Cuyahoga County relocating Garfield Heights auto title bureau to Bedford

Cuyahoga County is relocating one of its five automobile title bureaus from Garfield Heights to Bedford. The temporary auto title bureau location at 14000 Broadway Ave., Garfield Heights, was permanently closed yesterday at the close of business. The license plate and driver's license services in Garfield Heights ceased doing business there several weeks ago. The auto title bureau will reopen at its new location at 22121 Rockside Rd., Bedford, this Monday, July 1.

The new auto title office will be located next to the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles deputy registrar and driver's examination station. This will enable residents and dealerships within the county to have "one-stop-shopping" for all their vehicle titling, operating and registration needs.

Woman shoots Slavic Village man who made her feel 'uncomfortable'

Police arrested a 24-year-old woman for allegedly shooting a 45-year-old Slavic Village man on June 24.

The victim said he met the woman at the gas station on the corner of East 71st Street and Fleet Avenue. He invited her to his residence in the 4000 block of East 78th Street, where she went into the bathroom. When the woman exited, she fired two rounds, hitting the man in the stomach and leg, and left the house. Police found two 9mm spent casings and one slug on the living room floor.

Police located the suspect on Jones Road, who confirmed that she had met the man at the gas station and went to his house. However, she stated the man propositioned her for \$50 and grabbed her buttocks, making her feel uncomfortable. She said she walked into the bathroom, loaded her gun and shot the man. She told police she had made no attempt to leave the house before the shooting. She also admitted to having a bag of suspected marijuana in her bra.

The woman was arrested for felonious assault and drug abuse. The victim was taken to MetroHealth Medical Center. The incident is under investigation.

I-77 north and soundbound, Transportation Blvd. entrance and exit ramps closed Friday to Monday



1 cup dates, cut fine

1/2 cup walnuts

2 cups sifted flour

1 tsp. salt

Cream butter or margarine. Gradually add sugars and egg. Blend well. In large bowl, stir soda into crushed pineapple; add dates, nuts and flour sifted together with salt. Add butter-sugar-egg mixture and blend all thoroughly. Spread into greased 12- x 8-inch pan and bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 35 minutes. Cut into bars while warm.

1/2 cup finely chopped onion

2 T. chili sauce

2 T. ketchup

2 T. lemon juice

2 T. brown sugar

2 tsp. chili powder

2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

2 tsp. prepared mustard

1 tsp salt

Dash pepper

Arrange spareribs in large roasting pan. Cover with heavy duty aluminum foil. Bake at 375 degrees for one hour. While ribs are cooking, combine beer, onion, chili sauce, ketchup, lemon juice, brown sugar, chili powder, Worcestershire sauce, mustard, salt and pepper. Simmer about 5 minutes. Pour drippings from roasting pan. Spoon half the sauce over partially cooked ribs. Bake one hour longer, brushing ribs often with remaining sauce. Turn ribs once or twice.

Brittney McTier indicted

Brittney Nicole McTier, the mother of the 10-year-old Cleveland boy who allegedly shot and killed a 1-year-old in April, has been indicted by the Cuyahoga County Grand Jury, according to court records.

McTier was indicted on two charges of endangering children and one charge each of involuntary manslaughter and tampering with evidence. Her son has not been charged.

The incident happened April 20 in the 14200 block of Rexwood Avenue in Cleveland near the Garfield Heights border. The child was transported from the residence to MetroHealth Medical Center for treatment. He was pronounced dead at the hospital.

Her arraignment is set for June 27 at 8:30 a.m.

Gregory Watts gets life

Gregory Watts, 58, was sentenced to life in prison for the March 2018 murder of Tasha Kushner, according to court records. He will be eligible for parole after 25 years.

Kushner, 31, was found dead in her home in the 6100 block of Morton Avenue in the North Broadway neighborhood of Slavic Village. According to the Cuyahoga County medical examiner, Kushner died from blunt force injuries to the head and neck.

Watts was found guilty on two counts of murder, and one count each of aggravated murder, aggravated burglary, kidnapping and felonious assault.

Resisting arrest

On June 19 at about 12:05 a.m., police located a recently stolen vehicle behind Woodward Beverage at 5661 Turney Rd., and saw two men walking away from where the vehicle was parked, crossing Turney Road and heading west on Crofton Road. Police lost sight of the men, but an officer in the area then saw two men matching their descriptions walking south on Turney. They stopped at a bus shelter, but when they saw the marked police cruiser, the men got up and walked away. Police asked the men to stop, but they said "no" and started walking faster. They then crossed Turney Road without using a crosswalk. Officers again approached the men, but they still refused to stop. They then began running north on Turney. The men split up, and officers apprehended one of the suspects. The other suspect then charged at the police. Officers used a taser to subdue him, but only one probe connected, so an officer administered two fist strikes to his left rib area. He continued to resist arrest until he was tased again in the buttocks. Throughout the entire encounter, the suspects joked that they were going to sue the officers and said that they never stop for police and jay walk all the time. Both men were charged with failure to comply with a lawful order and resisting arrest. They were also cited for jay walking.


