Maple Hts. Council ok's \$22.5M budget for 2019

Maple Heights Council passed legislation last week approving the 2019 budget for the city in the amount of \$22,507,905 at its final meeting of the year.

Council called the special meeting on Thursday, Dec. 27, to resolve year-end business, as no legislation was passed at its regular meeting of Wednesday, Dec. 19, Council Clerk Leonette Cicirella stated.

The appropriations, which will cover expenses, expenditures and operations for 2019, include a little under \$3 million apiece for the city's police and fire departments, \$1.6 million for water and sewer maintenance, \$1.7 million for trash collection and \$1.3 million for streets, among other funding.

Included in the information provided by the city was Included in the information provided by the city was a statement of the estimated receipts for 2019, in the in civil rights lawsuit projected amount of \$26,235,141.

Closing the books for the year, council also passed an ordinance providing for an amendment to the budget for 2018, "to account for certain additional expenditures," the legislation stated. The amended budget for 2018 was stated at \$21.6 million, with 2018 estimated resources stated at \$26.2 million.

A companion ordinance was also passed for the city to prepare and file an amended 2018 Certificate of Estimated Resources with the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer, as required by Ohio Revised Code.

An ordinance for the city to file an amended 2019 Certificate of Estimated Resources with the county, which was placed on first reading at the December 19th meeting, was placed on second reading at last week's meeting. This legislation is on the agenda for the council meeting to be held tonight, Wednesday, Jan. 2, at 7 p.m. at the Maple Heights Senior Center, 15901 Libby Rd., Cicirella stated.

Shared Services Agreement on agenda

A resolution for the city to hire Garfield Heights Finance Director Barbara Biro to also serve as acting finance director for the city of Maple Heights was placed in Finance Committee at the December 19th meeting, and remained in committee at the December 27th meeting, Cicirella stated, adding that this legislation is also on tonight's meeting agenda.

The Shared Services Agreement, authorized by Ohio Revised Code, is a unique arrangement in that if council actually passes it, Biro will serve both Garfield Heights and Maple Heights as finance director.

Garfield Heights Council has already passed legislation to approve its end of the agreement, stating Biro's considerable experience with financial services.

Other legislation

An ordinance adopting the 2018 Master Plan for Maple Heights was placed on second reading at the December 19th meeting. This would be the first Master

Suspect charged in Gertrude Ave. slaying

Cornelius Pames, Jr., 25, was charged last week with aggravated murder in connection to the death of 94year-old Eucebia Garcia in a violent home invasion on Gertrude Avenue in Slavic Village in September, according to Cleveland Municipal Court records.

Police had been investigating the death of Garcia and the assault on her daughter, Marina, during the violent home invasion and robbery on September 17th.

Garcia and her daughter were from Honduras and were staying in Slavic Village visiting family.

Garfield Hts. agrees to \$80,000 settlement

Earlier this month the city of Garfield Heights agreed to pay \$80,000 in connection with a federal civil rights lawsuit brought by a resident alleging First Amendment and Fourth Amendment police-brutality violations, according to a press release from Robert Spencer's lawyers at the Chandra Law Firm in Cleveland.

The complaint alleged that in July 2017, Garfield Heights police officers drove a patrol car down Spencer's street and passed him while he was outside in his yard. The Chandra press release stated that the officers confronted Spencer "with false and rapidly evolving accounts of 'threats' he supposedly made as they drove by and resorted to violence without provocation when Spencer laughed and insulted them.

The city also agreed as part of the settlement to provide mandatory and adequate training to all active duty police officers" and "provide all training materials and attendance records" to Chandra Law for advance approval - subject to judicial enforcement - on several and kidnapping. constitutional and civil rights protections.

Garfield Heights Law Director Tim Riley said the city stands by the terms of the settlement.

"When reviewing the strategy of settling a case," Riley said, "many issues are considered, including the cost of protracted litigation. As the settlement agreement indicates, the city of Garfield Heights did not admit liability in this matter. This resolution was a compromise by both parties to end the litigation.'

Marina Garcia, 74, had been severely beaten and was taken to MetroHealth Medical Center where she eventually recovered from bleeding on her brain and was released, according to The Plain Dealer.

Pames is currently jailed under a \$50,000 bond in a separate case in which he is accused of gross sexual imposition, importuning, aggravated menacing and kidnapping, according to Cuyahoga County Court

It was reported that on September 12th, Pames allegedly tried to get a 13-year-old girl to have sex with him for money, and the incident occurred about one block away from where Garcia was killed days later, according to The PD. He pleaded not guilty to the charges, court

Cleveland Police Sergeant Jennifer Ciaccia said information that led to the conclusion Pames may be responsible for the murder is not yet for release as it is part of the ongoing investigation.

Ward 12 Councilman Anthony Brancatelli congratulated Cleveland Police Commander Brandon Kutz on making an arrest in the murder of Garcia and said, "I understand there was a lot of good police work done here and I want to commend your team for their determination and efforts.

Cuyahoga County Court records state Pames was to have a psychiatric evaluation to see if he was legally sane in connection with the Gertrude Avenue gross sexual imposition case and to see if his case is eligible to be sent to mental health court.

Pames has an extensive criminal history including charges of aggravated theft, burglary and robbery, rape

New Year's Pork and Sauerkraut Dinner

2 (2 lb.) jars sauerkraut

2 (6 oz.) cans apple juice

1 lb. bacon

1 lb. bratwurst

1 lb. kielbasa

1 lb. smoked pork chops

10 small red skin potatoes

10 small onions

6 large apples

1 lb. carrots

Preliminaries: Using a colander, rinse sauerkraut under a stream of cool water. Drain, then by handfuls, squeeze out as much water as possible. Spread out in a freshly grated nutmeg large bowl, pour in apple juice, and mix well.

Directions: In a large roaster, first cook the bacon, then brown the bratwurst in the drippings. Add the kraut and the other two meats and combine well. Add the rest of the ingredients and blend until well distributed. Cover and slowly cook in a 300° oven for three

Cranberry Crunch

1 cup oats (I use old fashioned, but quick will work) 1/2 cup all purpose flour

1 (16 oz.) can whole berry cranberry sauce 1 cup brown sugar (I use dark but light is fine) ½ cup butter or margarine

Mix the oats, flour, and brown sugar together. Cut in butter. Pack half in bottom of greased pie plate or 8x8 dish. Spread sauce over crust. Top with remaining crumbs

Bake at 350° for 45 minutes to 1 hour, or until lightly browned. Excellent served with whipped cream or ice cream. (Note: I have made this with a fruit pie filling instead of cranberry sauce, and only used ½ cup sugar.)

CRUST:

11/2 sticks unsalted butter, softened 2 cups graham cracker crumbs

11/4 cups sugar

1 tsp. cinnamon

½ tsp. nutmeg

½ tsp. ginger

FILLING:

6 large eggs

2 cups whole milk

11/2 cups sugar

pinch of sea salt

½ cup cold water

In mixer bowl, combine all crust ingredients on me-Cut up all meats into bite size pieces. Scrub potatoes dium speed. Press into two buttered pie pans. Bake at 325° for only 15 minutes. (This can be done a day in advance if desired).

> For the filling: Separate eggs, putting yolks in a 1quart Pyrex pitcher and whites in the mixer bowl.

> In top of double boiler bring milk, sugar and salt just to the boiling point. Turn heat down to medium, beat egg yolks and add to the hot milk mixture. Cook and stir from 10-15 minutes, until custard thickens and bubbles.

> While custard is cooking - Place water in a 1 cup Pyrex measuring cup, add gelatin and stir to soften. Remove thicken custard from heat, stir in gelatin and rum extract. Pour through sieve into a very large bowl. Cover by laying saran wrap directly on the custard so a skin cannot form. Let cool to room temperature, about 45 minutes. Then place in refrigerator for an hour or until it reaches the consistency of pudding.

> Beat egg whites until stiff, set aside. Whip cream until stiff, add the cooled custard by cupfuls and slowly blend very well. Transfer the whipped cream/custard back into that same very large bowl. Fold in the egg whites. Spoon into pie shells, mounding in the center.







Strangers go the extra mile to help M.H. toddler Independence Council

while driving down a Maple Heights street and decided doing nothing wasn't an option. They stopped.

According to a Facebook post made by the Maple Heights Police Department, on December 23rd, around 5:30 p.m., two young men, Rayfield Hallman and Steven William Wood, were driving past the intersection of Cato and Raymond streets in Maple Heights, when Hallman saw a very small girl alone. Concerned about the child, he stopped to check and make sure everything was okay. He then discovered a woman was on the ground in the doorway of a nearby home, going in and out of consciousness.

Hallman and Wood called 911 to get the woman help and took the toddler to sit in their vehicle to get her out

"They even grabbed the victim's small poodle which was outside with her," according to the Facebook post written by MHPD Officer George Allen. The men stood by until police arrived on scene. It was determined that the woman was suffering from some sort of seizure. The fire department soon arrived and took the woman to Marymount Hospital for treatment.

"Rayfield's and Steven's decision to show concern for another person probably saved not only the woman's life, but possibly saved the life of her daughter, who was outside in the night cold (36 degrees) and at the young

take action to care for herself," said Allen in the social media post.

"Rayfield and Steven decided to show a high level of character and compassion. The woman, her daughter and her dog should be fine," Allen continued.

Both Hallman and Wood were given Mr. Chicken gift cards, as well as a heartfelt "thank you" for going out of their way to help someone else.

Independence Council, at its December 11th meeting, passed legislation to increase the current billing rates for EMS ambulance services within the city.

Fire Chief Steve Rega said these changes were recommended by the city's EMS billing company, Medicount Management, following a recent review. The new rates are consistent with what other EMS services are charging throughout the state, he said.

The adjustments for the three levels of service are as follows: Basic Life Support (BLS) service will remain the same at \$650.

Advanced Life Support (ALS) service will increase from \$750 to \$850.

Advanced Life Support II (ALS) service will increase from \$950 to \$1,000.

Mileage rate will increase from \$14 to \$15 per mile.

"The last time we adjusted these rates was in March of 2016," Rega said. "Adjustments at that time were made for the same reason.


