Newburgh Hts. Police seek help identifying armed robbery suspects

On Tuesday, March 24, at 2:34 p.m., the Newburgh Heights Police Department responded to an armed robbery at the Family Dollar store located at 5409 Harvard Ave.

Two black males entered the store, lingered for a short time awaiting other customers to finish their transactions and then $both \, males \, pulled \, out \, pistols, \, aiming \, them \,$ at the two clerks and demanding cash, according to a press release from NHPD. After the robbery both males fled on foot.

Last Friday, March 27, at 4:08 p.m., Cleveland and Newburgh Heights officers responded to Fleet Ave. for a possible sighting of the two suspects. Officers were able to positively identify the suspects as being from the robbery, but the suspects fled on foot and were able to get away.

If you have not received these messages, please call the Civic Center to be added to the list, or you can go to the city's website to register as well. If you need assistance, please call 524-7373 and your call will be returned. Of course, if it is an emergency call 911.

Recreation Department

Playgrounds have been closed and caution-taped off. To help residents stay active at home and maintain exercise options, the Recreation Department staff has been livestreaming video workout sessions on the Recreation Facebook page as well as taping sessions to upload at a later date. An 'Indy Fit' YouTube channel has been established to house these videos, and will be up and running by the weekend. Videos will be uploaded to the YouTube page, as well as posted to the City website and social media accounts.

Service Department

The Service Department continues to follow sanitary protocols recommended by the CDC. To adhere to social distancing requirements, the department split the regular work schedules up to limit the number of employees working together on one shift. We continue to restrict visitors from entering our facility to make in person requests or payments. Additionally, the department will began yard waste collection on Monday, March 30.

G.H. schools Grab & Go meals program returns

The Garfield Heights City School District has announced that the District's Grab & Go breakfast and lunch program returned March 30. Please note the following changes due to Ohio Gov. Mike DeWine's Stay at Home directive and the Ohio Department of Education's food

- The time for pick up of food will be from 10 a.m. until 12 noon Monday through Friday.
- Pick up will be at the Garfield Heights Middle School.
- Pick up will be curbside service so you will not need to leave your automobile under any circumstances.
- Pick up of food will be at the front main doors of the school. Just pull in front and someone from the school will be there to help you.

In order to comply with federal requirements, the student names of those receiving a meal and the school they attend will be asked (does not have to be a Garfield Heights school).

E.55th Street Re-Surfacing Project to begin April 6th

The Ohio Department of Transportation will be resurfacing E. 55th St. between Broadway Ave. and Harvard Ave. over the coming months. The resurfacing will take place in three phases, from Broadway Ave. to Blanche Ave. (30 days). Phase II will be from Linton Ave. to Fleet Ave. (approximately mid-May through mid-June), and the final phase will be from Fleet Ave. to Harvard Ave.

On Monday, April 6, 2020, weather permitting, Perk Company, Inc. will begin maintaining traffic on E. 55th St. from Broadway Ave. to Blanche Ave. Southbound traffic will be maintained on the east side on E. 55th while work is performed in the existing southbound lanes. North bound traffic will be detoured east onto Blanche Ave., west onto Broadway Ave. Advanced warning signs will be placed prior to any work activity. Additional notices will be sent ahead of any changed conditions.

"I am excited to see this million dollar infrastructure improvement starting. E. 55th is an important thoroughfare in our community and is the first of many road projects to begin in Ward 12," Councilman Tony Brancatelli said.

Brancatelli also reported that pot hole patching has started in his ward. He said he was pleased to see that crews were out last week doing a systematic approach to street repairs in Ward 12. Residents and businesses can call the city of Cleveland's pothole hotline at 216-664-2510 to report problem areas.

Garfield Council meets via telephone conference call

Garfield Heights Council met via telephone conference call last Thursday, March 26, with officials and members of the public attending by telephone dur- New NN ing the coronavirus Stay at Home directive from Ohio Gov. Mike DeWine.

An emergency ordinance was passed to buy a 2006 Sutphen Shield fire engine to replace the city's 2002 Ferrara Quint ladder truck, which has a rotted frame and cracked torque box. The "where exposure to salt is Grangerrds. nonexistent," according to the legislation, and will cost

Also passed was another emergency ordinance to enter into an agreement with WOW! Internet, Cable and Phone, for the lease of a dark fiber network for 60 months at a monthly cost not to exceed \$1500.

In his report to council, Mayor Vic Collova said City Hall was closed beginning March 18th in light of the COVID-19 pandemic with essential services still being offered. He said the closure will continue through at least April 5th, "when we'll have to make some decisions."

Collova stressed the hit the city will take because of the crisis, with a possible 25-30% loss in city income tax and a drop in property tax

He said the city will have to decide on furloughs or mandatory layoffs for city employees, but will maintain as many workers as possible.

Laws of the Land in G.H.

Do you live in Garfield Heights and have a question about its ordinances - what may or may not be legal in any given circumstance? This column will answer your questions with the help of members of Garfield Heights City

Question – Where can I put a portable basketball hoop?

Answer - Portable basketball hoops or similar equipment may only be placed on private driveways or in the backyard. They may not be placed on public streets or tree lawns. Violation of this law is a misdemeanor of the first degree and the equipment will be confiscated by the police department. Codified Ordinance Section 311.07.
