Mayors present 'State of Region'

The Cuyahoga Valley Chamber of Commerce held its annual State of the Region program and luncheon last Wednesday, at the Holiday Inn in Independence.

Participating were Mayor Michael Procuik of Brooklyn Heights, Mayor Anthony Togliatti of Independence and Mayor Jerry Piasecki of Valley View.

Moderator Ed "Flash" Ferenc asked each of the mayors for highlights in each of their communities.

Mayor Togliatti pointed to new branding signs in the East Pleasant Valley business district which he noted had a near zero vacancy rate, and the landing of Top Golf in the northeast quadrant of Rockside Road and the Hemlock Creek Trail extending from Independence into Valley View.

Mayor Piasecki stated that Ferguson Corporation is starting construction at West Canal and Lombardo Parkway, establishing a regional presence in Valley View. He said there will be at least two additional development possibilities that he hopes to announce in

the next few months.

He said with regret that Sue and Earl Foote, owners and operators of Footes Valley Farms, would be retiring this month and closing the doors to their long-time business on Canal Road. Piasecki also noted that next year Valley View will be celebrating its centennial with several events

being planned.

Mayor Procuik shared new and/or improved business sites in Brooklyn Heights, among them Industrial Furnace Co., Travis Roofing, Einheit Electric and several tile companies. He also pointed out that Plain Dealer Publishing's distribution center is located in Brooklyn Heights.

MHHS, CHHS teams advance to regional finals; Garfield season ends

The varsity football teams at Maple Heights High School (Division II, Region 5) and Cuyahoga Heights High School (Division VII, Region 25) are still going strong and have advanced to the regional finals!

The Maple Heights Mustangs beat Painesville Riverside last week, 44-14. They will face Akron's Archbishop Hoban this Friday, Nov. 16, at 7 p.m. at Twinsburg Tiger Stadium.

The Cuyahoga Heights Redskins beat East Canton last week, 21-6, and will face Warren's John F. Kennedy High School this Saturday, Nov. 17, at 7 p.m. at Macedonia Nordonia Boliantz Stadium.

The historic season for Garfield Heights High School, however, has come to an end. The team was defeated in the regional semifinals last weekend by Archbishop Hoban, 41-7, ending their school's perfect season, but cementing their place in the record books!

Bedford's Old Moonglow property step closer to demolition

The former Moonglow Tavern, purchased by the city of Bedford three years ago with an eye towards using the land it sits on for future development, is one step closer to being demolished after council passed legislation condemning the property last week.

The Moonglow was a fixture at 34 Union St. in Bedford for decades until its closing in 2015.

The ordinance passed by council states that the property and structure "is hereby

declared unsafe, insanitary and unfit for future use and as such, therefore condemned."

"The purpose of this is hopefully to expedite the Land Bank to get it moved up the list, to demolish it immediately since the funds have been made available through the Board of Control," City Manager Mike Mallis said.

Mayor Stan Koci commented, "And also to point out, we didn't sell the Moonglow, as the rumors

were floating around. It would have been nice, but we haven't."

Council passed a separate ordinance at last week's meeting similar to the Moonglow legislation, declaring the property and structure at 53 Best St. a nuisance and condemning it.

Signage survey

In an effort to improve the appearance of Bedford with more visible, attractive and consistent signage, Mallis said there is a survey online for residents to offer their input and help the city with its plan for future signs at <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/BedfordWayfinding>.

"One of the things the city wants to do is look into funding to address some of the signage throughout the town," Mallis said, adding that the topics included entrance and gateway signs, signage in the historic downtown district, and signs directing visitors to public parking and public restrooms.

Two arrested in deaths of Bedford father, daughter

U.S. Marshals in Cleveland recently arrested Ronald Newberry and Kodii Gibson, wanted by the East Cleveland Police Department in the deaths of Paul and Paris Bradley of Bedford. The father and daughter were reportedly tortured and killed before they were found in a car that was set on fire in an East Cleveland field on October 10th.

Last Thursday, Nov. 8, Newberry turned himself into East Cleveland PD with his attorney, according to a press release from the U.S. Marshals. He is currently in custody at East Cleveland PD pending his arraignment.

Gibson is the second suspect arrested in connection

with the deaths of the Bradleys after new evidence was developed and a warrant was issued for his arrest.

Members of the Northern Ohio Violent Fugitive Task Force arrested Gibson on November 10th near the 12300 block of Chesterfield St. in Cleveland, according to the press release. Gibson was also taken to the East Cleveland Police Department pending arraignment on his charges.

U.S. Marshal Pete Elliott stated, "Our task force members wasted no time in tracking down this fugitive. The East Cleveland Police Department should be commended for their tireless efforts in identifying the suspects in this tragic case."

"We are working with a company who has done similar programs with Kent, University Circle and Lakewood," he said, encouraging residents to complete the online survey that will help the company "as they put together a plan for us."

More sinkhole work

Council passed an ordinance amending previous legislation, authorizing Mallis to accept the pro-

posal for additional repairs to a sinkhole at Union Street and Northfield Road by Northeast Ohio Trench, GPD Group, Sirna Construction and Tucker Landscaping, at a total cost of \$63,097.47.

The sinkhole, which started out about two feet by two feet, has kept growing to the point where an automobile could fit inside it and increasing the extent and cost of the project, Mallis said.

Besides the fact that Delgado failed to show up at the Planning Commission meeting to discuss the application, city officials did not feel that having a vape shop was "a good fit" for the historic district. Also, state regulations were being reviewed regarding vape shops, Koci stated.

Firefighter Mike Scabbo was honored as the Bedford Firefighter of the Year, and Officer Sean Allred was honored as the Bedford

Police Officer of the Year recently. City officials congratulated them on the honor.

Officials also thanked the Eagles Club of Bedford and the Eagles Ladies Auxiliary for their donations to the city's police and fire departments. The Eagles organization also donated towards the local Food Bank.

Ellenwood Rec fees increased

Passed was an ordinance to establish increases in fees for rentals at Ellenwood Recreation Center, and also to establish new rental policies. Mallis mentioned the center was still awaiting new interior painting, and new carpeting would be installed after that.

Also passed was legislation for city employees to make insurance plan premium contributions on a pretax basis for 2019.

An ordinance for the 2019 city budget was placed on first reading, with additional discussion planned before passage at a future meeting. Next year's budget figure is \$37,234,836, Finance Director Frank Gambosi stated.



Election updates in Garfield Hts., Indy

Voters in Garfield Heights and Independence went to the polls last week to decide several charter amendments in their respective municipalities.

Garfield Heights

In Garfield Heights, the following all received voter approval:

- Redividing council wards after each decennial United States census based upon the information contained in said census.
- Requiring council members to serve one full term as a council member before being eligible to be elected President Pro Tem.
- Changing the residency

requirement of the mayor from having to reside within the city for the three years immediately preceding the election to having to reside within the city for the five years immediately preceding the election.

Independence

Voters in Independence okayed two charter changes but rejected the third in last week's November 6th election.

Approved were charter amendments regarding procedures should the office of Finance Director become vacant and increasing the dollar amount for purchases council can make


to \$15,000 without the requirement of public bidding. Council now may also make a purchase or enter into a contract involving more than \$15,000 without advertising for bids if it determines and declares by a three-fifths vote that an emergency exists and sets forth the nature of the emergency in its minutes.

Regarding rezoning of land into an approved Planned Use Development, voters rejected a proposed charter amendment by more than a 2-1 majority that would have nullified the need for council to hold a public hearing on the matter, make public notice of the date and time of such hearing, referring such matters to the Planning Commission for its recommendation, and submitting it to the electors for approval or rejection.



Valley View Council notes

Village of Valley View Council met last Tuesday, Nov. 6, and passed an ordinance on third reading amending the composition of the police department from 10 patrolmen to 8.

The new ordinance also changes the number of sergeants from five to four, adds that there be one full-time detective and eliminates the deputy chief position.

Police Chief David Niro said that eight officers are the minimum needed to make 12 hour shifts work, meaning four platoons of one sergeant and three officers. He said he is not advocating reducing the size of the department.

Niro thanked the mayor and council for supporting the ordinances for the police department and said, "This is necessary for making the department more efficient and streamlined."

Law Director Dave Lambros stated that if it is determined that more officers are needed the ordinance can be changed in the future.

Council also passed the following legislation:

- A resolution designating Paul Dey as the project manager and person responsible for implementing the FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program on behalf of the Village.

- A resolution supporting the establishment of the Cuyahoga River Water Trail as a designated water trail by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. Mayor Jerry Piasecki said that it renames the actual river.

- An ordinance authorizing the mayor to restart the Valley View Police Department K-9 Program and authorizing an expenditure not to exceed \$26,500 for implementation purposes. Officer Crumbley was in the audience and was recognized for being the new K-9 Officer for the Village.

Man arrested for alleged rape in Independence

Members of the Northern Ohio Violent Fugitive Task Force have arrested Dimitrius Anglen, 22, for a rape and kidnapping incident in Independence, according to a press release from the U.S. Marshals Service.

Independence Police Chief Michael Kilbane stated, "A violent fugitive, who through his actions clearly showed his resolve to avoid apprehension, was

quickly apprehended before he could cause further harm to our citizens."
