

In this unprecedented time of the coronavirus, we have all been inundated with news from around the world on the devastating impact of this pandemic.

Our president, our governor and many renowned members of medical staffs throughout the country have issued $mandates\, and\, precaution ary\, measures$ for all of us to follow. Here in Garfield



We have closed our Civic Center and Recreation Center to all visitors and nonessential staff. Senior Center transportation staff is delivering meals to lunch program participants and home-bound seniors. Staff also reaches out with phone calls to our seniors to check on their welfare. We also continue to have our monthly food pantry distribution dates on the third Wednesday from 1 to 2 p.m., and the third Thursday from 6 to 7 p.m. for Garfield Heights residents only at the Civic Center. Bags are prepackaged for pick up.

We have cancelled all public meetings; however, city council meetings will continue via teleconferencing and are open to the public.

Needless to say, due to the Stay at Home order, the city is operating with a skeleton crew. Unfortunately, this has an impact on city services. The service department remains open for calls if residents have an emergency. Also, our police and fire departments are at full staff and ready to assist residents in need. They are our first responders and we certainly need them now more than ever.

Partnership may breathe new life into CityView shopping center

This is the same company that last November acquired the old Kmart property on Rockside Rd., also in Ĝarfield Heights.

Simon is also an attorney and local restauranteur with L.A. Pete's in Independence and Simon's Restaurant & Deli in Brecksville.

The partners hope to create a business park at CityView and keep the Giant Eagle supermarket, the only big box business left at CityView, Jarboe reported.

When asked to comment on the cleveland.com online article, Garfield Heights Mayor Vic Collova told The Neighborhood News that plans for a business park were indeed in place at CityView and the deal is very close to being finalized.

'These are going to be very exciting times in Garfield Heights in the very near future,"

Changes in waste collection begin Monday for Kimble customers

Effective, Monday April 13, Kimble Recycling & Disposal, Inc., will institute the following changes to its collection schedule, which includes the cities of Garfield Heights and Bedford, for the safety and health of its employees.

Solid Waste: Please fit all materials into the Kimble provided waste cart leaving no materials on the ground to be loaded by hand. Collection will occur as usual. For customers whose service does not include a waste cart, please limit your trash to a maximum of three 30-gallon sealed bags.

Recycling: Please fit all items for recycling in the Kimble provided recycle cart, leaving no materials on the ground to be collected by hand. Include only clean paper, cardboard, metal cans and #1 and #2 plastic containers and jugs. (See website at www.kimblecompanies.com for acceptable recyclable items.) Collection will occur as usual.

Bulk items: Please temporarily hold bulk items that require hand loading, such as sofas, mattresses, appliances, toilets and other bulky items. Items that can be broken down or disassembled and placed in the Kimble waste cart will be collected.

Yard Waste: As a nonessential waste stream, you are asked to suspend placing yard waste at the curb in excess of what fits in the Kimble waste cart or as part of your three stay at home instructions as 30-gallon solid waste sealed bags for customers without waste carts. Please consider options such as composting, taking the materials to a community collection point or holding until a later time.

"In continuing to follow the governor's guidelines and mandates while trying to meet the food needs of our students and families, we have modified our district's Grab and Go breakfast and lunch program once again, stated Allen D. Sluka, Treasurer/CFO/Business Services for the Garfield Heights School District.

Xellia gets FDA approval to make drugs at Bedford plant

Xellia Pharmaceuticals, a Denmark-based pharmaceutical company specializing in providing anti-infective treatments against serious infections, has received approval from the Food and Drug Administration to begin manufacturing drug products at its plant in Bedford,

This expansion of manufacturing within the United pharmaceutical manufacturing and supplies caused by

the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic, Xellia officials stated.

Xellia acquired the former Ben Venue Laboratories facility on Northfield Rd. two years after Ben Venue left that location in late 2013, resulting in about 1100 employees losing their jobs. Xellia currently employs about 220 workers at the Bedford site.

"Since acquiring the site in 2015, Xellia has made significantinvestment to create a modern, world-class facility that will allow the company to continue to provide a reliable and consistent supply of its vital anti-infective products across the U.S.," the company stated in a press release.

Until the FDA's approval last month, the focus at Xellia's Bedford plant was on packaging, labeling and distributing drug products manufactured at other Xellia facilities, following the initial FDA approval for the facility in 2016.

Xellia will now start commercial manufacturing at the Bedford site, alongside its existing sterile injectable production plant in Copenhagen, and will use the Bedford facilities to maximize production of aseptic injectables, including the powerful antibiotic Vancomycin. The Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District wants all residents to know that their normal waste collection service may have changed due to the pandemic.

Be advised, at this time: Bulky waste collection has been suspended in most communities. All waste must be contained in a cart.

Donation centers (Goodwill, Salvation Army, Simple Recycling, etc.) are closed. Do not leave donations outside these facilities.

Scrap metal recycling facilities are also closed to the public.

Residents must hold onto these items until collection services return to normal. Check your city website for posted changes to trash pick up.

Bedford operating 'near as normal' in light of crisis

"Please know that the city is operating as near as normal, with limited face-to-face contact with each other and the public," Bedford Mayor Stan Koci stated at a unique presentation given by himself and City Manager Mike Mallis, and held in lieu of a council meeting Monday night.

In accordance with "social distancing" guidelines in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, the regular city council meeting was cancelled, and Koci and Mallis gave the presentation, which was livestreamed on the Internet and is now available on the city of Bedford YouTube channel.

"Obviously, due to the coronavirus and the fact that we have no council business where we have to vote on anything tonight... we have suspended tonight's meeting," Koci stated, adding that he and Mallis were present to give information to residents.

Koci also added that on Monday, April 20, there will be a "virtual" council meeting held via the Zoom app, "where we will all be in our homes and safe confines... all in accordance with the Ohio Attorney General's ruling on how to handle those types of meetings, so it will be open. We will have the ability to do feedback for citizen comments as we normally do at the end of each meeting.

Koci stated that the Metroparks were open for walking or riding bicycles, however, gathering spots such as play-grounds and Viaduct Park were closed.

The city's chipper service has begun this week, Koci said, but advised that residents must call the Service Department to get on the chipper list by Friday, the week before chipper service begins for the month.

Residents in need of assistance can call the United Way at 211 for a wide variety of helpful services, Koci said. "And please, if you can, volunteer to help at one of our local food banks or Meals on Wheels. They are in desperate need of some able bodies to deliver food to people in need." For more information, residents can call City Hall at 440-232-1600.

Koci said that Councilwoman Sandy Spinks came up with the idea of having residents throughout the city go out into their driveways at 8 p.m. on Saturday, April 11, weather permitting, with flashlights or lanterns. "Let's

light up the night and show our neighbors that we are okay," he said.

Mallis confirmed that police, fire, public service and other critical services were a priority, adding that the fire department recently took delivery of a new rescue squad, the police department was increasing patrols and checking on workers in essential businesses, and the motorcycle units and bike patrols would start up again with the warmer weather. "Safety is a primary focus," he stated.

Mallis commended city staffers for working with state and federal officials and with the Art of Beauty cosmetics manufacturing company on Egbert Road. The company recently began production of hand sanitizer, a crucial component in minimizing the coronavirus threat. "Kudos to our staff and kudos to the Art of Beauty for thinking


