Independence Council honors 'Shop with a Cop' organizer Nick DiMarco

Independence City Council began its Feb. 12 meeting with a special procla-

Judge Deborah Nicastro, presiding and administrative judge of Garfield Heights Municipal Court, presented Nick DiMarco, former Garfield Heights Police Department lieutenant and current Independence resident, with a proclamation declaring Feb. 12 as "Lieutenant Nick DiMarco Day.

DiMarco was instrumental in bringing the Shop with a Cop program to the George Murray Fraternal Order of Police, which represents 18 southeast Greater Cleveland law enforcement agencies. The program, adopted in the area in 1996, now includes 20 local police departments. This year it provided 352 children with \$150 each so they could shop with a local officer for holiday gifts.

Woman arrested in connection with murder of G.H. man

Last Wednesday, Feb. 13, members of the Northern Ohio Violent Fugitive Task Force arrested Shakira Graham, 24, on a warrant for homicide stemming from an incident in Garfield Heights in December 2018.

It is alleged that on December 17, 2018, Graham shot and killed 27-year-old Meshach Cornwall inside his Garfield Heights home on Darlington Ave.

Graham and Cornwall supposedly met on a dating website and Graham stayed over at Cornwall's residence on December 15, 2018, according to a press release from the U.S. Marshals Service. Two days later, Graham allegedly returned to kill Cornwall and steal various items from his residence.

Last Wednesday night members of the U.S. Marshals Violent Fugitive Task

Force arrested Graham at her mother's home on Fairmount Boulevard in Cleveland She was taken straight to the Garfield Heights Police Department for questioning and is currently being held on a \$3 million bond.

US Marshal Pete Elliott commented, "Thanks to the tireless efforts of the Garfield Heights Police Department and our task force members, a violent fugitive is off the streets. We are very proud of the working relationships we share with the local police departments in Northern Ohio."

Bourbon Street Pecan Pie

1 cup packed brown sugar

1/4 cup unbleached flour

1/4 tsp. sea salt

1 cup dark corn syrup

2 eggs, lightly beaten

6 oz. heavy cream

1 Tbsp. bourbon

1 cup roughly chopped pecans

Have ready an unbaked pie shell of choice. Preheat oven to 400°.

In mixer bowl with flat beating, using the lowest possible setting, combine the brown sugar, flour and salt. Add the corn syrup and blend thoroughly. Add the beaten eggs and continue to blend very slowly (you do not want frothy bubbles). Blend in the heavy cream and bourbon, then add the pecans.

Pour into the prepared pie shell - cover edges with a pie crust protector or foil strips. Bake at 400° for 15 minutes, then lower heat to 350° and bake an additional 45 to 50 minutes.





Former Cleveland cop charged with felony sex offenses in Garfield Hts.

Ex-Cleveland police officer Mario Lozada has been charged with two felony sex offenses following his Nov. 14, 2018 arrest.

The charges include pandering sexually oriented material involving a minor and unlawful sexual conduct with a minor, according to court records. They stem from an incident near Donovan Park in Garfield Heights in which police discovered 55-year-old Lozada in a dark-colored SUV with a 15-year-old girl.

SUV enter the area around 11:45 p.m., according to the p.m. in the Garfield Heights Civic Center, 5407 Turney police report. The officer stopped Lozada for a traffic Rd. violation and noticed a gun in the vehicle, the report states. Officers searched the vehicle and found a Cleveland police uniform, badge, duty belt and other police gear. Lozada stated he was a Cleveland police officer.

When asked why he did not originally identify himself as a police officer, Lozada said he did not want to identify himself while officers wore body cameras and Thursday, Feb. 28, at 7 p.m. in the St. Augustine Room 'was not that kind of guy," according to the report.

Lozada was previously charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor and improperly handling a firearm in a motor vehicle in connection with the incident. However, those charges were dismissed. The felony charges stem from additional investigation, including interviews and evidence from the SUV and a cell
