## Cuyahoga County relocating Garfield Heights auto title bureau to Bedford

Cuyahoga County is relocating one of its five automobile title bureaus from Garfield Heights to Bedford. The temporary auto title bureau location at 14000 Broadway Ave., Garfield Heights, was permanently closed yesterday at the close of business. The license plate and driver's license services in Garfield Heights ceased doing business there several weeks ago. The auto title bureau will reopen at its new location at 22121 Rockside Rd., Bedford, this Monday, July 1.

The new auto title office will be located next to the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles deputy registrar and driver's examination station. This will enable residents and dealerships within the county to have "one-stop-shopping" for all their vehicle titling, operating and registration needs.

The hours of operation for the new Bedford auto title location will be: Mondays, 8:30 a.m. – 6 p.m.; Tuesdays, 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.; Wednesdays, 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.; Thursdays - closed; Fridays, 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.; Saturdays: 8:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.

## Woman shoots Slavic Village man who made her feel 'uncomfortable'

Police arrested a 24-year-old woman for allegedly shooting a 45-year-old Slavic Village man on June 24.

The victim said he met the woman at the gas station on the corner of East 71st Street and Fleet Avenue. He invited her to his residence in the 4000 block of East 78th Street, where she went into the bathroom. When the woman exited, she fired two rounds, hitting the man in the stomach and leg, and left the house. Police found two 9mm spent casings and one slug on the living room floor.

Police located the suspect on Jones Road, who confirmed that she had met the man at the gas station and went to his house. However, she stated the man propositioned her for \$50 and grabbed her buttocks, making her feel uncomfortable. She said she walked into the bathroom, loaded her gun and shot the man. She told police she had made no attempt to leave the house before the shooting. She also admitted to having a bag of suspected marijuana in her bra.

The woman was arrested for felonious assault and drug abuse. The victim was taken to MetroHealth Medical Center. The incident is under investigation.

## I-77 north and southbound, Transportation Blvd. entrance and exit ramps closed Friday to Monday

I-77 north and southbound between I-480 and I-490, as well as the Harvard Avenue ramp to I-77 south, will close from Friday, June 28, at 8 p.m. through Monday, July 1, at 5 a.m. for structural steel erection work. Motorists will detour via SR 176 for the I-77 closing and via East 49th Street to Grant Avenue for the Harvard Avenue ramp closing.


Additionally, crews will close the Transportation Boulevard entrance and exit ramps to I-480 westbound from Wednesday, June 26, at 8 p.m. to Thursday, June 27, at 5 a.m. for paving work. Motorists who want to access Transportation Boulevard will detour via Broadway Avenue to Granger Road to Transportation Boulevard. Motorists who want to access I-480 west will detour via I-480 east to Granger Road to I-480 west.

## Pineapple Date Bars

- 1/3 cup butter or margarine
- 2/3 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
- 1/3 cup granulated sugar
- 1 egg
- 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- 1 1/3 cups drained crushed pineapple
- 1 cup dates, cut fine
- 1/2 cup walnuts
- 2 cups sifted flour
- 1 tsp. salt

Cream butter or margarine. Gradually add sugars and egg. Blend well. In large bowl, stir soda into crushed pineapple; add dates, nuts and flour sifted together with salt. Add butter-sugar-egg mixture and blend all thoroughly. Spread into greased 12- x 8-inch pan and bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 35 minutes. Cut into bars while warm.

## Charlie's Baked Ribs

- 4 lbs. spareribs, cut into serving pieces
- 1 can (12 oz.) beer
- 1/2 cup finely chopped onion
- 2 T. chili sauce
- 2 T. ketchup
- 2 T. lemon juice
- 2 T. brown sugar
- 2 tsp. chili powder
- 2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 2 tsp. prepared mustard
- 1 tsp salt
- Dash pepper

Arrange spareribs in large roasting pan. Cover with heavy duty aluminum foil. Bake at 375 degrees for one hour. While ribs are cooking, combine beer, onion, chili sauce, ketchup, lemon juice, brown sugar, chili powder, Worcestershire sauce, mustard, salt and pepper. Simmer about 5 minutes. Pour drippings from roasting pan. Spoon half the sauce over partially cooked ribs. Bake one hour longer, brushing ribs often with remaining sauce. Turn ribs once or twice.

## Newburgh looks to perform flow testing on new sewer

At its regular meeting June 18, Newburgh Heights Village Council approved a resolution authorizing the mayor to prepare and submit an application to participate in Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORS) member community cost share program.

The village wants to perform flow testing on the newly constructed sewer on East 54th Street and Brow Avenue, and this program would help pay for the cost. The testing is considered a priority need for the community and is a qualified project under the NEORS programs, according to the ordinance.

Council also approved an ordinance authorizing the mayor to enter into a service agreement with WOW! for phone and Internet service to obtain better service at a similar cost.

Kathy Edwards Park will receive an upgrade as council approved the purchase of mulch from Midstates Recreation to restore the area under the playground equipment at a cost not to exceed \$1,550. The village has already power-washed the playground equipment in preparation for the summer.

Council also approved granting Lt. Mike Marniella, who returned to the force, 80 vacation hours based on his previous service with the

village, and hiring Daniel Peacock as a part-time patrol officer for the department.

Police Chief John Majoy reported that Newburgh Heights will be moving to Chagrin Valley Dispatch, the communication center for 16 municipalities in the Chagrin Valley and greater Cleveland area, in the next few weeks. Majoy said the department is ready and prepared for the move.

Majoy also said the police department's new website is now live at <https://newburgh-oh.gov/police-department>.

Councilwoman Gigi Traore said she is celebrating her first full year on council. She filled the posi-

tion left vacant after the passing of Councilman Richard Schippling. Traore took her oath of office in June 2018 and attended her first council meeting on July 17, 2018.

Traore expressed her thanks to Council President Steve Moran for his guidance and support.

Council will hold a hearing July 15 at 5:45 p.m. regarding the proposed Alternative Tax Budget Resolution for Fiscal Year 2020. A brief overview of the proposed resolution will be given at the hearing.

The next regular meeting of the Newburgh Heights Village Council is July 16 at 7 p.m.

## From the courtroom...



### Brittney McTier indicted

Brittney Nicole McTier, the mother of the 10-year-old Cleveland boy who allegedly shot and killed a 1-year-old in April, has been indicted by the Cuyahoga County Grand Jury, according to court records.

McTier was indicted on two charges of endangering children and one charge each of involuntary manslaughter and tampering with evidence. Her son has not been charged.

The incident happened April 20 in the 14200 block of Rexwood Avenue in Cleveland near the Garfield Heights border. The child was transported from the residence to MetroHealth Medical Center for treatment. He was pronounced dead at the hospital.

Her arraignment is set for June 27 at 8:30 a.m.

### Gregory Watts gets life

Gregory Watts, 58, was sentenced to life in prison for the March 2018 murder of Tasha Kushner, according to court records. He will be eligible for parole after 25 years.

Kushner, 31, was found dead in her home in the 6100 block of Morton Avenue in the North Broadway neighborhood of Slavic Village. According to the Cuyahoga County medical examiner, Kushner died from blunt force injuries to the head and neck.

Watts was found guilty on two counts of murder, and one count each of aggravated murder, aggravated burglary, kidnapping and felonious assault.
