Maple Heights Mayor Annette Blackwell gave her "State of the City" address, sponsored by the Southeast Region Chamber of Commerce, to a packed house last Thursday at the Maple Heights Senior Center.

With a powerpoint presentation and an energetic delivery, she pointed out the many successes for the city over the past year along with an optimistic outlook for the year ahead.

## County to locate BMV auto title office to Meadowbrook in Bedford this June

Cuyahoga County has announced plans to relocate one of four of its Bureau of Motor Vehicles auto title offices from Garfield Heights to the Meadowbrook shopping center at Northfield and Rockside roads in Bedford, City Manager Mike Mallis said at the Bedford Council meeting last week.

'After much discussion with my wife and family I have made up my mind that I was not going to seek re-election this fall for my seventh term as finance director (in Independence)," Veres told Togliatti. "Although I have enjoyed my role for the last 19 years with the city, at the end of the day not seeking re-election is the best decision for me and my family going forward."

He said an opportunity presented itself sooner than expected, and he has accepted the finance director's position in Macedonia starting in March, 2019.

Veres noted that after discussion with both Macedonia Mayor Nicholas Molnar and Mayor Togliatti, he will be working in both communities through the transition to a new Independence finance director.





## Maple Hts. to apply for Safe Routes To School funds

In an effort to improve safety for students going to and from school in the city, Maple Heights Council approved legislation to apply for funding from the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program, at its meeting last

The U.S. Congress has set aside monies for the SRTS projects through the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT), and total cost of the project in Maple Heights is estimated at just under \$300,000, according to the resolution.

The city "will work closely with the Maple Heights City Schools to improve student safety as children go to and from school, which is a transportation activity eligible to receive federal funding," the resolution states.

The mission of the Maple Heights Safe Routes to School coalition "is to create opportunities that will increase and encourage students and families to bike and walk to school safely while improving the overall health and wellness of the community and fostering environmental responsibility," the ODOT plan states.

Upon completion of the project, the city is required to provide adequate maintenance for the project according to state and federal laws, provide financing for maintenance, maintain the right of way and keep it free of obstructions and keep the right of way intact for public highway purposes.

#### **Property transfers**

Council passed a resolution authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell to transfer two residential properties owned by the city's Land Reutilization Program to Slavic Village Development for the Maple Heights Home Ownership Program.

The two properties to be acquired by SVD are at 16010

Corkhill Rd., and at 21414 Clare Rd., and will be has stated he wants to purchase the vacant lot next door transferred into the Maple Heights Ownership Program, which is a unique partnership between Maple Heights and SVD "for residential development of lightly distressed homes in the city," the legislation states.

Blackwell and other city officials, as seller of the properties, are authorized to file all documents and pay any closing fees to the Cuyahoga County Recorder and the Fiscal Officer from Maple Heights to Slavic Village Development.

#### Vacant lots to be sold

Council passed a resolution determining that two vacant residential lots owned by the city are not needed for municipal purposes, a necessary step before they are offered for sale to adjacent homeowners.

One of the two vacant lots is on a "paper street" (only visible on maps) section of Schreiber Road, while the other vacant lot is on Rockside Road, according to the legislation.

A homeowner on Woodbrook Avenue has expressed his wish to purchase the vacant Schreiber lot, located behind his house. And a homeowner on Rockside Road

to his house through the side yard program.

#### Other properties donated

Two pieces of legislation were passed by council at last week's meeting to authorize the city to accept the donation of two unimproved lots into the Land Reutilization Program, one on Milan Drive and one on E. 146th St.

#### Park expenses approved

Council Clerk Leonette Cicirella stated that council also approved, by separate motions at last week's meeting, two expenditures for the Lee-Libby pocket park, to be paid through the remaining balance of a 2018 Cuyahoga County Community Development Supplemental Grant.

Authorized were payments of \$4,962.48 to Rusty Oak Nursery for purchase of 24 trees and \$2,200 to Gales Garden Center for purchase of four other trees for the project, Cicirella stated.

The last of the former Ceo's Tavern property on Warner Road and Garfield Boulevard in Garfield Heights was razed Monday as the house, owned by the city, was determined to be unsafe and should be demolished. The city had acquired the property through tax foreclosure and had hoped to restore the old Warner Homestead, which was built in the 1800s, but funding was not available and the house continued to deteriorate. The property zoning is U-4, retail/ general business, and will be marketed for sale once it is graded and cleaned up, according to Garfield Heights Economic Director Noreen Kuban.
