Council hikes water, sewer rates a little next year in Bedford

Water and sewer rates for property owners in Bedford will show a slight increase next year, after city council passed three pieces of legislation at its meeting last week authorizing the rate hike. As before there will be a discount given to senior citizens and the permanently disabled.

Councilman Donald Saunders served as mayor at last week's meeting, as Mayor Stan Koci had to respond to a family emergency and Councilwoman Paula Mizsak, who serves as mayor in Koci's absence, was unable to attend.

Beginning January 1, 2019, the minimum monthly water charge for property owners will increase from \$28.44 to \$28.47, which represents an increase in the amount of .0975 percent, Finance Director Frank Gambosi stated

Eligible senior citizens will be charged a base rate of \$19.91 monthly for water next year, the ordinance stated

The minimum monthly sewer charge will also increase in 2019, from \$22.44 to \$24.46.

Council passed a third ordinance, "Rate Reduction for Senior Citizens and the Permanently Disabled," which provides for a discount. The minimum monthly rate for those qualifying for the discount will increase slightly from \$15.71 to \$17.12, effective January 1, 2019.

Gambosi commented that the rate increases were needed for necessary capital improvements for the sewer and water facilities.



At its meeting last week, Maple Heights Council approved two pieces of legislation to apply for a total of \$982,000 in 2018 Assistance to Firefighters Grants (AFG) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) towards emergency vehicles, operations and safety equipment for the Maple Heights Fire Department.

The primary goal of the AFG is to meet the firefighting and emergency response needs of fire departments and nonaffiliated emergency medical service organizations, the ordinances state. Since 2001, AFG has helped firefighters and other first responders obtain critically needed equipment, protective gear, emergency vehicles, training and other resources needed to protect the public and emergency personnel from fire and related hazards.

One of the ordinances authorizes Mayor Annette Blackwell and Fire Chief Vito Kavaliunas to enter into a contract with Gatchell Grant Resources, LLC, to develop and submit on behalf of Maple Heights an application for a 2018 AFG grant "for emergency vehicle acquisition" in an amount not to exceed \$760,000, with Gatchell being paid 8 percent of the amount of the grant awarded, up to a maximum payment amount of \$3,000.

The other ordinance authorizes Blackwell and Kavaliunas to apply for a separate 2018 AFG grant "for operations and safety equipment and resources" in the amount of \$152,000 for four EKG monitors/defibrillators, and in the amount of \$70,000 for vehicle extrication tools.

Legislation

Legislation to increase rental rates for the newly renovated Ellenwood Recreation Center was placed on first reading. The ordinance proposes a refundable \$50 damage deposit charged to each group holding regular meetings at Ellenwood, while private parties using the gymnasium would require a \$100 security deposit. Increased hourly rental fees are also proposed in the legislation as well as new cancellation fees.



Grant for Southgate Connectivity Study

Council passed a resolution authorizing Blackwell to execute an agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) and the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency (NOACA) to accept \$80,000 in grant funding for the Southgate Connectivity Study, through the Transportation for Livable Communities Initiative (TLCI) in the city.

In October 2017, according to the legislation, Council authorized Blackwell to apply for a TLCI grant from NOACA for the Southgate Connectivity Study, as "the city is interested in studying the connectivity and redevelopment of transportation corridors in the vicinity of Southgate USA... included but not limited to major arterials such as Northfield Road, Warrensville Center Road, Libby Road and collectors such as Southgate Park Boulevard and Maple Heights Boulevard."

The study will develop transportation and economic **Halloween observance** development strategies to revitalize the Southgate USA commercial area "through enhanced connections between community assets (Milkovich Middle School, Stafford Park) adjacent residential neighborhoods, and nearby emerging employment centers (North Randall), according to information released by the city.

"The study will capitalize on the recent momentum of the Amazon Fulfillment Center development one mile dents to increased employment opportunities," city

NOACA has a grant program through which ODOT will provide to the city 100 percent of the eligible costs If the city is awarded this second grant, it would be to undertake the connectivity study since Maple Heights

> This is a reimbursable, basis-only grant, meaning the city will have to pay the expenses first before submitting claims for repayment. Any further funding over the \$80,000 will be the responsibility of the city, according to the resolution.

Easement for car dealer

Council passed a resolution authorizing Blackwell to grant a revocable easement to Good Vibration Enterprises, a used car business at 17331 Broadway Ave., that is adjacent to Lounsbury Avenue, an unimproved right of way in the city. Good Vibrations wants to use the adjacent Lounsbury property, owned by the city, for a parking lot for its used car business, according to the legislation.

The easement will allow for the additional parking at the business, and Good Vibrations will be responsible for maintenance and obtain not less than \$1 million in general liability insurance for the duration of the easement, according to the agreement.

Residents can get free internet through new **CCPL** hotspot lending

Cuyahoga County Public Library (CCPL) and Cleve- Public Library branch. land Public Library cardholders can now access free, unlimited, high-speed internet from almost anywhere through its WiFi hotspot lending program at the following county library branches:

Garfield Heights Library, 5409 Turney Rd.; Maple Heights Library, 5225 Library Ln.; Southeast Library in Bedford, 70 Columbus Rd.; and Warrensville Heights Library, 4415 Northfield Rd.

Portable hotspots allow library cardholders who do

not have home internet access to easily get online from be disabled remotely. almost anywhere using a WiFi-enabled device such as a phone, tablet or laptop. Hotspots are available to check out from the select Cuyahoga County Public Library branches, just like a book or DVD.

Guidelines:

- Hotspots can be returned to any Cuyahoga County
- · Hotspots can only be picked up at the Garfield Heights, Maple Heights, Southeast and Warrensville Heights branches.
 - •The loan period for hotspots is 21 days.
- The daily overdue fine for a hotspot is 10 cents per
 - The replacement fee for a hotspot is \$25.
- Hotspots that are greater than 10 days overdue will

- Hotspots are renewable if no one else is waiting for
- Up to 10 devices can be connected to a hotspot at the same time.
- Simple instructions and tech support contact information are included with each hotspot.

As many as 40 percent of the households in the Garfield Heights, Maple Heights, Bedford and Warrensville Heights branches do not have internet access in their homes. Access to the internet and digital literacy are critical to success in school, in seeking employment, in managing personal finances and in pursuit of health and wellness, library officials said.

Tech support for the hotspot lending program is provided by PCs for People and funded by The Cleveland Foundation. If you need assistance with your hotspot call PCs for People at 216-930-5741.

The Mayor shall be an elector of the City and shall have resided in the City continuously for a period of at least five (5) years immediately preceding his election, and shall not hold any other public office or public employment except that of Notary Public or a member of the State Militia, or the Reserve Corps of the United States or a member of various Boards and Commissions with the approval of Council, and shall not be interested in the profits or emoluments of any contract, job, work or service with or for the Municipality The Mayor shall have his office at the City Hall and shall devote his entire time and effort during business hours, and such other times as may be necessary, to the business of the City. If the Mayor shall cease to possess any of these qualifications or shall be convicted of crime involving moral turpitude, his office shall immediately become vacant

The question of amendment of Section 32 of the City of Garfield Heights Charter shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electorate of the City of Garfield Heights at an election to be held November 6, 2018 during the regular hours of voting permitted as prescribed by law, where a majority affirmative vote is required for

In the event Council shall not have fixed the division of wards herein prescribed, the Director of Public Service shall cause such division to be made at least thirty (30) days prior to the filing date herein provided. If and when any territory is annexed to the City, the Council shall by ordinance declare it a part of the adjacent ward or wards.

The Council is hereby given the authority to make future redivisions of the City into seven (7) wards which shall be as nearly equal in population as is possible, each ward to be composed of contiguous and compact territory bounded by natural boundaries or street lines. Council shall redivide wards after each decennial United States census based upon the information contained in said census

The question of amendment of Section 8 of the City of Garfield Heights Charter shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electorate of the City of Garfield Heights at an election to be held November 6, 2018 during the regular hours of voting permitted as prescribed by law, where a majority affirmative vote is required for




