Polish Festival this weekend at St. Stan's!!

The Shrine Church of St. Stanislaus, 3649 East 65 Street, Cleveland, will hold its annual Polish Festival this Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 4, 5 and 6, in the Social Center, 6601 Baxter Ave., Slavic Village.

The festival features Polish food cooked in the Old World style such as pierogi, kielbasa, czarnina, cabbage and noodles, potato pancakes, stuffed cabbage and many other favorites. A bakery booth will feature many items baked by parishioners along with games of chance, sideboards and boutiques. Two bars will be stocked with Polish and domestic beers, wine, spirits and the famous special lemon drink "cytrynowka."

The Polish Festival will be open on Friday from 5 to 9 p.m. Polish dinners will be served downstairs in the Social Center. Jimmy K will perform upstairs from 6:30 to 10:30 p.m. A tour of the historic Shrine Church of St. Stanislaus is scheduled for 7 p.m. A first class relic of St. Pope John Paul II will be on display as well as a new shrine in the baptistry area, hand carved and created by local woodworkers. Come and listen to the sounds of the newly restored 1910 Schuelke pipe organ in the church during Mass times.

On Saturday, October 5, dinners will be served from 4 to 9 p.m. There will be a Mass in the church at 5 p.m. with a church tour to follow. Grammy award-nominated Lenny Gomulka and the Chicago Push will perform from 6:30 to 11 p.m. A Polish folk dance ensemble will perform during the evening as well.

On Sunday dinners will be served from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., with a church tour following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. The Nu Tones will perform from 2 to 6 p.m.

A large part of the fundraising aspect of the festival is the grand drawing, which will take place on October 6, at 6 p.m. Raffle tickets for this drawing will be available at the festival. Grand prize for the drawing is \$1500, second prize \$1000, followed by a \$500 third prize and four prizes at the \$250 level, and ten prizes of \$100 each.

Residential, commercial development planned for former St. Alexis Hospital site

University Settlement getting in on ground floor

The Broadway-Slavic Village neighborhood is getting a new four-story multifamily and commercial development located at 5163 Broadway Ave., the former site of St. Alexis and then St. Michael hospital.

The \$20 million investment, called Slavic Village Gateway, will feature 78 apartments and 10 townhomes in its first phase, according to Earl Pike, executive director of University Settlement. Phase 2 will include more townhomes along Broadway Avenue. The organization, which provides a variety of social services to individuals and families in the Slavic Village area, owns the property which it purchased from the Cuyahoga County Land Bank.

University Settlement will occupy 25,000 square feet on the ground floor, an upgrade from its current 18,000-square-foot space down the street at 4800 Broadway Ave., Pike said. The site will also include amenities such as a playground, computer room and exercise room. The one- and two- and three-bedroom apartments on the second, third and fourth floors will range from \$300 to \$900 a month, and the townhomes will go for about \$900 a month. The project is set to break ground in the spring of 2020 with completion in the spring of 2022.

The Settlement is in dire need of a new location, Pike said. The organization has existed for 93 years and spent the last 36 of them at its current address. However, the space is in need of serious repairs. The roof leaks throughout the building, and the kitchen, which serves 10,000 pounds of food a month, often floods following a rainstorm.

"I'm a big believer that architecture conveys value," Pike said. "Right now, if a client or member of our community enters the building, it tells them they've reached the end of the line. They've hit rock bottom. They deserve something better than that."

About two years ago, University Settlement conducted a feasibility study to determine whether to build a new location or rehabilitate its current building, Pike said. The organization discovered it would be less expensive to build a new building from scratch, which is how the idea of the multifamily development came to life.

Truck rolls over, hits several cars on Granger Road hill

A cement truck traveling down Granger Road hill lost control at about 8 a.m. Sept. 26, according to the Valley View Fire Department. The truck hit multiple vehicles before rolling over. Multiple people were injured in the accident and transported to local hospitals. Garfield

Heights, Cuyahoga Heights, Brooklyn Heights and Independence fire departments assisted. Valley View Police Chief David Niro said the village is waiting for the vehicle examination report from the Ohio Motor Carrier Inspector before it determines cause of the accident.

Cleveland man charged in Maple Hts. shooting death

A Cuyahoga County grand jury handed an indictment Sept. 24 to Robert Knox, 29, the man accused of shooting a 37-year-old Maple Heights woman. Knox, a Cleveland resident, is charged with murder, felonious assault, discharge of a firearm on or near prohibited premises, intimidation of a crime victim or witness and having

weapons while under disability. The victim, Sheree Kirby, was shot during a large disturbance in the parking lot of the Tonite II Lounge at 16000 Libby Road around 2:30 a.m., police said. She was found in the middle of Libby Road near Paine Avenue and later died at MetroHealth Medical Center. Knox's bond is set at \$1 million.

Trial begins for man accused of killing G.H. brother, sister on E. 86th

The trial for Matthew Nicholson, 30, the man accused of shooting and killing his girlfriend's teenage son and daughter at their Garfield Heights home last year, is underway. Nicholson pleaded not guilty to charges of aggravated murder, murder, attempted murder and felonious assault, according to Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas records. Jurors heard opening statements Monday.

Manuel Lopez Jr., 17, and Giselle Lopez, 19, were shot on East 86th Street Sept. 5, 2018, following a fight between their mother and Nicholson, according to police. They both later died at the hospital.

Nicholson was arrested following a four-hour standoff with police. He faces the death penalty if convicted of the murders.

Community police reports

CLEVELAND

Violation of state drug law

On Sept. 25 at about 2:10 p.m., police in the area of East 65th Street and Morton Avenue observed a vehicle park on Morton. Nobody exited the vehicle for an extended period of time. Then a man approached and engaged in a suspected drug transaction. The vehicle left Morton and pulled into a parking lot at Broadway and Engel avenues, parking in a secluded spot away from all other cars and stores. There was a man in the driver's seat and a woman in the back seat bent over as if she was prepping or using drugs. Officers activated their lights and approached the vehicle. They observed copper wire commonly used to smoke crack cocaine and a folded-up lottery ticket commonly used to package illegal drugs. Police asked the woman to step out of the vehicle, and she quickly threw the contraband in her purse. She later admitted she had crack cocaine on her lap and heroin in the folded-up ticket.

Officers found another folded-up lottery ticket in the center console that contained suspected heroin. In the woman's purse, police found two paperfolds containing suspected heroin; a pill bottle with unknown pills; baggies and straws with suspected drug residue; hypodermic needles; three crack pipes; and three spoons with suspected drug residue. Police seized the contraband and advised the duo that a named suspect report would be generated and an indictment prepared when the lab results for the suspected drugs came back.

On Sept. 25 at about 12:23 p.m., police responded to Granger Road at East 119th Street for a motor vehicle accident with serious injuries. It was a head-on crash with both vehicles sustaining front-end damage. A witness stated she was driving behind one of the vehicles when she observed the other vehicle weaving and driving left of center then pull into the turning lane at East 119th Street and turn left of center into the front of the other vehicle prior to the intersection. Other witnesses corroborated the story. The driver said he did not know what happened and had not taken any drugs, although police were aware that he takes multiple medications from prior dealings with him. Both drivers were transported to MetroHealth Medical Center. The man refused to provide a urine sample. He was charged with OVI, refusal with prior conviction, weaving, left of center, seat belt and aggravated vehicular assault.

University Settlement spoke with NRP Group, a Cleveland-based apartment developer, general contractor and property manager. In addition to a new home for University Settlement, the duo envisioned a project that would transform North Broadway, Pike said.

"We're going to have 400 people living, working and playing in this new community," Pike said. "I believe it will be a catalyst to new investment in a powerful way."

The project has already received \$11.2 million in state low-income tax credits. The rest of the funding will come from fundraising, Pike said. Cleveland architect John Williams will design the project.

Pike is quick to point out that the development is not public or Section 8 housing. It is intentionally designed for mixed use to house both University Settlement's clients, who may receive a subsidy to help pay their costs, and, for example, professionals looking to commute into downtown Cleveland.

"We're trying to avoid gentrification," Pike said. "We want everyone living together in a true community."

Besides University Settlement, Pike hopes to see offices for other nonprofits in the ground-floor commercial space. Which businesses will set up shop will depend on community needs and desires.

"The future is this kind of development," Pike said. "It is clean, affordable housing serving the community. We're hoping this causes people to give Slavic Village a second look as a destination and a place to visit."

NRP Group will operate the housing side of the development, while University Settlement will manage its space, as well as the commercial space.

"We're not just a social services agency," Pike said. "We

want to rebuild the community."

University Settlement has received overwhelmingly positive feedback regarding the project, Pike said.

"This project speaks to folks in this community who feel forgotten," he said. "We're telling them you haven't been forgotten. They're going to have a decent space that reflects their aspirations rather than their fears."

The city of Cleveland, Cuyahoga County and state of Ohio have also been supportive of the project, Pike said.

"I am pleased to have the Slavic Village Gateway built in my ward," Ward 5 Councilwoman Phyllis Cleveland said. "This development will create high-quality, affordable housing which is badly needed in North Broadway. I'm also pleased that our great community partner University Settlement had the vision to bring this project together."

Ward 12 Councilman Tony Brancatelli also said he has high hopes for the project.

"We are excited that the Slavic Village Gateway development was awarded a state grant to help fund this project in the Broadway/Slavic Village neighborhood," Brancatelli said. "This is a significant investment in the northern part of our community and will provide high-quality new housing for our residents."

Second man charged in attempted robbery at Little Caesars on Harvard

An 18-year-old Cleveland man is the second person to be charged in an attempted robbery at the Little Caesars on Harvard Avenue in Slavic Village.

On Sept. 25, Tshombe B. Chambliss was arrested and charged with aggravated robbery in the April 19 incident, according to court records. He is being held in Cuyahoga County Jail. No court appearance is yet scheduled.

Police reviewed video footage of the incident, which took place at about 9:50 p.m., according to the police report. It shows three men come into the store wearing face masks and pointing handguns at employees.

One of the men grabbed a male employee and pulled him to the registers. The suspect used his hand and fingers to form the shape of a gun and pointed it into the employee's back.

The employee pulled a gun from his waistband and began to shoot at the suspects, according to the report. The suspects ran to the back of the store, using the female employees as human shields, and returned gunfire.

The male employee was shot in the left arm and was later treated at MetroHealth Medical Center. The suspects fled through the rear.
