Activist, engineer John Shields, Jr. passes away

John A. Shields, Jr., PhD, 73, of the Mill Creek community of Cleveland, died Saturday, Dec. 14, surrounded by his loving family.

John, devoted husband and father, is the son of John Shields, Sr. and Marguerite Shields. He is survived by his wife, Pat; children Julie Lacey (Thom), John Shields III (Anne) and Becky Coleman (Sean); and grandchildren Dillon, Thomas, Stefanie, Bella, John Michael, Steven and Matthew.

John graduated from Struthers High School and received his Bachelor's, Master's and PhD degrees from Case Western Reserve University.

He was active in multiple professional societies: ASM Înternational, MPIF/APMI, ASTM International, TMS, and AWS. He authored or coauthored over 40 publications and had one patent.

John was the recipient of numerous awards including the ASM International Fellow, Cleveland Engineer of the Year, ASM International Cleveland Award of Distinc-



tion, Robert B. Cummings Award of Distinction, TMS Distinguished Service Award and the Distinguished Service to Powder Metallurgy Award.

He was also active in the Cleveland Diocesan Racism Committee, a longtime member and past president of the Southeast Cleveland Kiwanis Club and Slavic Village Development. He was recognized as Activist of the Year twice by Slavic Village Development, received the first Cleveland MLK Community Award for his involvement in Broadway Diversity in Progress, and by

Maple Heights wrestlers notch incredible 800 victories since program began in 1948-'49 season

The Maple Heights High School wrestling team captured the team championship at the 3rd annual Brush Arc Dual Meet Tournament on Saturday, December 7. The Mustangs finished 4-0 in their competitive pool and then topped Shaker Heights 62-18 in the championship match to claim the title. Maple also beat Copley 45-30, Akron North 77-6, Cleveland Heights 76-6 and Shaw 81-0.

The big story, however, was the fact that the Maple Heights High School wrestling program reached an unprecedented milestone of 800 victories since the program's inception during the 1948-49 season. Although no official records are kept by the Ohio High School Athletic Association regarding dual meet victories, the feat is believed to be an all-time record in the State of Ohio.

Those who complete 100% of all minimum standards will receive the full \$500. Thosewho complete 75% of all minimum standards in each category will receive 75% of the allowance and those who reach a 50% $completion will receive \, 50\%$ of the allowance. directly related to the employee's job description. The employees must also earn a minimum grade of "C."

The amount of tuition to be reimbursed shall be limited to \$2500 per year. Participation in the program is limited to once during an employee's tenure.

Also included in legislation passed at last Wednesday's meeting was the following:

- Authorizing a Memorandum of Understanding with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District and the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District for the 2020 Public Involvement and Public Education (PIPE) Program;
- Accepting a funding award from the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency and authorizing matching funds from the village;
- Entering into a contract with Pest Management Inc. for
- Approving the Collective Bargaining Agreement with the Fraternal Order of Police;
- Approving the Collective Bargaining Agreement with Cuyahoga Heights Firefighters;
 - Approving the 2020 village budget;
- Setting compensation schedule ranges for non-bargaining employees and elected officials. (All employees, union and non-union, will receive a 3% raise for 2020, 2% raise in 2021 and 1% in 2022);

• Transferring \$54,000 of the monthly income tax funds collected by the village into the Debt Service Fund;

- Authorizing change orders for the Nicky Boulevard and Storm Sewer Extension and Slope Stabilization Improvements Project – Phase 1;
- Authorizing changes in scope for the Canal Road Pavement Improvements Project and the Nicky Boulevard Storm Sewer Extension and Slope Stabilization Improvements Project – Phase 1;
- Prohibiting the use of engine brakes (jake brake) in the village.

In the "Other Business" portion of the meeting, a claim from a resident wanting \$300 for two new tires flattened on Grant Avenue from an unmarked pothole on Oct. 24, 2019 was denied. Council accepted the recommendation of Service Director Sammons to hire Top Notch Tree Service for the village's tree trimming needs for 2020.








Put apples over pork chops and sprinkle with granulated sugar. Cover and bake for 45 minutes to 1 hour in a 400° oven.





Brown, the Maple Heights resident who was murdered on Dec. 2 as he protected some women from an armed assailant at the Wash-N-Dry Laundromat, died as a hero. I hope the community that he called home sees fit to honor him as the American hero that he was.

Dear Editor:

The last couple issues of "The Neighborhood News" covered the shooting and killing of the Wash N' Dry laundromat worker, David Brown, in Maple Heights. I wanted you and the readers to know more about this man.

Mr. Brown was a true hero. He was a retired Marine and he protected his country. But he protected the people of his laundromat as well. He was on watch and he watched over me on many occasions. Being a female, washing clothes alone in a relatively empty laundromat in a relatively higher crime area is not always safe, but I have only so many hours in a day to do it, so there have been many times I have found myself there at midnight, one, or two in the morning. Mr. Brown was there. He was polite, courteous, friendly and just really, really cool.

There were a few occasions where he would tell me I was not to leave the building until he could help me load my car. He would notice someone in the building or on the the laundromat where he property and he wanted to escort me to my car to make worked. sure I was safe. He looked out for all of us. He was amazing with children that happened to be there. He was pleasant; he was everyone's friend.

And to find out that he gave his life protecting a couple of women, well, that's just who he was. He was a real hero. He didn't wear a cape and tights. He wasn't flashy or proud. He wore a brown, nondescript jacket and Marines hat. He was low-key and quiet. But the writers for Marvel or DC could never do this man justice if they tried to put him in a comic book. The people of Maple Heights owe this man honor and respect for the protection he gave us, for this incredible life he sacrificed for us (not just the two women he protected in that moment).

Thank you for letting me share with you just the tiniest piece of this man that I knew.I miss him terribly and wish him a speedy journey into the arms of the angels in Heaven.
