfield Heights Charter Review Committee has studied the Garfield Heights Charter and has recommended to Council the amendment of Section 32 of the Charter to specify residency qualifications for mayoral candidates, and

WHEREAS, the Council wishes to provide for said amendment. NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by this Council of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio that:

SECTION 1. Section 32 of the Garfield Heights Charter shall be amended to read as follows:

The Mayor shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the City. He shall be elected for a term of four (4) years, and serve until his successor is elected and qualified.

The term of office of the Mayor elected in November, 1985, shall end at midnight of November 30, 1989. Commencing with the General Election in November, 1989, and for each succeeding term thereafter, the term of office of the Mayor shall commence on December 1st of said General Election and shall end four (4) years later at midnight of November 30th following the General Election in that year.

The Mayor shall be an elector of the City and shall have resided in the City continuously for a period of at least five (5) years immediately preceding his election, and shall not hold any other public office or public employment except that of Notary Public or a member of the State Militia, or the Reserve Corps of the United States or a member of various Boards and Commissions with the approval of Council, and shall not be interested in the profits or emoluments of any contract, job, work or service with or for the Municipality The Mayor shall have his office at the City Hall and shall devote his entire time and effort during business hours, and such other times as may be necessary, to the business of the City. If the Mayor shall cease to possess any of these qualifications or shall be convicted of crime involving moral turpitude, his office shall immediately become vacant

SECTION 2. The question of amendment of Section 32 of the City of Garfield Heights Charter shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electorate of the City of Garfield Heights at an election to be held November 6, 2018 during the regular hours of voting permitted as prescribed by law, where a majority affirmative vote is required for

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
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


