## Night of honors at Bedford Council Garfield Hts. may adopt new rules for dog owners; pit bulls would no longer be banned

In a holiday season of giving and celebration, it was a night of both for many individuals last week, as Bedford Mayor Stan Koci presented proclamations to a new Eagle Scout, the Bedford Eagles Club, the "Christmas in Bedford Falls" committee, and the Meals on Wheels program at the city council meeting.

Thomas Cashman, a member of Scout Troop 399 in Bedford, attained the rank of Eagle Scout, the highest honor awarded in the Boy Scouts of America, earlier this year and Koci said to him, "This is quite an accomplishment. Not a lot of guys do it. You're in pretty select company and we are proud of you."

Cashman thanked Koci and praised his parents for their support, saying, "They deserve all the credit."

The Eagles Club, Aerie 2122, and the Eagles Auxiliary were also honored with a proclamation for their many generous monetary donations to the city's safety forces over 25-plus years, which Koci estimated at over \$400,000.

The Eagles' contributions have enabled the police and fire departments to buy a

motorcycle, exercise equipment, computers, protective gear and other items, and make renovations to their facilities, Koci said.

Police Chief Marty Stemple and Fire Chief Dave Nagy both thanked the Eagles for their donations. Nagy said the fire department was able to purchase "a very expensive piece of equipment that addresses the number one killer of firefighters in the country, cancer. You're not only touching the fire department and the city, you're touching the extended family as well, and I can't thank you enough for the ability for us to purchase that."

Koci also presented a proclamation to the "Christmas in Bedford Falls" committee, formed almost 20 years ago, for their continued efforts every December to transform the city of Bedford into a replica of its "sister city," the fictional town of Bedford Falls featured in the Jimmy Stewart holiday favorite "It's A Wonderful Life."

The annual "Christmas in Bedford Falls" celebration was presented by the Southeast Region Chamber of Commerce this past weekend on Bedford's Public Square.

And also honored at last week's meeting were members of the city's Meals On Wheels program, which ensures that seniors and other individuals throughout Bedford can receive a midday meal delivered by a volunteer, which for some might be their only meal and personal interaction for that day, Koci and other officials noted.

### Vans stolen from Broadway Boys & Girls Club last week

For kids at Boys & Girls Clubs of Cleveland (BGCC), Club vans provide opportunities such as the chance to visit museums, parks, sports venues and even colleges that might otherwise be inaccessible to them.

Last Tuesday evening, December 4th, two BGCC vans were stolen from a temporary parking spot across from the Broadway Club, 6114 Broadway Ave. in Slavic Village. The vans have not been found and police have no suspects, according to a press release last week by Ken Wood, communications director at BGCC.

BGCC President and CEO Ron Soeder said replacing the vans will take money away from the operations that provide safe, fun places for kids after school each day. He said it will cost an estimated \$22,500 to replace each van at a time when the Clubs are trying to remain in the black. Insurance will not pay any of the replacement cost because the vans had only liability coverage.

### Garfield Hts. may adopt new rules for dog owners; pit bulls would no longer be banned

Garfield Heights Council, at its meeting Monday night, passed for a second reading an ordinance amending Animals and Fowl codes and adopting a new chapter on Nuisance, Dangerous and Vicious Animals.

The current rules ban pit bulls from the city and require any person owning a dangerous or vicious dog to have not less than \$50,000 worth of liability insurance on their dog.

The new rules would require every dog owner in Garfield Heights to have at least \$50,000 worth of liability insurance on their dogs. Dog owners failing to have insurance would be guilty of a minor misdemeanor on the first offense, 4th degree misdemeanor

on the second offense and 3rd degree misdemeanor on the third and any subsequent offenses.

Those dogs that have been ruled nuisance dogs, dangerous or vicious must have not less than \$100,000 worth of liability insurance on them.

Jeff Jerome, staff attorney in the city's Law Department, said most homeowners insurance policies cover dogs automatically, but residents should contact their insurance companies to verify the coverage.

The legislation, if passed on third and final reading, would be effective 30 days after passage, Jerome said.

### Legislation passed

Ordinances and resolutions passed by council Monday night included:

• Agreement with Federal Emergency Management Agency's assistance to firefighters grant to pur-

chase fire investigative equipment.

• Ratifying the appointments of Louise Triptow, Joyce Tubbs, Pamela Wilkes and Frank Leone as members of the Zoning Board of Appeals for the city of Garfield Heights.

• Ratifying the appointment of Kimberly R. Motley as a member of the Garfield Heights Planning Commission.

• Applying for a grant from the Cuyahoga County Property Demolition Program to demolish blighted properties in the city.

• Supporting the establishment and designation of the Cuyahoga River Water Trail by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources.

The next regular council meeting is scheduled for Monday, Jan. 14, 2019, although council can meet in special session should the need arise.

## Administrative Reports

Police Chief Robert Byrne welcomed Brittany McCune as a new hire for GHPD after she was sworn in at Monday night's council meeting by Mayor Vic Collova. She has been a full time officer with the John Carroll University Police Department for the last three years.

Byrne also announced that Patrolman/K-9 handler Patrick Hace has resigned and that his K-9 officer, Rosco, will be retired. Also retiring, after 30 years with the department, is Patrolman Philip Dickens. His last day will be December 13th.

The chief also noted that retiring Patrolman Alan Nero's last day on the job will be December 23rd, after 29½ years with the department.

# Two males arrested in Lansing Ave. shooting

Cleveland police have arrested two males in connection to the shooting of an 18-year-old girl on Lansing Avenue in Slavic Village and allegedly robbing another woman at gunpoint in a separate incident, according to a Cleveland police report.

Brandon Adkins, 18, and Charles Trowbridge, 19, are facing aggravated robbery, felonious assault and firearms charges in Cuyahoga County Court, according to records.

Cleveland police were dispatched to the 7000 block of Lansing Ave. on November 27th, around 9:30 p.m., and

found the victim, Shania Brooks, laying on the sidewalk with a gunshot wound to the neck/chin area. She was being treated by EMS at the scene and was taken to MetroHealth Medical Center for further treatment.

At the time of the report, a physician said Brooks was in critical and unstable condition. Further updates on her condition have not been made public.

At the scene, police spoke to a witness who said he heard a gunshot, looked out the window and saw something on the sidewalk, so he crossed the street and saw Brooks on the ground, according to the report, and gave her aid until paramedics arrived. He also reported seeing a red, 4-door vehicle stopped a few feet away from Brooks which then sped off towards East 71st Street.

Cleveland First District officers identified and arrested Adkins and Trowbridge in connection to a separate robbery of a woman in Cleveland and learned of their alleged involvement in the shooting of Brooks on Lansing Avenue, according to a police report.

Adkins and Trowbridge have pled not guilty to their charges and are being held on \$100,000 bond, according to Cuyahoga County Court records.

Meals on Wheels representatives stated that the program served almost 21,000 meals this year, to an average of 86 people per day. The federal government provides some of the funding through the Older Americans Act, and the city is also in partnership with the neighboring Maple Heights Senior Center and the Benjamin Rose organization.

Also at the meeting the city gave Meals on Wheels members a check for \$1000, which was raised through Bedford employees contributing to a "dress down day" fund, and the Bedford Fire Department gave \$500 to the program.

### Applies for grants

City Manager Mike Mallis said that Jennifer Kuzma of the Economic Development office submitted two grant requests on behalf of the Bedford Community Development Corporation to Cuyahoga County for a total of \$100,000, which if approved would be used towards more attractive and consistent signage throughout the city.

The grants, if approved, would be used towards improving historic district signage, parking and directional signage and gateway signs, Mallis said.

### Legislation passed

Council passed an ordinance approving the city's 2019 budget of \$37,234,836, which will provide for operations of Bedford's administration and departments, expenses and expenditures for next year.

Council also passed an ordinance to make additional appropriations for expenditures for this year to finish out 2018.

An ordinance for a five-year extension of the lease with option to purchase agreement for MRLM, which occupies city-owned property at 600 Solon Rd., was

approved by council. Mallis said MRLM, a landscaping company, has been occupying the property for the past six years.

Mallis said that through an agreement between the city and MRLM, the company takes Bedford's leaves and compost. "It has saved the city between \$12,000 and \$15,000 every year," he said. MRLM has also agreed to cover the property taxes for the site, Mallis said.

Also passed was an ordinance to establish pay ranges for city employees, adding additional part-time positions, Mallis said. The new legislation will give more flexibility in hiring, including part-time positions in the recreation department.

Council passed a resolution to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Tinkers Creek Watershed Partners to fulfill a permit with the Ohio EPA authorizing discharge of stormwater in Bedford and defining the role of the TCWP in assisting the city to obtain a storm water discharge permit.

An ordinance to amend a contract with GDP Group for engineering services for the city was placed on second reading for further discussion by council.

### Announcements

The annual Bedford "Shop With A Cop" program will be held this Saturday, Dec. 15, during which needy youngsters will get a chance to go Christmas shopping for their families and themselves with members of the Bedford police and other area departments. Mallis thanked Xellia, the pharmaceutical company located in the former Ben Venue facility, for their "significant contribution" towards the event.

The annual "Lights Out For Hunger" will be held on Wednesday, Dec. 19. Residents are encouraged to turn off their holiday lighting displays for that evening and donate what they would have spent on their electric bills to the Southeast Clergy food pantry.

Barbara McDaniel was named "Citizen of the Year" by the Community Council for 2018, city officials stated.

## Valley View Council notes

The Village of Valley View Council met last Tuesday, Dec. 4, and passed the following legislation:

- An ordinance appointing Brian Sala as a part-time member of the Valley View Fire Department. Fire Chief Ken Papesh said Sala is new in fire service, was recently hired in Newburgh Heights and is currently going through their training program.

- An ordinance appointing Sean Cottrell as a part-time member of the Valley View Fire Department was placed on third reading. Papesh said Cottrell is currently a full-time lieutenant firefighter in Cleveland Heights.

- An ordinance appointing A & S Animal Control Service to provide dog warden services for the Village of Valley View beginning January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2020. The dog warden service will be directed by the police department.

- An ordinance waiving the residency requirement for Police Chief David Niro in the Village of Valley View. Law Director Dave Lambros said cases in the Ohio Supreme Court have declared residency requirements unconstitutional.

# Fourth suspect arrested in connection to deaths of Bedford father, daughter

Last Friday, U.S. Marshals in northern Ohio arrested Demarcus Sheeley, 24, who was wanted for a homicide by the East Cleveland Police Department, according to a press release received last Friday from the U.S. Marshals Service.

Sheeley is the fourth suspect arrested in connection with the deaths of Paul and Paris Bradley of Bedford. Paul Bradley and his

daughter Paris were tortured and killed before they were found in a car that was set on fire in an East Cleveland field in October.

Members of the Northern Ohio Violent Fugitive Task Force arrested Sheeley in Akron, according to the press release. Sheeley was taken to the East Cleveland Police Department pending arraignment on his charges.

The three others arrested in connection with this crime are Ronald Newberry, Kodii Gibson and Quentin Palmer, all of whom were arrested separately in November.

U.S. Marshal Pete Elliott stated, "We won't ever stop looking for violent fugitives like Sheeley. No matter where they run to we will track them down and bring them to justice."

Reward money is available and tipsters may remain anonymous.

Garfield Heights Police Chief Robert Byrne said that although there is not a designated area in his city, residents should feel free to use the department's parking lot for such exchanges, located at 5555 Turney Rd.

Other local police departments that can be used by the public to make online exchanges, even though there is not a designated "safe" area, include:





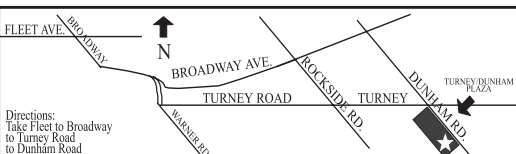

# Cold Weather Recipes

Warm up this winter with some of these delicious recipes sent in by readers of The Neighborhood News!

## Kielbasa Goulash

- ½ of a 14 oz. bag of gingersnaps
- 2 (28 oz.) cans cut green beans, drained
- 1 (12 oz.) pkg. Gia Russa Kluski noodles
- 2 lbs. kielbasa
- 1 lb. carrots, peeled, cut in bite-size pieces
- 2 large onions, cut bite-size
- 6 large ribs of celery, cut bite-size
- 3 (28 oz.) cans stewed tomatoes
- 10 cups water
- ½ stick butter
- 5 Tbsp. beef soup base
- 4 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- ½ cup sugar
- 2 Tbsp. paprika
- 1 Tbsp. ginger

In a food processor, break up gingersnaps and process into crumbs; transfer to a bowl, set aside. Poke a whole into the package of noodles and crush into about 1-inch pieces, set aside. Cut kielbasa in half lengthwise, then cut into bite-size pieces, set aside.

In a soup pot bring water to a boil. Bled in the butter and soup base. Add the carrots, onions and celery. Bring back to a boil. Lower heat, cover and simmer for 15 minutes.

In three batches, put stewed tomatoes into food processor and puree, adding to the pot as you go. Then add the Worcestershire, sugar, paprika, ginger, green beans and crushed noodles. Raise the heat so it can again come to a boil. When pot returns to a boil, cover, lower heat and simmer another 15 minutes.

Simultaneously sprinkle and stir in the gingersnap crumbs. Then add the kielbasa and continue simmering for the last 15 minutes.

Turn off heat, cover and let set for 30 minutes.

## Legislation to hire Biro as acting Maple Hts. finance director on second reading

A resolution to hire Garfield Heights Finance Director Barbara Biro to also serve as acting finance director for the city of Maple Heights was placed on second reading by Maple Heights Council at its meeting last week.

The Shared Services Agreement, authorized by Ohio Revised Code, is a unique arrangement in that if it is eventually passed by council, Biro will serve both municipalities in the capacity of finance director.

Due to budget deficits, Maple Heights has been in a state of fiscal emergency declared by the state auditor's office three years ago. Biro, who has served as finance director in Garfield Heights since 2015, has extensive experience in assisting a municipality out of a fiscal emergency, officials said.

Council will discuss the Shared Services Agreement before possible passage at a future meeting.

### Accepts grant

Council passed a motion on the agenda for Mayor Annette Blackwell and Fire Chief Vito Kavaliunas to accept and expend non-matching grant funds from the Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS), Division of Emergency Medical Services, for a 2018-2019 Priority One Training and Equipment Grant, in an amount not to exceed \$3,575, Council Clerk Leonette Cicirella stated.

According to documents provided to the city by the

ODPS, the Priority One grant has been awarded to the Maple Heights Fire Department for the funding period from July 1, 2018, through January 31, 2019.

Eligible training and equipment items under the grant include: airway supplies and equipment; diagnostics and monitoring, including Automatic External Defibrillators; equipment carrying cases; immobilization and extrication; I.V. therapy and supplies; mass casualty, disaster and decontamination; patient transport products and transport accessories; resuscitation and oxygen administration; suction supplies and equipment; vehicles; computers and EMS training and training equipment.

### Land transfers

Council passed a resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into an agreement with Pickus LLC, to transfer ownership of two unimproved vacant lots on Milan Drive, owned by the Maple Heights Land Reutilization Program, in exchange for ownership of two unimproved vacant lots on Bellview Street, owned by Pickus, to be transferred to the reutilization program. The land is needed for the city to complete the Milan and Harlan Drive sanitary sewer replacement project in the city.

Council previously authorized the project, and the Ohio Public Works Commission has announced that it will contribute funding for 56 percent of the construction costs, up to \$240,000, for replacement of the Milan and Harlan Drive project, from Erwin Street to Bellview Street, according to the legislation.

The city has entered into a Member Community Infrastructure Program with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORS), and has been awarded \$153,544.65 by the NEORS for the project, the resolution states, adding that council has authorized a contract with Terrace Construction Company to per-

form the work at a cost of \$314,157.50.

City Engineer Ed Hren has advised that the purchase of various sewer easements and properties along Milan and Bellview will be required to allow for the efficient construction of the project.

### Employee insurance passed

Council passed three resolutions for Blackwell to enter into agreements through the Fedeli Group for group life insurance, dental and vision insurance for full-time city employees for the year beginning January 1, 2019.

The life and dental insurance contracts are with SunLife, while the vision insurance contract is with Union Eye Care, according to the legislation.

An ordinance to adopt the 2018 City of Maple Heights Master Plan, last updated in 1999, was placed on first reading by council for further discussion.

# Garfield Hts. police news

## Aggravated Robbery

On December 9th, a man told police he went to the 12300 block of Southern Ave. around 3:15 p.m. to meet a potential buyer of a Nintendo Wii gaming system he had listed for sale for \$75 on a website called Offer Up. He said he spoke with the buyer for a few minutes before the man reached into the car and grabbed the Wii. The man then pulled out a gun, pointed it at the victim and said, "Don't move or I'll kill you." Fearing for his safety, the victim said he got out of the car, leaving the keys in the ignition, and fled the area on foot towards Marymount Hospital where he called police. The suspect then got into the victim's vehicle and fled the scene. The victim said his cell phone was also inside the car at the time of the robbery. The vehicle information was entered into LEADS as stolen.

## OVI

On December 5th, around 3 p.m., police were dispatched to Rockside Rd. near Garfield Commons for a three-car accident. Police learned a vehicle, driven by a man that was driving under suspension, had rear ended another vehicle at a red light, pushing into a third vehicle. Two of the drivers suffered injuries, a bloodied mouth and neck and back pain, and were taken to Marymount Hospital for treatment.

The man who caused the crash appeared to be under the influence and showed obvious signs of impairment. Police said he was jittery and unstable on his feet. He was arrested, and while being booked at City Jail, police found a short straw (commonly used to snort drugs such as heroin) with an unknown white powder inside. He was cited for OVI, driving under suspension and not wearing a seatbelt, and is being charged with aggravated vehicular assault.

## Robbery

A woman said she was walking into Dave's Supermarket in Turneytown Shopping Center on December 4th, around 3 p.m., when she was approached by four high school-age boys who told her she was going to give them her money. Afraid for her safety, she complied and gave the boys her wallet and they fled the scene on foot.

Police searched the area for the teens with negative results.

## Shoplifting

Employees of the Big Lots store on Rockside Rd. in Garfield Commons said that on December 4th, around 3:45 p.m., five teens came into the store and began tearing open packages and concealing the items in their pockets. They then fled the store towards a black SUV that was parked in the lot. Employees said some of the teens may have also gone to the Dollar Tree nearby in the same shopping plaza.

Police quickly arrived at the scene and saw the suspects trying to get into the SUV. They were told to lay on the ground. All but two females complied with police orders and attempted to flee, but all the suspects were quickly apprehended.

During a search, police found a folding knife in one of the females' pockets and determined it had been stolen from Dollar Tree. Inside the SUV, police found nearly \$280 worth of stolen merchandise from Big Lots. Police also found a bag containing nine cell phones but could not confirm they had been stolen. Another \$14 worth of items were found on the teens which had been stolen from Dollar Tree.

Theft charges for all the individuals are pending through the Youth Bureau. All stolen merchandise was returned to the stores.

## Theft

A shopper at Marc's in Garfield Commons said her purse was snatched from her cart while in the parking lot on December 5th, around 12:45 p.m. She said an SUV with tinted windows pulled up next to her and the backseat passenger reached out the window and snatched her purse then fled southbound on Turney Rd. Her wallet, containing credit cards and \$375 cash, her CCW permit and a bottle of Oxycodone pills were in the stolen purse. Police searched the area for the suspect vehicle with negative results.

## Weapon Offense

Police were dispatched to the 9700 block of McCracken Blvd. on December 9th, around 8:30 p.m., for a report of six shots fired. Police found a home in that block had been damaged by the gunfire. The front living room picture window had a bullet hole in it, and police found the bullet inside the house behind a couch. No injuries were reported. Witnesses said a dark vehicle had been driving by before the incident but police searched the area and nothing was found.
