

Stafford Pool in Maple Hts. to get facelift; won't reopen this season

Stafford Park Pool in Maple Heights, which has been closed for the past several years due to financial issues, will be getting a facelift in the coming months but not in time to open for this year's pool season.

Department of Development to rehab the pool and rehabilitation project, according to the resolution.

In November of last year, council passed a resolution authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell and Hren to file an application for funding to the county, under the 2019 Community Development Supplemental Grant Program.

I-77N at I-480 to close this weekend

ODOT will close I-77 northbound at I-480 and the I-480 east and westbound ramps to I-77 northbound from 11 p.m. Friday, April 12, to 7 p.m. Saturday, April 13. This will allow crews to perform lane realignment and guardrail operations.

Northbound traffic will detour via I-490. SR 176 and I-480. Vehicles entering the highway north of I-480 will be forced to exit at Broadway Avenue.

Additionally, I-77 southbound over I-490 will be reduced to one lane from 1 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, April 13.

Sparks fly as summer council schedule in **G.H.** draws controversy

A resolution providing for only one council meeting to be held on the second Monday during the months of May, June, July and August, 2019, drew criticism from Ward 4 Councilman Eugene Glenn at Monday night's Garfield Heights Council meeting, and ended with Glenn being voted out of the meeting.

Councilman Glenn has never been a fan of the resolution, routinely passed each spring by council. He told council Monday night that members were paid to attend 24 meetings a year and that to cancel four of those meetings was not right.

"It's like voting ourselves paid time off," he said in an Council passed a resolution at its meeting last week to interview Tuesday with this reporter. > "The only reason I wouldn't be at a meeting would be if I were in the hospital," Glenn said.

> Council President Matt Burke asked Glenn to wrap up his comments and vote on the resolution. Burke said the conversation had veered away for the actual contents of the resolution, which he said "is against the rules." Glenn told The Neighborhood News that Burke could not cite the rule Glenn was violating and believed it was a matter of freedom of speech that he be allowed to continue.

> Burke asked Police Chief Robert Byrne to eject Glenn objected. A vote on Glenn's expulsion was then called Dudley voting against it. Councilman Glenn then left quietly on his own.

This project, expected to cost more than a half million dollars, is receiving funding from a variety of state and county sources, according to the legislation.

Another resolution was passed by council for a contract with HR Construction Services, LLC, to provide for construction of a street sweeping pad at the Dunham Road Service Center, at a cost of \$19,861.

The cost of the street sweeping pad, which will address the city's Ohio Environmental Protection Agency stormwater management permit requirements, will be 100 percent reimbursable by the Sewer District, and the city was successful in obtaining \$135,000 in Community Cost Share Program funds, Hren stated.

Council passed a resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into an Employee Assistance Service Program Agreement for city employees to have access to an employee assistance program and counseling and recommended such services be provided by The Centers for Families and Children.

The Centers' services "will include assessment, referral and problem focused counseling sessions for full-time employees and their family members; management consultations; fitness for duty consultations and support; critical incident response; and wellness coaching... The Centers will bill the city \$26 per employee per year based upon a three-session model for 100 full-time employees, with the minimum payment being \$2,600 per year.'

Council also passed a resolution enacting the summer council meeting schedule. Council meetings will be held once a month on the following Wednesdays: June 5, July 3 and August 7. All meetings will be held at 7 p.m. at the Maple Heights Senior Center, 15901 Libby Rd.

A resolution to enact a temporary moratorium on enforcement of a section of the codified ordinances requiring point of sale/property maintenance inspections was placed in the Housing and Economic Development Committee for review.

Property legislation passed

Council passed a resolution directing Blackwell to enter into an agreement with Christian Unity Baptist Church, 16811 Broadway Ave., to sell the church an adjacent city-owned vacant lot for \$5,000. Deed restrictions require the lot be used "only for a parking lot and installation of landscaping to beautify the lot," the legislation states.

Also passed was a resolution authorizing Blackwell and the city's housing manager to accept a donation of one unimproved parcel of land located along Stefanik Street to the city's Land Reutilization Program.

Young resident honored

District 7 Councilwoman Edwina Agee gave a special presentation at the meeting honoring Noah Cunningham, a 10-year-old resident of Agee's district who "is an outstanding student and is doing positive things in his life," the councilwoman stated.

Noah is a fourth grader at St. Benedict Catholic School, where he is a 3.81 GPA student and a member of the Art Club, Agee stated.

Agee also gave special thanks to Noah's mother, Tana Richey, and his grandparents for their involved and dedicated support of Noah's scholarship, artistic and athletic activities.



Mayor Koci says 2020 census will help Bedford

Described by Bedford Mayor Stan Koci as "the largest government mobilization" outside of awar in U.S. history, the 2020 census, starting on April 1 of next year, will yield results that will ultimately help the city of Bedford, he said at the council meeting last week.

Koci explained, "2020 is the next census and it is really important to cities that we get an accurate count. There's so much riding on what this census tells people, including the number of representatives we get.'

"The money that comes to us in grants and federal projects is based on the census, so we need an accurate count. And they are looking for 450,000 people to be census takers and to follow up with people who don't fill out the census," Koci continued.

He said those wanting a job as a census taker can go to 2020census.gov/jobs for more information.

License suspension program

The state of Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles is conducting an amnesty program for certain fees on suspended driver's licenses until July 31, 2019, and the Bedford Municipal Court is involved in the program, Koci and Law Director John Montello stated at the meeting.



Cleveland City Council considers moratorium on 'dollar store' permits

Cleveland City Council, at its Monday, April 1 meeting, introduced legislation that would place a moratorium on giving permits to open so-called "dollar stores."

The legislation says a proliferation of small-box general discount stores in Cleveland is hurting the local economy. The stores carry an array of consumer goods, including household items, health products, food and beverages.

The legislation notes:

"The strategy of Dollar Tree, Family Dollar and others is to saturate communities with multiple stores, making it impossible for local full-service grocery stores to stay open.

"Dollar stores have little selection of fresh food and most carry processed foods at inflated prices.

"Dollar stores employ fewer workers at lower wages than grocery stores and often face class-action lawsuits for violating fair labor standards."

The legislation will be sent to council's Development Planning & Sustainability Committee.


