Bedford Council holds last meeting of the year

Bedford officials reflected on the year gone by in the city and expressed optimism for plans in the year ahead at the council meeting last week.

Mayor Stan Koci stated, "We did a lot this year, and I'm not going to get into all the specifics. We'll save that for the State of the City address at the end of next month.'

The annual State of the City address will be at noon on Wednesday, January 30, at Light of Hearts Villa, City Manager Mike Mallis stated.

Koci thanked all the citizens for their support this past year. "I think we're going in the right direction," he said.

Mallis gave his thanks to the Bedford Police Department and several other local police departments for their work in the recent "Shop With A Cop" event in which kids got to go Christmas shopping at the Target in Northfield. "We were able to take the most children that we've ever been able to take, and we received a large donation from Xellia," he said. Xellia is the pharmaceutical company in the former Ben Venue facility

"Xellia actually sent some of their employees with our guys, and they helped take the kids around shopping. So it was a great event. They did a great job and it was really nice to see the community's interaction with the children," Mallis continued. He also thanked the auto dealers and other businesses for their generous "Shop with a Cop" donations.

He also said the city is seeking to attract new business to the community, "including a very active business which is pursuing the former US Bank facility on Rockside Road," referring to the mortgage division which shut down earlier this year. "It looks like it's going to be pretty encouraging."

Mallis went on to say city officials are meeting this week with the new and former property owners of Meadowbrook, the shopping center on the corner of Northfield and Rockside roads in the city.

He said they are ironing out the final plan for the zoning in that area and hope to present it to the Planning Commission as the first step in the new calen-

Fatal fire at Bedford apartment complex

A man died and a toddler was injured in an apartment fire at the Center Park Apartments on Center Road in Bedford last Friday, according to the Bedford Fire Department.

Firefighters were called to the apartment complex around 10:45 p.m. Friday, Dec. 21, for a report of smoke in the building. When firefighters arrived, bystanders said there were victims inside the second unit, according to the Bedford Fire Department.

A man and two-year-old toddler were rescued from the apartment and taken to Bedford Medical Center, The Plain Dealer reported. The man, Gregory Jones, 49, died at the hospital and the young boy was flown to a hospital in Toledo and was being treated for smoke inhalation, according to The PD. Bedford Fire Department Chief Dave Nagy said the boy was last known to be in critical but stable condition.

The fire was contained to the apartment of origin. Nagy said the state fire marshals are investigating, but he believes it was an accidental kitchen fire.

Units from Maple Heights, Bedford Heights, Oakwood, Garfield Heights, North Randall, Valley View, Northfield Village and numerous other fire departments responded for assistance.




9:25 a.m., an unknown male suspect robbed a Brinks employee as he was servicing the Citizens Bank's ATM at 5841 Broadway Ave. in Cleveland, according Anderson. The ATM is located in the southwest corner of the parking lot next to Save-a-Lot and Citi Trends Stores.

The suspect, who was waiting in the parking lot, approached the Brinks employee on a motorcycle, possibly a Yamaha with a chromé gas tank. The suspect, while on the motorcycle, stopped at the ATM and pointed a black handgun at the employee and demanded cash, according to Anderson. The Brinks employee complied and handed over the cash in the Brinks bag that was for the ATM. The suspect took the cash and placed it into his shoulder bag and left the lot on the motorcycle onto Cable Avenue toward Adolpha Avenue, according to Anderson.

Anderson said the FBI has received conflicting reports on the suspect's description, but he was wearing a gray mask over his nose and mouth and a gray hooded sweatshirt, dark puffy coat over a hoodie with a gold badge displayed on chest, pants, gloves and boots at the time of the robbery.

Reward money is available for tips leading to the successful identification and prosecution of the individual responsible. Tips can remain anonymous and can be provided to the Cleveland Division of the FBI, the Cleveland Division of Police or Crime Stoppers.

Drivers with violations may get break with new bill

House Bill 336 has created a six-month program for reinstatement fee reductions for offenders whose driver's licenses have been suspended for specific violations. Effective January 31, 2019, a person who has a suspended license may apply for a reduction in reinstatement fees if they have completed all court-ordered sanctions and at least 18 months have passed since the suspension ended.

They can apply for complete amnesty if they have completed all court ordered sanctions and they can demonstrate proof of indigence. If the person owes reinstatement fees for multiple offenses, they will either have to pay the lowest fee owed or 10 percent of the total, whichever is greater. If they owe reinstatement fees for reinstatement fees.
