I-77N at I-480 to close this weekend

ODOT will close I-77 northbound at I-480 and the I-480 east and westbound ramps to I-77 northbound from 11 p.m. Friday, April 12, to 7 p.m. Saturday, April 13. This will allow crews to perform lane realignment and guardrail operations.

Northbound traffic will detour via I-490, SR 176 and I-480. Vehicles entering the highway north of I-480 will be forced to exit at Broadway Avenue.

Additionally, I-77 southbound over I-490 will be reduced to one lane from 1 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, April 13.

Sparks fly as summer council schedule in G.H. draws controversy

A resolution providing for only one council meeting to be held on the second Monday during the months of May, June, July and August, 2019, drew criticism from Ward 4 Councilman Eugene Glenn at Monday night's Garfield Heights Council meeting, and ended with Glenn being voted out of the meeting.

Councilman Glenn has never been a fan of the resolution, routinely passed each spring by council. He told council Monday night that members were paid to attend 24 meetings a year and that to cancel four of those meetings was not right.

"It's like voting ourselves paid time off," he said in an interview Tuesday with this reporter. While the vote on the resolution was being taken at Monday's meeting, Glenn also commented that some council members have routinely covered for each other's missed meetings with excused absences.

"The only reason I wouldn't be at a meeting would be if I were in the hospital," Glenn said.

Council President Matt Burke asked Glenn to wrap up his comments and vote on the resolution. Burke said the conversation had veered away for the actual contents of the resolution, which he said "is against the rules." Glenn told The Neighborhood News that Burke could not cite the rule Glenn was violating and believed it was a matter of freedom of speech that he be allowed to continue.

Burke asked Police Chief Robert Byrne to eject Glenn from the meeting, but Councilman Michael Dudley objected. A vote on Glenn's expulsion was then called with five members voting for his removal and Glenn and Dudley voting against it. Councilman Glenn then left quietly on his own.

The American Cancer Society is in need of more volunteer drivers to support the Road To Recovery program which provides cancer patients with free rides to treatment. This year an estimated 67,100 residents of Ohio will be diagnosed with cancer and for some getting to treatments can be very difficult.

"Every month dozens of patients from Greater Cleveland need a ride to and from their treatments," said TJ Gerrett, program manager at the American Cancer Society. "Even the best treatment can't work if a cancer patient can't get there."

The American Cancer Society currently has a small

team of Road To Recovery drivers who live in Cuyahoga County, but the need for drivers is greater than the number of volunteers. In some communities, due to the lack of drivers, transportation needs can go unmet.

In the next few weeks the American Cancer Society anticipates the need to train several more drivers from throughout the area in order to meet the growing need of those facing cancer in the community. The need is especially great in Garfield Heights, Bedford and Cuyahoga Heights.

All drivers must have: valid driver's license, good driving record, access to a safe and reliable vehicle, com-

puter or tablet access, and some flexible availability Monday-Fridays from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. The American Cancer Society screens and trains all volunteer drivers and coordinates the rides for patients. Volunteer drivers donate their time and can provide as many or as few rides as they want.



Garfield Heights hosts ribbon cutting for new medical marijuana dispensary

Garfield Heights Mayor Vic Collova cut the ribbon for the grand opening of Terrasana Cannabis Company, which opened a medical marijuana dispensary on Antenucci Boulevard on March 28.

It is the first dispensary to open in the Greater Cleveland area.

"This is a great partnership with the city of Garfield Heights," Collova said. "It will help our residents and people throughout the state. We are very pleased to be part of it."

Terrasana, founded by William Kedia, M.D., who attended the ribbon-cutting, aims to bring a unique medical perspective to the market with health professionals from world-renowned institutions. Industry veterans serve as strategic consultants and advisory board members for the company,

and senior leadership includes executives and owners from the legal, medical, operational, finance and real estate sectors, which the company said gives it the expertise needed to navigate the highly regulated market of medical marijuana.

"I really appreciate the mayor, city council and the residents of Garfield Heights who are here with us to open our brand new dispensary," said Kedia, who is also Terrasana's chief medical officer and head of research. "We have been looking forward to this for I can't tell you how many years now. It's been a long road, and we really appreciate all the help we've received from the city, from the mayor and from everyone else involved. So thank you. Thank you, all."

Terrasana says it is focused on both providing a high-quality product and educating

The resolution calling for one regular council meeting during the months of May through August was approved by a vote of 5 to 1, with Councilman Dudley voting against it.

Burke pointed out that council will have special meetings as needed throughout the summer. He said that council had met four times in the past month with two special meetings called because of a sign issue.

Councilman Joseph Suster said there were "lots of special meetings last year," weighing in on the issue.

Councilman Tom Vaughn noted that he was not in

attendance at the last council meeting because his son had been taken to the hospital and was in the intensive care unit and that "family will always come first with me."

He told Finance Director Barbara Biro that "if my pay should be docked for that so be it."

Vaughn suggested that a meeting be held to go over the rules of conduct for council. Burke said he would arrange such a meeting.

The following emergency ordinances were passed by Garfield Heights Council at its meeting Monday night:

- Authorizing the mayor to renew an agreement on behalf of the city with Court Community Service.

- Selling two vehicles no

longer needed by the Recreation Department.

- Directing City Engineer David Krock to prepare plans for the Midwest Neighborhood Storm/Sanitary Sewer System Reconstruction Project-Phase 2, and authorizing payment of costs through funding by the Cuyahoga County Storm Sewer Funds.

During his report to council, Mayor Vic Collova congratulated the 10U and 12U hockey members present at the meeting on an exceptional season and noted the 50th anniversary this year of the hockey program in Garfield Heights.

This project, expected to cost more than a half million dollars, is receiving funding from a variety of state and county sources, according to the legislation.

Another resolution was passed by council for a contract with HR Construction Services, LLC, to provide for construction of a street sweeping pad at the Dunham Road Service Center, at a cost of \$19,861.

The cost of the street sweeping pad, which will address the city's Ohio Environmental Protection Agency stormwater management permit requirements, will be 100 percent reimbursable by the Sewer District, and the city was successful in obtaining \$135,000 in Community Cost Share Program funds, Hren stated.

Council passed a resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into an Employee Assistance Service Program Agreement for city employees to have access to an employee assistance program and counseling and recommended such services be provided by The Centers for Families and Children.

The Centers' services "will include assessment, referral and problem focused counseling sessions for full-time employees and their family members; management consultations; fitness for duty consultations and support; critical incident response; and wellness coaching... The Centers will bill the city \$26 per employee per year based upon a three-session model for 100 full-time employees, with the minimum payment being \$2,600 per year."

Council also passed a resolution enacting the summer council meeting schedule. Council meetings will be held once a month on the following Wednesdays: June 5, July 3 and August 7. All meetings will be held at 7 p.m. at the Maple Heights Senior Center, 15901 Libby Rd.

A resolution to enact a temporary moratorium on enforcement of a section of the codified ordinances requiring point of sale/property maintenance inspections was placed in the Housing and Economic Development Committee for review.

Property legislation passed

Council passed a resolution directing Blackwell to enter into an agreement with Christian Unity Baptist Church, 16811 Broadway Ave., to sell the church an adjacent city-owned vacant lot for \$5,000. Deed restrictions require the lot be used "only for a parking lot and installation of landscaping to beautify the lot," the legislation states.

Also passed was a resolution authorizing Blackwell and the city's housing manager to accept a donation of one unimproved parcel of land located along Stefanik Street to the city's Land Reutilization Program.

Young resident honored

District 7 Councilwoman Edwina Agee gave a special presentation at the meeting honoring Noah Cunningham, a 10-year-old resident of Agee's district who "is an outstanding student and is doing positive things in his life," the councilwoman stated.

Noah is a fourth grader at St. Benedict Catholic School, where he is a 3.81 GPA student and a member of the Art Club, Agee stated.

Agee also gave special thanks to Noah's mother, Tana Richey, and his grandparents for their involved and dedicated support of Noah's scholarship, artistic and athletic activities.

Mayor Koci says 2020 census will help Bedford

Described by Bedford Mayor Stan Koci as "the largest government mobilization" outside of a war in U.S. history, the 2020 census, starting on April 1 of next year, will yield results that will ultimately help the city of Bedford, he said at the council meeting last week.

Koci explained, "2020 is the next census and it is really important to cities that we get an accurate count. There's so much riding on what this census tells people, including the number of representatives we get."

"The money that comes to us in grants and federal projects is based on the census, so we need an accurate count. And they are looking for 450,000 people to be census takers and to follow up with people who don't fill out the census," Koci continued.

He said those wanting a job as a census taker can go to 2020census.gov/jobs for more information.

License suspension program

The state of Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles is conducting an amnesty program for certain fees on suspended driver's licenses until July 31, 2019, and the Bedford Municipal Court is involved in the program, Koci and Law Director John Montello stated at the meeting.

The amnesty program pertains to suspensions for specific offenses, such as driving without insurance and other non-alcohol/drug/weapon-related offenses, according to the Ohio BMV website. For more information on the program, visit www.bmv.ohio.gov/susp-fees-amnesty.

Legislation on agenda

Legislation passed at last week's meeting included:

Council meetings and the "State of the City" address will now be recorded for anyone to view, as council passed an ordinance for the city to enter into a three-year contract with LPV Productions, Inc. for video services for those public meetings at a cost of \$9,435.

Also passed was a resolution for the city to enter into a contract with Oak Group, Inc. to provide additional master plans examiner and building official services for the city's building department.

An ordinance to levy assessments for delinquent water bills on properties owned in the city (about \$28,000 owed for 58 parcels) was passed.

Also okayed was an ordinance to amend existing legislation entitled "Use of Public Ways for Small Cell Wireless Facilities and Wireless Support Structures" of the city, referring to wireless equipment and accompanying structures, including antennas.

And an ordinance passed amending an existing ordinance for the city to enter into an agreement for the Village of Orange to use Bedford's jail facilities. Montello said the legislation renewed the current contract for

another year, and Orange would only be allowed to use Bedford's jail if space were available.

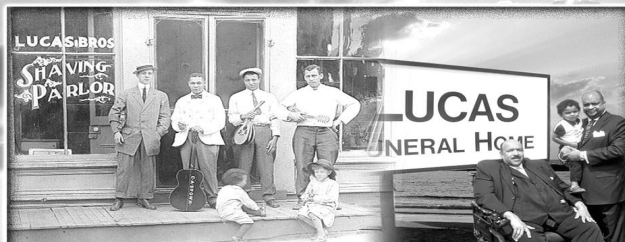

company said. Ohio has the second highest rate of opioid-related deaths based on data from the CDC's National Center for Health Statistics. Terrasana actively works with researchers to further validate cannabis as a substitute for opiates and reduce addiction, according to the company.

Terrasana also recently opened a dispensary in Columbus with plans to open two additional stores in Fremont and Springfield in the next few months.

To purchase medical marijuana, patients must determine if they have one of the 21 current qualifying medical conditions. Under Ohio law, qualifying medical conditions are AIDS, amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, Alzheimer's disease, cancer, chronic traumatic encephalopathy, Crohn's disease, epilepsy or another seizure disorder,

der, fibromyalgia, glaucoma, hepatitis C, inflammatory bowel disease, multiple sclerosis, pain that is either chronic and severe or intractable, Parkinson's disease, positive HIV status, post-traumatic stress disorder, sickle cell anemia, spinal cord disease or injury, Tourette's syndrome, traumatic brain injury and ulcerative colitis.

They must find a doctor certified to recommend medical marijuana and

schedule an appointment so they can confirm their condition. Patients can then submit a new patient application to the State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy. In a few days they will receive the Ohio Marijuana Card and can purchase it at state-approved dispensaries.

Once at the dispensary, patients show their ID and Ohio Marijuana Card at the entrance. A staff member checks them into the

system. A sales associate calls the patient's name, then takes them back to the floor to show them available products (only plant-based marijuana is available right now).

Cleveland City Council considers moratorium on 'dollar store' permits

Cleveland City Council, at its Monday, April 1 meeting, introduced legislation that would place a moratorium on giving permits to open so-called "dollar stores."

The legislation says a proliferation of small-box general discount stores in Cleveland is hurting the local economy. The stores carry an array of consumer goods, including household items, health products, food and beverages.

The legislation notes:

"The strategy of Dollar Tree, Family Dollar and others is to saturate communities with multiple stores, making it impossible for local full-service grocery stores to stay open.

"Dollar stores have little selection of fresh food and most carry processed foods at inflated prices.

"Dollar stores employ fewer workers at lower wages than grocery stores and often face class-action lawsuits for violating fair labor standards."

The legislation will be sent to council's Development Planning & Sustainability Committee.
