Polish Festival this weekend at St. Stan's!!

The Shrine Church of St. Stanislaus, 3649 East 65 Street, Cleveland, will hold its annual Polish Festival this Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 4, 5 and 6, in the Social Center, 6601 Baxter Ave., Slavic Village.

The festival features Polish food cooked in the Old World style such as pierogi, kielbasa, czarnina, cabbage and noodles, potato pancakes, stuffed cabbage and many other favorites. A bakery booth will feature many items baked by parishioners along with games of chance, sideboards and boutiques. Two bars will be stocked with Polish and domestic beers, wine, spirits and the famous special lemon drink "cytrynowka."

The Polish Festival will be open on Friday from 5 to 9 p.m. Polish dinners will be served downstairs in the Social Center. Jimmy Kwill perform upstairs from 6:30 to 10:30 p.m. A tour of the historic Shrine Church of St. Stanislaus is scheduled for 7 p.m. A first class relic of St. Pope John Paul II will be on display as well as a new shrine in the baptistry area, hand carved and created by local woodworkers. Come and listen to the sounds of the newly restored 1910 Schuelke pipe organ in the church during Mass times.

On Saturday, October 5, dinners will be served from 4 to 9 p.m. There will be a Mass in the church at 5 p.m. with a church tour to follow. Grammy award-nominated Lenny Gomulka and the Chicago Push will perform from 6:30 to 11 p.m. A Polish folk dance ensemble will perform during the evening as well.

On Sunday dinners will be served from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., with a church tour following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. The Nu Tones will perform from 2 to 6 p.m.

A large part of the fundraising aspect of the festival is the grand drawing, which will take place on October 6, at 6 p.m. Raffle tickets for this drawing will be available at the festival. Grand prize for the drawing is \$1500, second prize \$1000, followed by a \$500 third prize and four prizes at the \$250 level, and ten prizes of \$100

Residential, commercial development planned for former St. Alexis Hospital site

University Settlement getting in on ground floor

The Broadway-Slavic Village neighborhood is getting a new four-story multifamily and commercial development located at 5163 Broadway Ave., the former site of St. Alexis and then St. Michael hospital.

The \$20 million investment, called Slavic Village Gateway, will feature 78 apartments and 10 townhomes in its first phase, according to Earl Pike, executive director of University Settlement. Phase 2 will include more townhomes along Broadway Avenue. The organization, which provides a variety of social services to individuals and

families in the Slavic Village area, owns the property which it purchased from the Cuyahoga County Land

University Settlement will occupy 25,000 square feet on the ground floor, an upgrade from its current 18,000square-foot space down the street at 4800 Broadway Ave., Pike said. The site will also include amenities such as a playground, computer room and exercise room. The onetwo- and three-bedroom apartments on the second, third and fourth floors will range from \$300 to \$900 a month, and the townhomes will go for about \$900 a month. The project is set to break ground in the spring of 2020 with completion in the spring of 2022.

The Settlement is in dire need of a new location, Pike said. The organization has existed for 93 years and spent the last 36 of them at its current address. However, the space is in need of serious repairs. The roof leaks throughout the building, and the kitchen, which serves 10,000 pounds of food a month, often floods following a rainstorm.

"I'm a big believer that architecture conveys value," Pike said. "Right now, if a client or member of our community enters the building, it tells them they've reached the end of the line. They've hit rock bottom. They deserve something better than that.'

About two years ago, University Settlement conducted a feasibility study to determine whether to build a new location or rehabilitate its current building, Pike said. The organization discovered it would be less expensive to build a new building from scratch, which is how the idea of the multifamily development came to life.

Nicholson pleaded not guilty to charges of aggravated murder, murder, attempted murder and felonious assault, according to Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas records. Jurors heard opening statements Monday.

Manuel Lopez Jr., 17, and Giselle Lopez, 19, were shot on East 86th Street Sept. 5, 2018, following a fight between their mother and Nicholson, according to police. They both later died at the hospital.

Nicholson was arrested following a four-hour standoff with police. He faces the death penalty if convicted of

Violation of state drug law

They observed copper wire commonly used to smoke crack cocaine and a folded-up lottery ticket commonly used to package illegal drugs. Police asked the woman to step out of the vehicle, and she quickly threw the contraband in her purse. She later admitted she had crack cocaine on her lap and heroin in the folded-up ticket.




